Sanger Area Historical Society ROOTS FROM OUR PAST

MARIJOHN MELSON WILKIN

PART 2

Marijohn Melson Wilkin was a woman of great talent and intrigue. Her life had been a whirlwind beginning with her childhood in Sanger, Texas. She was a the cute, and bright-eyed little daughter of Ernest and Karla Melson, owners of the Veribest Bakery of Sanger. Mr. Melson began his work at midnight, working through the night to get his bread loaves, buns, and rolls ready for the following day. Mrs. Melson would help her husband during the day in sales, and after the bread was delivered, a gospel hoe-down would begin in the bakery with many locals bringing their guitars, banjos, harmonicas, fiddles to the bakery to play. It was said that in the quiet town of Sanger you could hear their music for many blocks and families would sit on their front porches to enjoy the music.

So Marijohn began a lifelong career of music in the back of a bakery in Sanger, Texas. She is attributed to many songs either writing the song, writing the lyrics, or publishing the music.

In 1955 she toured with Red Foley and moved to Nashville in 1958. She co-wrote "Waterloo" with John Loudermilk for Stonewall Jackson.

Wilkin wrote "The Long Black Veil" for Lefty Frizzell, "Cut Across Shorty" for Eddie Cochran, and a hit which became a pop hit for Ann-Margaret and The Beatles entitled "I Just Don't Understand."

Although she was a country songwriter, her songs were recorded by many pop and rock stars such as Rod Stewart and Mick Jagger. She worked as a background vocalist for Columbia Records and Dot Records in the 1960s. On Dot Records she recorded under the name of Romi Spain.

Her most famous song "One Day At a Time", was often thought to be the biggest gospel song of the 70s. She co-wrote with some assistance by her former protégé Kris Kristofferson. The song won Dove Award Song of the Year and was on the Top 20 Hit List.

Wilkin published Kris Kristofferson's "For the Good Times" and in 1970 was a massive hit for Ray Price. Marijohn is credited with giving Kristofferson his first work as a legitimate songwriter. She had relationships with many famous singers and writers in the country genre. Mel Tillis remembers they met as he had to present a lead sheet to Andy Williams for a recording session and Marijohn was living in a local Nashville hotel. Mel went to her room and she was putting on make-up and had her hair in rollers. She told Mel he would have to hold the dryer up to her head while she finished if they were going to make it on time.

Wilkin and Loudermilk were collaborating writing a

new song, and after trying to come up with lyrics for an hour, she said "well, John, I guess we've met our Waterloo." And that is where the song "Waterloo" came from. They took it and ran with it. Stonewall Jackson was a new recording artist signed with Columbia Records and they gave the song to him. It was an instant hit; it was number 1 on the top charts for 5 weeks and sold thirty-five (35) thousand copies a day and eventually became a million-seller. It was one of the top moneymaker songs of 1959.

"The Long Black Veil" written by Danny Dill and Marijohn Wilkin became a hit for Lefty Frizzell. Danny Dill was having difficulties finishing the lyrics so Marijohn sat at the piano and finished the song which lead to the lyric writing of Dill's talents. "Ramblin Rose" was co-written with Fred Burch and recorded by Jerry Lee Lewis, Slim Whitman, Eddy Arnold, and Ray Price. The list of her songs is extensive with her later years devoted to religious/gospel songs.

As time went by Marijohn became known for her voice. She recorded a few songs which can be found on YouTube, but was often used as back-up singer on many famous songs. She was on Charley Pride's "Snakes Crawl at Night", Hank Locklin's "Please Help Me I'm Falling", In December 1961, a cold, wet night at Owen Bradley's studio, Wilkin-Burch's song "PT109" was recorded by Jimmy Dean in honor of a President (Kennedy) who endured a torpedo hit during his service. The song was on the hit charts for 28 weeks.

Wilkin's son, John "Bucky" Wilkin became a front man for Ronny and the Daytona's whose 1964 hit "G.T.O." reached No 4 on the Billboard Pop chart.

Marijohn was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1975. She formed 17th Avenue Music publishing company and became quite profitable when LeAnn Rimes began recording through her company.

She struggled in some of her later years with depression but always remembered her Daddy's words about the needy, and she would manage to give a dollar or two to someone

Zachary Thomas Johnson

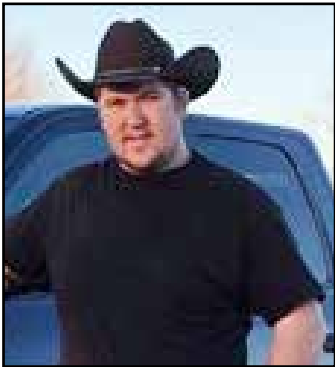
March 27, 1995 - Monday, December 2, 2019

Use Year-end Bonus (or Gift) Wisely

As 2019 draws to a close, you may be anticipating – or have already received – a year-end bonus from your employer. Or you might be receiving a substantial cash gift for the holidays. (If you’re really lucky, you might get both.) You can doubtlessly think of many ways to spend this money right now, but how can you use it to help yourself in the long run?

Here are a few suggestions:

Pay off some debts. Virtually all of us carry some type of debt, and that’s not necessarily a bad thing. For example, your mortgage not only gives you a place to live and a chance to build equity in your home, but the interest payments are typically tax deductible. Other debts, though, such as those on consumer items, are not so positive – you generally can’t deduct the interest payments, and the items themselves probably won’t enhance your personal wealth. Plus, the bigger your monthly debt payments, the less you’ll have to invest for your future. So, you might want to use your bonus or monetary gift to pay off, or at least pay down, some of your less productive debts.

Start an emergency fund. If you were to face a large, unexpected expense, such as the need for a new furnace or a major car repair, how would you pay for it? If you didn’t have the cash on hand, you might be forced to dip in to your long-term investments, such as your stocks and mutual funds. A much better option is to build an emergency fund, containing six to

12 months’ worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. It will take time to build such a fund, of course, but your year-end bonus or gift money could give you a good start.

Contribute to your IRA. You can put in up to \$6,000 to your IRA, or \$7,000 if you’re 50 or older. And although you’ve got until April 15, 2020, to fully fund your IRA for the 2019 tax year, you still might want to put your “extra” money into your account right away. If you wait, you’ll probably find other uses for this money. And if you’re going to enjoy a comfortable retirement, you’ll need to maximize every possible resource – and your IRA is one of your best ones. Furthermore, the sooner you get the money into your IRA, the more potential it will have to grow over time.

Feed your college fund. If you’re already contributing to a college fund for your young children or grandchildren, you can use your year-end bonus or monetary gift to add to the fund. If you haven’t already started such an account, you might want to use this money for that purpose. You could open a 529 plan, which provides possible tax benefits and gives you control of the funds until it’s time for them to be used for college or some type of vocational school. (Depending on where you live, you might also get tax benefits from your state if you use a 529 savings plan to pay for K-12 expenses.)

To achieve all your financial goals, you’ll need to take advantage of your opportunities – and your year-end bonus or monetary gift can certainly be one of them.

that was down on their luck, or needed a friend. During these times she fought her own depression but her growing up years in Sanger impressed upon her to help others and to quit worrying about her own problems.

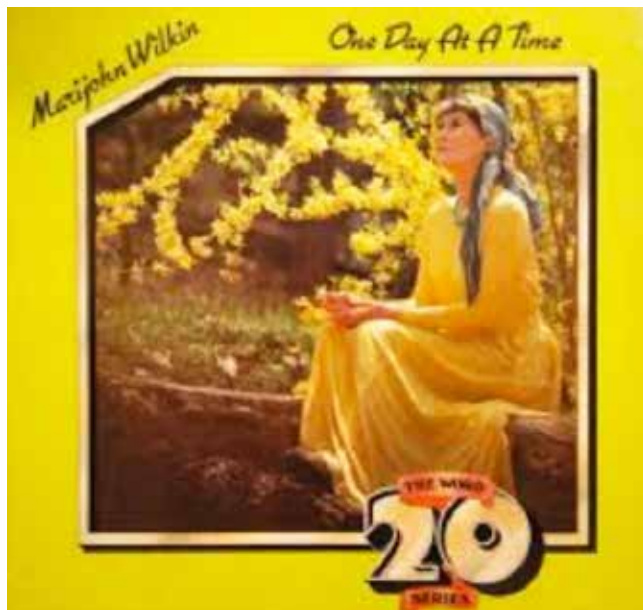
In looking at her future, she wanted to expand her knowledge of more things in life besides the music industry. In 1968 she traveled by ocean liner with the intention of attending the University of Heidelberg to continue her education. As she found herself in the Mediterranean Sea, she began to think of exactly where her first husband, Bedford Russell, lost his life. She took a ship, the Michelangelo, and met a man from New York who was a shoe designer. He had been told her story during the trip and one night at dinner, the ship's captain advised of rough waters. As they watched their dinnerware move and the dragging of the ship, they left to go into the Grand Salon. After a few moments, Marijohn knew—this was the place that her husband had lost his life being shot by British airplanes in the submarine full of POW soldiers from Britain and Canada being transferred. Bedford Russell was the only one to lose his life that night.

During her trip to Europe to get away from the Nashville life, she continued meeting people in the industry that she knew and they all drew her into their trips. Dennis Weaver and his wife invited her to go to Grenada, Spain for a week; just the time she needed in her life. She proceeded to the Holy Land to visit the sites she had read of in the Bible. She went to many synagogues, Catholic cathedrals, and places of worship trying to delve into her religious background. She met many people that helped her on her journey. After time though she was ready to go back to Nashville, have a cheeseburger and a glass of milk, and go to work.

After her return to Nashville, she began her deeply religious journey. She became friends with Jessi Colter, and they had similar stories; growing up in a religious family but straying from it over the years. They became good friends and were able to reach out to each other in their journey. That year, Marijohn lost her mother, Karla Owens Melson and her Buckhorn Publishing Company partner, Hubert Long. She stated "death always makes you more aware of life." She realized she was no longer angry about death such as when her father died, and when her beloved husband, Bedford was killed. She felt teary-eyed about Hubert's death and for his family.

Not long after the death of her mother, her Uncle Buford Owens, living in East Texas, became ill, had his leg amputated, and Marijohn went to stay with him. She had recently taken a bank loan to buy her partner's portion after his death, and although she thought she would only be away from her publishing company a few days, it was weeks before she returned to find she had many problems facing her in keeping the business operating. She had to sell her beloved farm outside Nashville, and turned to her religion. She began attending a church and the pastor saw the distress over her problems. He told her to let God handle them. Marijohn went home that day and composed "One Day At a Time".

I'm only human, I'm just a woman,
Help me believe in what I could be and all that I am.
Show me the stairway I have to climb;
Lord, for my sake, teach me to take one day at a time.



Do You remember when You walked among men?
Well, Jesus. You know, if You're looking below.
That it's worse now than then.
Pushing and shoving, crowding my mind;
So, for my sake, Lord, teach me to take one day at a time.

One day at a time, sweet Jesus,
That's all I'm asking from you.
Just give me the strength to do every day
What I have to do.
Yesterday's gone, sweet Jesus.
And tomorrow may never be mine.
Lord, help me today, show me the way,
One Day at a time.

Written by Marijohn and final touches were made with the help of Kris Kristofferson in 1973. Marilyn Sellers recorded this new song, and it became an instant hit on the country and gospel charts. The song was awarded the 1975 Gospel Music Association Dove Award. It has been recorded over 200 times by various artists and soon the popularity reached other countries.

Marijohn's full and fruitful life was also filled with despair, drinking issues, health problems, and finally finding her way in life to settle in with her religious background her father had worked so hard to develop as a young child. She carried on to become a speaker at colleges and universities, mentored many young, upstarting new talent, and continuing on to become a gospel singer. She recorded several albums of her religious songs, and she can be heard on YouTube recordings.

Marijohn came back to Sanger in 1967. A reception was held for people to meet her. Her name had been prominent in Sanger's history; beginning with her father's Veribest Bakery, and then on to Marijohn's prolific career in music.

Sanger's Marijohn Melson Wilkin passed away of heart disease October 28, 2006 at age 86 in Nashville, Tennessee. Her legacy was always referred to as "Den Mother of Nashville" for all the writers, publishers, singers, performers, and all of the music industry in Nashville. She was active in the industry from 1958 until her death, and recorded on the Jordan Records label in her later years.

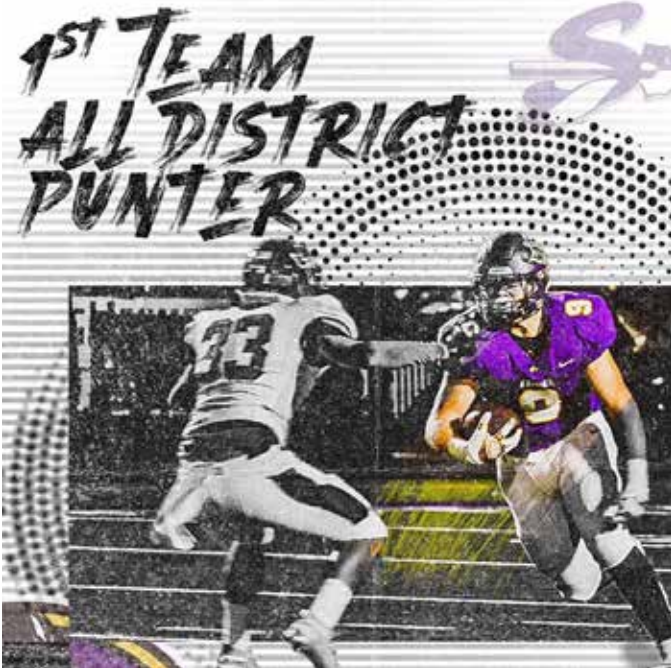


