when leadership is visionary and grounded in collaboration. Sanger, with its rich heritage and dynamic growth potential, offered a unique opportunity to put that philosophy into practice. I was drawn to the challenge of balancing the tradition that makes Sanger special while guiding it toward sustainable development and enhancing quality of life.

Every day, I am motivated by the people and their pride, entrepreneurial spirit and desire to see the city flourish. I remain committed to transparency, fiscal responsibility and strategic processes that reflect the values and aspirations of our citizens and leadership.

Over the past several years, Sanger has made strategic investments that continue to shape the community's growth and strength. At the center of this effort is our 2040 comprehensive plan, which was created with extensive community input and serves as a clear guide for the future.

On the infrastructure side, we revitalized the aging wastewater treatment plant, added capacity for growth, improved water systems and launched a street and utility maintenance program to support connectivity and safety for generations.

At the same time, we have expanded parks, created new community events and strengthened engagement through town halls, meetings over coffee with the city manager and Cones with Cops. We also established strong partnerships with Sanger ISD, the Sanger Education Foundation and the Chamber of Commerce to expand vocational programs and mentorships for students.

Looking ahead, our focus is on responsible growth, economic opportunity, public safety, broadband access and sustainability while preserving Sanger's small-town char-

Pursuit of Innovation in City Management

For us, the biggest challenge is finding the balance between Sanger's heritage and its future. Our residents take great pride in that heritage. When we introduce new ideas, whether it is smart infrastructure, modern zoning strategies, or digital services, it requires a lot of dialogue to ensure that residents, staff, council, and regional leadership understand what we are doing and why. Another challenge is resources. As a small community, we face constant budget constraints.

Innovation can feel risky due to its upfront costs, so convincing stakeholders that long-term gains outweigh shortterm discomfort requires planning and clear communication. Even so, we have made progress in broadband access, digital services that enhance transparency, and new technologies in our utilities that enable better management.

When we pursue innovation, we rely on three strategies. Community engagement comes first because the best ideas often come from people who have lived here for generations. We also use pilot programs to test new approaches before adopting them on a broader scale. We further rely on cross-departmental collaboration to ensure programs

Among Noblitt's notable accomplishments:

Securing Reliable Electricity for Sanger's Future: Mr. Noblitt negotiated a groundbreaking 16-year agreement with the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) to provide reliable electricity at a low, fixed-rate with no ancillary fees. This agreement is projected to save the City millions of dollars over its term, freeing up funds for critical infrastructure investments.

Strategic Infrastructure Planning: Under his leadership, Sanger acquired property to develop a regional wastewater treatment plant, expand water storage capacity, and enhance utility systems. The property will also feature parks and trails, providing valuable recreational space for residents.

Attracting a Grocery Store and New Development: In response to years of resident requests for a local grocery store, Mr. Noblitt worked with developers, property owners, and the Economic Development Organization to secure a Tom Thumb grocery store as part of a 2,000-home development. This project will bring essential services and new retail opportunities to the community.

Advocating for City Staff and Retirees: Recognizing the need for competitive compensation, Mr. Noblitt commissioned a comprehensive salary study that resulted in significant pay increases for City employees—up to 20% or more in some cases. He also increased pension matches and secured cost-of-living adjustments for retirees, ensuring fair compensation across the board.

City Manager Responsibilities

The City Manager is the Chief Administrative and Executive Officer of the City. The City Manager is appointed by and reports to the City Council. The City Manager serves as the bridge between the Council and staff and is responsible for implementing the policies established by the Council.

The City Manager is also responsible for developing and administering the budget and various strategic plans. In general, the City Manager is responsible for supervising city employees and has the final responsibility for all hiring, discipline, and termination matters.







The basics: Itemizing vs. standard deduction. To benefit from charitable tax deductions, you need to itemize your deductions on your tax return. Everyone automatically receives a standard deduction, which in 2025 is \$31,500 for married couples filing jointly or \$15,750 for single filers. If your donation exceeds these limits in a single year, you can carry forward the unused portion for up to five years.

Indians beat Quinlan Ford in playoffs, travel to Forney to take on no. 1 Carthage

through three quarters Friday and held on covery, Luke Hendricks had 8 tackles, late for a 31-20 win, its first playoff victory

the final period before Ford scored two touchdowns within a minute to make it a 10-point game with 4:55 left at Munson Stadium. Sanger then added a touchdown to pad the lead before one more Ford score set the final margin in the 4A Division II bi-district contest.

Sanger held Ford's run-heavy offense scoreless for the first 42 minutes of game time and forced it into a fumble, three turnovers-on-downs and two punts on six of its first seven drives with the other series ending scoreless. Dez Sampson led the defense with 11 total tackles, five for loss and six QB pressures. Connor Tillison had 11 tackles, 2 for a loss, 2 forced fumbles and a fumble recovery; Joshua Lindsey had 10 tackles, 1 for a loss and 1 sack; Garrett Weaver had 8 tackles; Cree-
