Top Ten Fourth of July Pet Safety Tips

Like many Americans, you may be planning to have a festive Fourth of July. Along with barbeques and day at the beach, no July holiday celebration would be complete without enjoying the fireworks that celebrate the birth of our nation.

Perhaps you are considering staying at home and planning a get-together with friends and family. Or, you may want to go check out your local professional fireworks display. While putting the finishing touches on your planned celebration, take a moment to consider your pets.

Unlike people, pets don't associate the noise, flashes, and burning smell of pyrotechnics with celebrations. Pets are terrified of fireworks, and often panic at the loud whizzes and bangs they produce.

Because of this, the American Humane Association reports that July 5 is the busiest day of the year for animal shelters. The day after Fourth of July pets are "inundated with pets that panicked at the noise of firecrackers and fled into the night, winding up lost, injured or killed."

Both the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) and PAW have listed ways you can prevent your holiday celebration from turning into a tragedy. Here are 10 tips on how to keep your pet from panicking this Fourth of July weekend.

10. Keep your Pet Indoors at All Times!

It may seem obvious, but even if your pet is used to being outside, the resulting panic caused by fireworks or other loud noises may make them break their restraint or jump a fence in a terrified attempt to find safety.

9. Don't Put Insect Repellent on Your pet that isn't Specifically for Pet Use

The same tip applies to applying "people" sunscreen on your pet. What isn't toxic to humans can be toxic to animals. The ASPCA lists the poisonous effects of sunscreen on your pet as, "...drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, excessive thirst and lethargy." DEET, a common insecticide, may cause neurological issues.

8. Alcoholic Drinks Poison Pets

If your pet drinks alcohol, they can become dangerously intoxicated, go into a coma, or in severe cases, die from respiratory failure. Yes, even beer is toxic; fermented hops and ethanol are poisonous to dogs and cats.

7. Going to a Fireworks Display? Leave Your Pet at Home

The safest place for your pet is at home, not in a crowded, unfamiliar and noisy place. The combination of

too many people and loud fireworks will make your beloved pet freak out and desperately seek shelter. Locking them in the car is also not an option; your pet may suffer brain damage and heat stroke.

6. Have Your Pet Properly Identified

If your pet manages to break loose and become lost, without proper identification it will be that much harder to get them back. Consider fitting your pet with microchip identification, ID tags with their name and your phone number, or both. It is also a good idea to have a recent picture of your pets in case you have to put up signs.

5. Keep Your Pet Away from Glow Jewelry

It might look cute, but your pet could chew up and swallow the plastic adornments. The ASPCA states that while not highly toxic, "excessive drooling and gastrointestinal irritation could still result from ingestions, and intestinal blockage could occur from swallowing large pieces of the plastic containers."

4. NEVER Use Fireworks Around Pets

While lit fireworks can pose a danger to curious pets and potentially result in severe burns and/or trauma to the face and paws, even unused fireworks can be hazardous. Some fireworks contain potentially toxic substances such as arsenic, potassium nitrate, and other heavy metals.

3. Don't Give Your Pet "Table Food"

If you are having a backyard barbeque, you may be tempted to slip some snacks to your pet. But like beer and chocolate, there are other festive foods that could harm your pet. Onions, coffee, avocado, grapes & raisins, salt and yeast dough are all possible hazards for dogs and cats.

2. Lighter Fluid and Matches



Are Harmful to Pets.

The ASPCA lists chlorates as a harmful chemical substance found in some matches that, if ingested, can cause your pet difficulty in breathing, damage blood cells or even cause kidney disease. If exposed to lighter fluid, your pet may sustain skin irritation on contact, respiratory problems if inhaled, and gastric problems if ingested.

1. Citronella Insect Control Products Harm Pets, Too.

Oils, candles, insect coils and other citronella-based repellants are irritating toxins to pets, according to the ASPCA. The result of inhalation can cause severe respiratory illnesses such as pneumonia, and ingestion can harm your pet's nervous system.

The safest and best bet for celebrating this Fourth of July with your pets is to exclude them from holiday festivities, at least this time around. Instead, find a safe, secure spot in the home for your pets while you go out and enjoy the loud bangs, bright lights and spectator fun. Your pets will appreciate the quiet a lot more than you'll enjoy the noise.

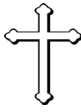

Denton ends red-light camera program
The city of Denton has ended its red-light camera program after House Bill 1631, which prohibits such programs in Texas, was signed by Governor Gregg Abbott recently.

All red-light camera citations stopped on June 2 and have since been disconnected. Anyone with an outstanding red-light camera citation from the City of Denton may consider the violation dismissed.

Registration for the Reel in the FUN Kids Fishing Tournament begins July 1.

Teams of one adult and two children ages 5 to 12 can sign up for the Sept. 28 event at South Lakes Park. The tournament begins with check-in at 8 a.m. with winners announced at 11:30 a.m. A maximum of 30 participants will be allowed for the event. The fee is \$9.

Regional road and bridge updates

FM 720 North - The contractor continues to construct concrete and asphalt driveways; and install seed/sod on northbound lanes. On southbound lanes, roadway excavation, embankment and drainage will be the focus in July. No traffic changes are expected. The project is on track for March 2020 completion.

U.S. 380 East - (Loop 288 to U.S. 377) The TxDOT design team submitted 95 percent plans on May 20th and is working on final plans. (U.S. 377 to county line) The consultant continues to work on the 95 percent plans through July 2019.

U.S. 377 North – Work continues on schematic plans.

U.S. 380 Feasibility Study - Following public meetings in January, a second public meeting is tentatively scheduled for September.

Dallas North Tollway – Engineers are working on 95 percent plans with 100 percent plans due by the end of the year. Construction is expected to begin in early 2020 and be finished by early 2022.

FM 1385 – TxDOT is working to secure engineering firms to begin design.

FM 2931 – TxDOT is working to secure engineering firms to begin design.

FM 455 – From west of FM 2450 to east of Marion Road, TxDOT comments on pre-30 percent bridge layouts were received on May 28. Pre-30 percent bridge layout was re-submitted to TxDOT on June 10.

FM 455 at I-35 – Work toward the 60 percent plans adequate (without traffic control) were submitted for review in June.

I-35 North – Environmental approval is anticipated in July for the estimated \$757.7 million project from U.S. 380 to .7 miles north of FM 3002.

I-35/35E/35W Merge – Geotechnical work on the \$242 million project was expected to begin as of the end of June.

I-35E/Loop 288/Brinker/Mayhill –Project is currently in Phase 2, Step 1 traffic configuration. Next switch to Phase 2, Step 2 is expected to occur in August. Retaining wall,

entrance ramp, construction of MSE walls and asphalt paving of southbound main lanes are expected this month.

Union Hill/ FM 455/ FM 2164 Realignment Project - For July, the focus will be on vegetation.

County road and bridge updates

Arvin Hill Road Project US 377 to Red Mesa - Bid awarded December 18th , 2018. Utility relocation estimated to be completed June 2019.

U.S. 377/Stewart/Arvin Hill Intersection Improvements - TxDOT is reviewing 60 percent plans for the intersection improvements. The county is revisiting signalization with TxDOT. TxDOT has approved an access permit for the realignment of Arvin Hill. Utility relocations are underway.

Sam Bass Road Project - FM 455 North of Nance Road - Bid documents are being created. Utility relocation coordination ongoing.

Pecan Valley Road Culvert Replacement - Design plans at 95%

Hackberry Creek Park Road Project - Preliminary design plans have been submitted to County.

Lois Road West Culvert Replacement - Survey and Engineering study ongoing.

Mayhill Road – From north of Quail Creek Road to U.S. 380, phase 2 construction is underway. North of McKinney Street: Relocation of water and sewer lines, installing drainage pipe, construction of box culverts, drill shafts for Cooper

Creek bridge and earthwork. Moving traffic onto new pavement at U.S. 380/Cooper Creek. South of McKinney Street: Excavation, constructing inlets, box culvert, relocating water lines and installing fire hydrants.

Dallas North Tollway, Extension 4B – Work ongoing on the combined 95 percent plan set.

Lake Sharon Extension - Contractor continues to finish remaining utility work, which is 90 percent complete. The culvert crossing is complete. They are awaiting dryer weather to pour headwalls.

Shady Shores Road – TxDOT is working to draft funding agreement. County has drafted ICA agreements with Lake Dallas and Shady Shores to fund engineering. Agreements have been transmitted to city and town for council consideration.
