





Record Turnout... **DENTON COUNTY EARLY VOTING NUMBERS**



The Early Voting location for the November 3rd General Election in Sanger is the Community Center at 101 Freese Drive. Early voters can cast their ballots at any of the 46 locations in Denton County.

Denton County set a new record on the first day of early voting after more than doubling its voter turnout last Tuesday from 2016's then-record number.

A total of 35,944 residents cast their ballots in person last Tuesday at one of 46 polling places in the county, according to the Denton County Elections Administration office. This is more than double 2016's first-day turnout of 16,955.

In total, Denton County Elections Administration received ballots from 49,898 people after the first day.

At the Sanger location at the Community Center on 101 Freese Drive, 740 people voted on the first day and 3,547 had voted at this location as of Wednesday morning (Oct. 21st).

On Day 8 of early voting (Tuesday, Oct. 20) in Denton County, 20,956 people voted on this day, compared to 18,908 in 2016 on the eighth day of early voting.

Denton County reached over 200,000 voters at the end of the day on Tuesday, Oct. 20. The total to date for this election was 206,781, compared to 148,063 in 2016

The county's election website shows there are 565,705 voters registered in the county for the Nov. 3 general election. That's 100,000 more than in the 2016 election, according to the Texas secretary of state's web-

The first day of early voting also saw a record number of mail-in ballots returned by the first day of early voting. The secretary of state's website shows 13,954 mail-in ballots were returned, compared with 5,031 in 2016's first day of early voting.

By the time early voting ended in 2016, 11,026 Denton County residents had voted by mail.

Early voting continues through Oct. 30 for the Nov. 3 general and special elections. Polling hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday. For more information, visit www.votedenton.com.

North Texas Fair & Rodeo running smooth

The 92nd annual North Texas Fair and Rodeo wrapped up a much different opening weekend Sunday as it hosted about a quarter of its typical attendance in accordance with state COVID-19 guidelines.

North Texas State Fair Association executive director Glenn Carlton said Sunday afternoon that the fair totaled 13,648 attendees between Friday and Saturday, about a quarter of last year's 54,652 over the first two days. Given the circumstances, he said attendance has been roughly in line with expectations, and that the event projects to be cash positive if the numbers continue.


"We haven't been surprised, it's a different time," Carlton said. "We knew we would be down, but that if we weren't down too much, we would make money on it."

As for the fair's pandemic safety measures, Carlton said staff have been pleased with the response from guests, who are required to wear masks indoors and, when unable to socially distance, outdoors as well. Because the rodeo arena is operating at 50% capacity, he said the fair has had to turn some visitors away, but other attractions have gone similarly to normal years.

Koots Jerky owner Tim Kutas said his Krum-based meat business has attended the fair for nearly 20 years, and that he thinks staff have done a good job in making the event happen.

"They're doing the best they can to make this work," Kutas said. "It's a tradition for a lot of families that come out."

There's still time to go out to the fair and rodeo, as it runs through Saturday, October 24. The fair scheduled an impressive lineup of concerts.

Discounted tickets are sold at Sanger's O'Reilly's Auto Parts Store.

The bulk of the fair and rodeo takes place outdoors, and Carlton said officials halved attendance so that attendees can practice social distancing.

"In the rodeo arena, the [seating capacity] is 4,000," Carlton said. "So we're keeping everything to 50% of that capacity, and on a firstcome, first-served basis.

That's only a problem on Friday and Saturday. People might not be able to get tickets for those days, but during the week, the attendance is less.'

The fair has a contingency plan for both weekends. Rodeo events and concerts will be broadcast on a screen set up in the grassy area of the fairgrounds.

"People can bring their lawn chairs and set up on the grass and see the events. Same thing with the concerts," Carlton

up barricades around the main stage, and capacity in that area is reduced to accommodate 877 people.

"Overflow for the concerts will be in the rodeo arena, and we'll run our concerts on the Fun Zone screen, too, on the lawn," Carlton said. "Normally, our concert area is about 7,000 square feet. With the addition of the screens, our concerts have 90,000 square feet."

For food, games and rides, the event is using a payment system that requires patrons to load money onto a wristband — known as Magic Money — at kiosks or through a smartphone app. "We have volunteers stationed at all those kiosks to disinfect them, but you can just load money onto it using our app and not have to touch anything," he said.

Indians come up short against Aubrey, face Krum

Aubrey had three different rushers score touchdowns and four different runners eclipse 60 yards, as the Chaparrals handed the Indians their first loss of the season in a 48-25 victor last Friday at Indian Stadium, in the district opener for Sanger.

Martavious Hill scored three touchdowns, racking up 99 yards in the process. J.J. Cooke and Braylon Colgrove added a combined 131 yards on the ground for the Chaparrals

Justin Gibby ended the night with two touchdowns and 64 yards, while Jackson Jennings tacked on another score for good measure.

"That offense does wear people down, but I thought our kids kept playing hard," Sanger coach Rocky Smart said. "We didn't give up the 60- or 80-yard runs that people have given up throughout the year. I'm proud of our defense. We bent some, but we never just broke."

Sanger took the opening kickoff and marched right down the field, inside Aubrey's 15-yard line, but couldn't convert on fourth down. On the Indians' next possession, they gave Aubrey a short field after a fumble.

The Indians coughed the ball up four times in the

Aubrey took an early 7-0 lead on a 1-yard run from Hill.

Wesley Huber jumped in front of a Rylan Smart screen pass and ran it back 40 yards, giving the Chaparrals a 14-0 lead. It was one of two first-quarter turnovers

'Offensively, we moved the ball, but it was way too much shooting ourselves in the foot," Smart said. "We've done a pretty good job of not doing that this year. Rylan Smart connected with Zach Shepard on a long pass down the middle for a touchdown and sophomore running back Kyle Watts had two long runs, including at 60-yard touchdown run up the middle.

Aubrey eventually took a 41-17 lead into the fourth quarter after Hill scored his third touchdown of the night. But Sanger responded, as Ben Turnbow recovered a fumble and ran it back 62 yards for a score to pull the Indians to within 41-25.

Aubrey had third and 23 yards to go, inside their own 10 yard line, and threw a screen pass that Sanger stopped, but a facemask penalty gave Aubrey a first down. Sanger's offense would have had the ball in Aubrey territory after a punt, without the penalty. "Penalties will kill you, and they killed us tonight.'

The Chaparrals quickly dashed any hopes of a Sanger comeback on their next drive, as Gibby's second touchdown put Aubrey up 48-25.

Tallyn Welborn ran for 145 yards in the loss for the Indians, and he has now gone over the 1,000-yard mark for the season.

The loss dropped Sanger to 6-1 overall and 0-1 in District 4-4A Division II play.

Aubrey, meanwhile, improved to 7-1 and 2-0 in district play heading into its bye week.

The game was a lot closer than the final score and the Indians proved they have a good football team. Sanger travels to Krum on Friday for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff. Krum is 0-2 in district and 1-7 overall.
