Jenna Tilley purchases Hermes Insurance

Kenneth Hermes and Jenna Hermes Tilley recently announced not only Kenneth's retirement but also announced the sale of his agency to his daughter, Jenna Tilley.

Kenneth, who graduated from Lindsay High School and went to Cooke County College, now NCTC, got into the insurance business in 1982, mostly by accident as most good things do. "I was laid off from National Supply in Gainesville, and Germania hired me as a Staff Adjuster. I knew nothing about the insurance business at the time, but I learned," Kenneth said. For seven years he traveled the great State of Texas, becoming a Senior Adjuster. "I met a lot of good people and saw a lot of good Agencies, all

which helped me mold my Agency." But traveling all the time was no way to raise his young family, so he acquired a Germania Agency out of Argyle, and ran it out of his home for about nine years. Resilience is key to meeting financial goals

You can demonstrate this resilience by answering these questions: What is your specific goal? What obstacle do you face in achieving this goal? How can you overcome this obstacle?

Here are some examples of how this resiliency process works:

Goal: Building sufficient retirement funds

To build sufficient retirement income, you need to invest in the financial markets through your 401(k), IRA and other accounts. But how should you respond when these markets go through periods of volatility? Your best defense is to remain invested. If you were to jump out of the market every time it dropped, you'd probably miss out on the rebounds that followed. Also, over a period of decades, the effects of short-term market fluctuations tend to diminish, so while the results of any particular day or week may not look good on your investment statement, the importance of these results may diminish

in 10 or 20 years.

Goal: Maintaining steady cash flow

Keeping a steady cash flow is essential to meeting your daily and monthly expenses. So, it's obviously important that you maintain sufficient earned income. But what happens if you encounter a serious illness or injury that keeps you from work for an extended period? Depending on the length of time you're not working, you could feel a real financial pinch, so you may want to consider some type of disability insurance. Your employer may offer a short-term policy as an employee benefit, but it might not be sufficient, so you may need to look at private coverage.

Goal: Keeping retirement accounts intact

Ideally, you'd like to leave your IRA, 401(k) and other accounts intact until you need to start tapping into them when you retire. It's not always easy to maintain this conviction – less than half of Americans are confident in their abilities to recover quickly from difficult financial situations, according to a new survey from Edward Jones. One way to help gain this confidence is by working with a financial advisor.

In fact, 36 percent of those surveyed began working with a financial advisor in 2020 for help navigating the past year. The importance of receiving good advice became apparent during the COVID-19 pandemic, which brought about a variety of financial worries, such as job loss, retirement considerations, caregiving for elderly parents or providing financial support to adult children.



Hunter Williams is member of Team USA Skeleton Development Team

When Hunter Williams, a former Sanger resident, placed first in the 200-meter relay at the 2015 PSAC track and field championships, the former Slippery Rock University in Pennsylvania runner never would have imagined the life he lives today. And before that, the 18-year-old version of himself who won a WPIAL 400-meter championship while at Seneca Valley never would have envisioned where he'd be 10 years later.

Williams, now 28, barely knew about the sport of skeleton back then. He certainly didn't pay attention to it.

But now, it's his passion — a source of unrivaled calmness garnered from zooming down a narrow, sharply winding 1,300-meter ice track headfirst on a sled that hits speeds as fast 85 mph. During those precious moments, it's almost as if he's flying. The stresses and anxieties of everyday life go out the window.

“You can't really hear anything else,” said Williams. “You're focused and in the zone. It's just you, the track and the sled — just trying to manipulate the pressures of the track to go as fast as possible and put the sled in the right spots to make it down.”

Williams is a member of the Team USA Skeleton Development Team, which races in national and international events around the world. He has competed everywhere from Lake Placid, N.Y., and Park City, Utah, to most recently the Intercontinental Cup (Jan. 16) races in Altenberg, Germany,

where he placed 21st in a field of 31 — some of whom were current Olympians — on one of the world's most challenging courses for new riders. The race marked Williams' seventh of his young racing career that first began in November 2019.

“Hunter is still very early in his career, but a couple weeks into this season he notably showed a better comfort and understanding of skeleton,” said Team USA skeleton coach Lauri Bausch. “This can be both an exciting and challenging shift because the added awareness can make a slider overthink and overwork, but so far I am impressed in his ability to take on new challenges this season.”

Williams was introduced to the sport by a former college teammate at Slippery Rock. In the summer of 2017, he took part in a combine held by the Team USA Development Program that tested everything from 15, 30 and 45-meter sprints to a shot put toss and one-rep power clean max. He trained



six months for the test and passed, which led to an invitation to attend Team USA's rookie sliding camp in October.

That following January, Williams took his first run during a sliding camp at the Team USA course in Lake Placid. The first time down presents a significant amount of danger for inexperienced riders, as they fly down the track with their chins just centimeters from the ice. One wrong twist

In the time since, Williams' commitment to the sport is reflectant in his steadfast desire to compete on its greatest stage. His ultimate goal is to qualify for the 2026 Olympic Games in Italy, which would require him to place among Team USA's top-3 racers. As of now, he ranks ninth out of the team's top 11 skeleton athletes.

"To make it to the 2026 Winter Olympics, Hunter needs to continue to embrace the pursuit of excellence," said Bausch. "He has made it past the point of 'making it down'

not going to be a perfectly linear improvement. If he can take away something each time and apply to the next experience, then by the 2026 Olympic Trials he may be able to piece it together."

For Williams, skeleton is not his day-job — instead a passion-project that is entirely self-funded. He's a full-time GIS Analyst for Cabot Oil & Gas, which allows him to work remotely while in-season, and sells apparel, holds fundraisers and accepts donations through his personal website to pay the

or turn of the body can be deadly — so much that the Olympics banned the sport for 54 years before reinstating it in 2002.

Williams' first crash came three weeks after his first run, on the track's notorious 10th curve to be exact.

"I came out too early, hit the wall and kind of went cartwheeling down the track," he said. "I had so much adrenaline at the time that it didn't really hurt. I got up, went back up to the top of the track and did another run. You can't let it get in your head."

tracks and being in the mix for his level of experience. We compete in a sport that comes down to fractions of a second over multiple runs, so you need to know you did everything you could to be your best.

"The winningest skeleton athletes on the highest tours aren't just good — they excel, consistently. They are the fastest off the top and they school people down the track. So to be consistently fast on about eight different tracks in a given season — he needs to find fractions of a second at the start. And he needs to be resilient, because it's

high costs associated with equipment and travel. To him, the ambitions, relationships and experiences the sport has given him are worth every dollar.

"It's every child's dream to compete for Team USA with the flag and those letters on your chest," said Williams. "And it's also about proving to myself that I'm capable of competing at the highest level and the experiences that come along with it."

"It's definitely an honor to race against and learn from some of the best in the world."
