## Texas announces sites for next COVID-19 vaccine shipment

More than 877,000 Texans have received a COVID-19 vaccine since they first began arriving in Texas nearly four weeks ago, and that number is expected to increase by at least 50,000 more per day, Gov. Greg Abbott said Monday.

"Never before in the history of this state has Texas vaccinated so many people so quickly," Abbott said during remarks at the Esports Stadium Arlington & Expo Center, a newly designated "vaccination hub" that local health officials said can vaccinate thousands per day. "It's stunning to see what we've accomplished."

The Arlington center, home to the city's mass vaccination effort since December, is among 28 sites designed by the state as hubs.

"Our goal is, by the end of the week, we have no vaccines left," said Tarrant County Judge B. Glen Whitley. The county's health district was allotted 9,000 doses in the most recent shipment this week.

The hubs are meant to streamline vaccinations at a time when the state is seeing an unprecedented surge in COVID-19 cases, deaths, and hospitalizations. Texas continues to prioritize vaccinating health care workers, people who are 65 and older, and those with medical conditions that increase their risk of hospitalization or death if they contract the virus.

The large sites will

receive most of the state's next shipment of 158,825 COVID-19 vaccine doses this week. Just over 38,000 doses will go to 206 additional providers across the state, including several in rural counties that until recently had not received an allotment.

Officials promise bigger allotments in the weeks and months to come, but a patchwork local system of vaccine distribution, among other issues, has created a tumultuous rollout to the long-awaited vaccine.

On Monday, Abbott said Texas expects to see an additional 310,000 first doses per week for the rest of January and up to 500,000 second doses earmarked for those who have already received the injection in Texas. Continued increases are expected, Abbott said, depending on the federal government allotments.

"This structure [of hubs] that we now have created can be expanded and will be expanded very swiftly across the state," Abbott said. "The only limitation that we now face is the limitation of supply. Supply the vaccination is not something that the state of Texas is in control of. The supply of the vaccination comes only from the federal government, and for them it comes largely from the manufacturing capabilities" of the companies making the vaccine.

Two vaccines, by Pfizer and BioNTech and Moder-

na, have been approved for emergency use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and are being distributed nationally. A third company, Johnson & Johnson, could seek emergency approval of its vaccine from the FDA as early as February.

The number of doses that have been administered so far includes those given at hospitals and clinics and other providers, as well as those given through a federal program to inoculate residents of long-term care facilities and nursing homes, Abbott said.

The data on the number of doses administered

has a reporting lag of at least two days, Abbott said, but added that Texans will start to see a significant uptick in those numbers as this week's vaccinations are reported.

"You are going to see those numbers increase, as it turns out, somewhere between 50,000 and 75,000 per day," Abbott said.

Texas Health Commissioner John Hellerstedt said the rate and scale of the state's rollout has been "a really amazing operation" and said the creation of the hubs would ratchet up the rate of administration.

## Denton County expects weekly COVID-19 vaccine shipments in the thousands

Denton County Public Health has been named by Texas as one of its 28 COVID-19 vaccine hubs, making it a primary recipient of vaccine shipments moving forward.

The department is expecting large shipments each week and is currently estimating another 3,500 vaccines in next week's delivery. The new supply places greater emphasis on DCPH's registration system, which was the subject of frustration for many residents when registration first opened.

The current waitlist system, a temporary solution added after DCPH's original phone-based version could not keep up with call volume, notifies those on the list of when their vaccination is scheduled. Rainey said the new system, which county commissioners authorized the purchase of just over a week ago, will allow residents to instead choose a time for their appointment from a selection of time slots.

Additionally, the new system will streamline the reporting process for DCPH nurses, who currently keep track of vaccinations manually at clinics before returning to a computer to input the information. The new solution will allow nurses to check in vaccine recipients digitally and reduce the reporting workload. The new system is still weeks away as its development continues.

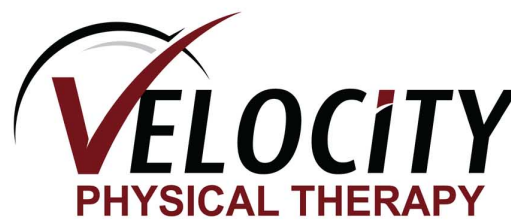
Tuesday's DCPH vaccination clinic used 500 of its 3,500-dose allocation, with Thursday's using up the remaining 3,000.

Denton County residents can sign up for the waitlist to receive the COVID-19 vaccine on the new Vaccine Interest Portal at [DentonCounty.gov/COVID19vaccine](http://DentonCounty.gov/COVID19vaccine).

Only individuals who receive a vaccine appointment confirmation email or text message will be vaccinated at DCPH's drive-thru vaccination clinics. DCPH will continue to utilize the Vaccine Interest Portal as additional vaccine supply is sent in future weeks. Individuals who are not one of the 3,500 to receive the vaccine this week will remain in line for future shipments and DCPH clinics.

Health care workers (under Phase 1A), people who are age 65 and older, and those who have a medical condition that increases their risk of severe disease or death (Phase 1B), will receive priority. Individuals will be able to stay in their vehicles to receive vaccinations.

The Denton County Public Health call center will be operational until 8 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 8, 2021, with weekend hours to be determined based on call volume.

## MORE OBITUARIES...

### Charles Evans Cole

Charles Evans Cole, age 85, died on December 23, 2020 at his home in Santa Fe, NM. He was born in Denton, TX, the second of four children to R.L. and Corine Cole. His father was a grain dealer and his mother had taught school in Krum, TX. He grew up in Krum, and after receiving his elementary and junior high education in the Krum schools, went to Denton High School and was graduated in 1953. He received a B.A. in English cum laude at what is now the University of North Texas in 1957. In 1958 he married Clarice Smith from Abilene, TX, and together they moved to Connecticut, where he received a B.D. from Yale Divinity School in 1961. While a student there, he participated in early demonstrations against Woolworth's in solidarity with black students involved in sit-ins in the South. He received a master's degree in ethics from Perkins School of Theology, SMU, in 1965. He also studied at Vanderbilt University, Union Theological Seminary in New York, and Teachers College at Columbia University.



He worked in three national parks as a student in Christian Ministry in National Parks - Yellowstone, 1954, Bryce Canyon, 1957, and Rocky Mountain, 1965.

He was ordained in The Methodist Church in 1961 and served as pastor in Texas, 1961 - 1964. When he was associate pastor at Tyler Street Methodist Church in Dallas, the senior pastor of the church was charged with adultery, and he participated in a church trial that resulted in the suspension of the pastor. After leaving the pastorate, he became an editor of youth curriculum for the former Methodist Board of Education, Nashville, TN., where he served for from 1965 to 1969. He was fired from his job for editing materials considered too controversial for youth and surrendered his clergy credentials in order to continue working in publishing. His friends in the Methodist Board of Education asked him to continue to write curriculum materials for children, youth, and adults, which he did for several years.

After serving as the editor of juvenile books for a year in Aurora Publishing in Nashville, he became a staff member of the Vanderbilt University News Bureau. He was the managing editor of the journal Soundings while at Vanderbilt and also wrote and edited a newsletter for Fisk University.

From 1975 to 1977 he was editor for the American Association for State and Local History. He then rejoined the church, now the United Methodist Church after its union in 1968. He was an editor and writer with the church's Board of Higher Education and Ministry and became the first editor of the Quarterly Review, intended for clergy and other church professionals. In his capacity as an editor and writer, he travelled to China, Japan, England, Germany, France, and Mexico.

While in Nashville he was a founding member and chair of the Fair Housing Foundation, which advocated for open housing during a contentious period in the civil rights movement. He was a member of a citizen's organization promoting racial desegregation in public schools. He was also a founding member and chair of Woodmont East Neighbors, an organization that objected to an interstate highway being constructed in Nashville. He was a member of the mayor's sign committee, participated in the Democratic Party, and he was a Gary Hart delegate to the 1984 Democratic Convention, where he voted for Geraldine Ferraro, the first woman ever nominated for the vice presidency.

In 1986 he became a staff member of the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church, based in New York City. He was a writer, editor, and head of the communications unit. He and his wife retired in 1999 and moved to Santa Fe, NM. He continued working for the General Board of Global Ministries as a consultant for several years, editing a seven-volume History of Mission of The United Methodist Church.

In Santa Fe he was active in several organizations, including Interfaith Immigrant Allies, the Interfaith Community Shelter, Interfaith Worker Justice, and the Interfaith Coalition on Public School Education. He was coordinator of a Faith Conference on Nuclear Weapons in 2010. He held several positions in St John's United Methodist Church and was elected as a jurisdictional delegate from the New Mexico Conference in 2008. From 2009-2012 he was a board member of the General Board of Church and Society of The United Methodist Church, based in Washington, D.C.

He was a lifelong runner, participating in several marathons, including the New York City Marathon. He was a hiker and climber and once solo-climbed Mt Wilson, a fourteen-thousand-foot peak in Colorado. He was also a gardener, a lover of opera and classical music, and an admirer of contemporary visual art.

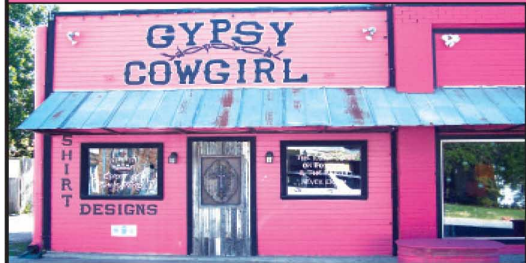

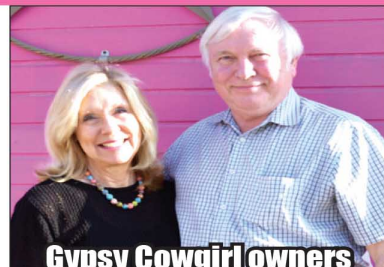

### How to Respond When Risk Tolerance Is Tested

When you begin investing, you'll generally assess your comfort with risk, as your investment choices will be guided at least partially by your risk tolerance. But once you actually experience the ups and downs of the market, this tolerance could be tested.

Risk tolerance may appear less bothersome in the abstract but seem quite different in reality. For example, you might initially think you wouldn't be fazed by short-term market downturns, no matter how severe. However, when the financial markets really decline, as happened when the COVID-19 pandemic struck last March, you might find yourself being more concerned than you thought you would be.

Before you change your investment strategy, it's important to understand the potential tradeoffs. By limiting your downside risk by investing less aggressively, you may also limit your upside potential. You might need to change your strategy in other ways, such as saving

more or working longer. That said, the tradeoff involved in reducing your downside risk may be worth taking, if it helps you cope better with wild market swings, as the best strategy may be one you can stick with through the inevitable ups and downs of the markets.

Because market fluctuations are a normal part of investing, here are some additional suggestions that may help you focus on your long-term strategy.

Look past the immediate event. While the market's pandemic-driven fall was sudden, its recovery was also fairly quick. Eight months after its March meltdown, the market had regained all the lost ground and reached a new record high. During the midst of what appears to be a real threat to your investment portfolio, it can be difficult to anticipate a more favorable environment. Yet, while past performance can't guarantee future results, every historical market decline has been followed by a recovery.

Understand that the Dow isn't your portfolio. When the Dow Jones Industrial Average and the other major market indexes such as the S&P 500 fall precipitously (or shoot up), it makes headlines. But the Dow and the S&P 500 only track the performance of large U.S. companies – and while their performance may be an indica-

tion of the U.S. economy, they aren't going to track the results of your portfolio, which should ideally include a personalized mix of large-company stocks, small-company stocks, international stocks, bonds, government securities and other investments.

Keep your emotions out of your investment moves. The market will fluctuate constantly – but you should always try to keep your emotions in check. Excess exuberance when the market rises, or extreme despondency when the market falls, can lead you to make poor decisions. Specifically, we may buy when we feel good (when the markets are up) and sell when we feel badly (when markets are down). Your heart and your emotions may drive your financial goals – creating a comfortable retirement, sending your kids to college or leaving a legacy for your family – but when you invest for these goals, you should use your head.

Your risk tolerance is a key part of your investment strategy. But by taking the steps described above, you can gain a broader understanding of how risk fits into your overall picture – and a better understanding of yourself as an investor.

## Vaccine

"Through the kind of vaccination operation we see here, we're very confident it's going to accelerate here even more," Hellerstedt said. "It is really the way forward."

Abbott and other health officials at the Arlington site on Monday urged Texas residents and providers to be patient while the state supply catches up with the demand among those eligible for the shot.

"We will be getting more vaccine, and we will be discovering better ways to administer the vaccine in a timely way to everyone who is willing to get it, but we just don't have that supply yet," Hellerstedt said. "I can't say that more emphatically. If we had more, there'd be more going out."

Abbott on Monday said he and other governors were pushing Walgreens and CVS to speed up their programs to more swiftly get vaccines to nursing home and long-term care residents. That process, he said, "is moving at a far slower pace than what the state of Texas is moving at."

Abbott said 487,500 doses have been allocated for long-term care centers through CVS and Walgreens, but that only 75,312 of those doses

have been administered, or about 15%.

"Which means the rest either haven't been given out or haven't been reported yet," Abbott said. "There is no reason for that process to be moving as slowly as it is."

Officials from Walgreens and CVS could not be immediately reached for comment Monday.

Just over 2 million doses have been allocated to the state since mid-December, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services.

Texas has administered the first dose of the two-dose regimen to more people than any other state in the nation, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, but demand among the more than 8 million people who currently qualify still far outweighs the state's vaccine supply.

More vaccination hubs will be announced as weekly shipments get bigger, health officials say. In announcing the plan last week, DSHS said the hubs will be required to set up registration phone numbers and websites and to focus on the most vulnerable communities in their regions. Contact information for the hubs can be found at [www.dshs.texas.gov](http://www.dshs.texas.gov).

The effort comes as production ramps up on various COVID-19 vaccine candidates in anticipation of federal approval, including two being produced in Texas.

On Monday, Texas A&M University officials announced that a biotech production facility in College Station has begun manufacturing two different COVID-19 vaccine candidates that are moving toward federal approval for emergency use as part of the federal government's Operation Warp Speed.

As part of a \$265 million contract with the federal government, the Texas A&M University System Center for Innovation in Advanced Development and Manufacturing — which is owned and operated by Fujifilm Diosynth Biotechnologies — was tapped last summer to mass-manufacture a vaccine being developed by Maryland-based Novavax.

The Novavax candidate began phase three testing in the U.S. and Mexico in December.

The College Station facility expanded and has added about 260 positions since April.

"Our team has worked around the clock since July and we're starting to see light at the end of the tunnel," said Dr. Gerry Farrell, chief operating officer at Fujifilm Diosynth Biotechnologies. "There is great pride and satisfaction on our team for being part of the solution to the pandemic."
