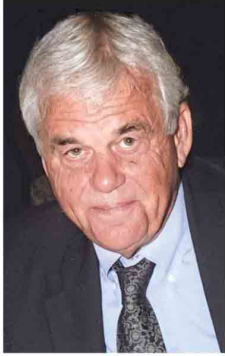
Gray loved playing cards, dominoes, and chess and enjoyed traveling, reading, white-water rafting, bowling, and spending time with family and friends.

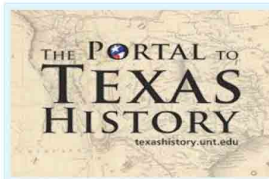

when leadership is vision-ary and grounded in col-laboration. Sanger, with its rich heritage and dynamic growth potential, offered a unique opportunity to put that philosophy into practice. I was drawn to the challenge of balancing the tradition that makes Sanger special while guid-ing it toward sustainable development and enhanc-ing quality of life.

Every day, I am moti-vated by the people and their pride, entrepreneurial spirit and desire to see the city flourish. I remain committed to transpar-ency, fiscal responsibility and strategic processes that reflect the values and aspi-rations of our citizens and leadership.

Over the past several years, Sanger has made strategic investments that continue to shape the community's growth and strength. At the center of this effort is our 2040 com-prehensive plan, which was created with exten-sive community input and serves as a clear guide for the future.

On the infrastructure side, we revitalized the ag-ing wastewater treatment plant, added capacity for growth, improved water systems and launched a street and utility mainte-nance program to support connectivity and safety for generations.

At the same time, we have expanded parks, created new community events and strengthened engagement through town halls, meetings over coffee with the city manager and Cones with Cops. We also established strong partner-ships with Sanger ISD, the Sanger Education Foun-dation and the Chamber of Commerce to expand vocational programs and mentorships for students.

Looking ahead, our focus is on responsible growth, economic oppor-tunity, public safety, broad-band access and sustain-ability while preserving Sanger's small-town char-acter.

Pursuit of Innovation in City Management

For us, the biggest challenge is finding the balance between Sanger's heritage and its future. Our residents take great pride in that heritage. When we in-troduce new ideas, wheth-er it is smart infrastructure, modern zoning strategies, or digital services, it re-quires a lot of dialogue to ensure that residents, staff, council, and regional lead-ership understand what we are doing and why. Anoth-er challenge is resources. As a small community, we face constant budget con-straints.

Innovation can feel risky due to its upfront costs, so convincing stake-holders that long-term gains outweigh short-term discomfort requires planning and clear com-munication. Even so, we have made progress in broadband access, digi-tal services that enhance transparency, and new technologies in our utilities that enable better manage-ment.

When we pursue in-novation, we rely on three strategies. Community engagement comes first because the best ideas often come from people who have lived here for generations. We also use pilot programs to test new approaches before adopt-ing them on a broader scale. We further rely on cross-departmental collab-oration to ensure programs

Among Noblitt's notable accomplishments:

Securing Reliable Electricity for Sanger's Future: Mr. Noblitt negotiated a groundbreaking 16-year agreement with the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) to provide reliable electricity at a low, fixed-rate with no ancillary fees. This agreement is projected to save the City millions of dollars over its term, freeing up funds for critical infrastruc-ture investments.

Strategic Infrastructure Planning: Under his leadership, Sanger acquired property to develop a regional wastewa-ter treatment plant, expand water storage capacity, and enhance utility systems. The property will also feature parks and trails, providing valuable recreational space for residents.

Attracting a Grocery Store and New Development: In response to years of resident requests for a local grocery store, Mr. Noblitt worked with developers, property owners, and the Economic Development Organization to secure a Tom Thumb grocery store as part of a 2,000-home devel-opment. This project will bring essential services and new retail opportunities to the community.

Advocating for City Staff and Retirees: Recognizing the need for competitive compensation, Mr. Noblitt com-missioned a comprehensive salary study that resulted in significant pay increases for City employees—up to 20% or more in some cases. He also increased pension matches and secured cost-of-living adjustments for retirees, ensuring fair compensation across the board.

City Manager Responsibilities

The City Manager is the Chief Administrative and Ex-ecutive Officer of the City. The City Manager is appointed by and reports to the City Council. The City Manager serves as the bridge between the Council and staff and is responsible for implementing the policies established by the Council.

The City Manager is also responsible for developing and administering the budget and various strategic plans. In general, the City Manager is responsible for supervising city employees and has the final responsibility for all hiring, discipline, and termination matters.

Balancing the Present While Building the Future

Real stewardship means preparing for de-cades ahead, not just days. Sustaining the balance between daily operations and long-term priorities hinges on discipline and vision. Each day, our team addresses immedi-ate needs, such as public safety, infrastructure and service delivery, while planning for the next five, ten or even 25 years. We follow key principles to maintain this balance. Strategic planning under-pins every decision in our comprehensive growth plan, ensuring that even short-term actions align with our long-term Com-munity-centered lead-ership is equally vital. Residents' input directly shapes our priorities.

An example is the Miracle League Field Project, which is inspired by citizens who identified a need for better accessi-bility and a sports facility for children with special needs.

We also stress empow-erment and accountabili-ty. Our department heads are trusted experts who are empowered to inno-vate and make decisions that foster ownership and continuous improvement.

Ultimately, resilience and adaptability enable us to navigate econom-ic shifts and regulatory changes without compro-mising our long-term ob-jectives. Every decision we make today contributes to a more sustainable, effi-cient and vibrant commu-nity tomorrow.

Smart Solutions for a Sustainable Future

Technology is under-going exponential change and is reshaping municipal leadership at a rapid pace. I believe smart infrastruc-ture will define much of our progress. Intelligent traffic systems, roadway sensors and connected devices will help improve traffic flows and public safety. Datadriven gov-ernance will also play a larger role. We can model trends, spot problems ear-lier and make faster and more informed decisions with AI and advanced an-alytics.

At the same time, citi-zen engagement is shifting from phone calls and office visits to digital platforms and social media, which has transformed how gov-ernments connect with residents. With that shift, cybersecurity resilience be-comes critical.

We also need to em-brace energy innovation and sustainable building practices to meet environ-mental goals. Future lead-ership will be more net-worked and collaborative, with regional and even global coalitions working together to solve complex challenges.

Shaping Tomorrow's City Stewards

Leadership in city management is a privilege. You are not just manag-ing a city. You are shaping lives. For emerging profes-sionals, my advice is to lead with purpose and humility. Adopt integrity, transpar-ency, accountability and ethical decision-making. Build trust, stay curious, master your fundamentals and never lose sight of the people you serve.

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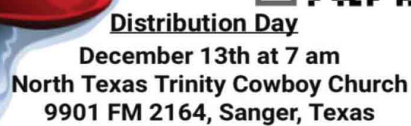

Generosity meets strategy with tax-savvy donations

Giving to charity feels good, but understanding the tax benefits can benefit both the charity and you. Whether you donate regularly or are planning your first gift, knowing how charitable tax deductions work can help you make informed decisions while supporting causes you care about. Here are things to consider:

The basics: Itemizing vs. standard deduction. To benefit from charitable tax deductions, you need to itemize your deductions on your tax return. Everyone automatically receives a standard deduction, which in 2025 is \$31,500 for married couples filing jointly or \$15,750 for single filers. You'll only benefit from itemizing if your total deductions, including charitable gifts, exceed these amounts.

For many people, charitable donations alone won't push them over the standard deduction threshold. However, when combined with other deductible expenses like mortgage interest or state and local taxes, itemizing can make financial sense.

If you give regularly but don't usually exceed the standard deduction, consider "stacking" your donations. Instead of donating \$5,000 annually, you might donate \$15,750 in one year to exceed the itemization threshold, then take the standard

deduction in subsequent years.

Ensure your donation qualifies. To claim a deduction, you must give to a qualified charitable organization recognized by the IRS. You can verify an organization's status on the IRS website or ask the charity for their determination letter. Donations to individuals, even those in need, don't qualify for tax deductions.

Additionally, you can't receive personal benefits in exchange for your donation. If you give \$500 to a charity but receive concert tickets worth \$200, your deductible amount is only \$300.

How much can you deduct? The IRS limits charitable deductions based on your adjusted gross income (AGI). For cash donations to public charities, you can typically deduct up to 60% of your AGI. If you donate stocks or other appreciated assets you've held for more than a year, the limit is generally 30% of your AGI.

If your donation exceeds these limits in a single year, you can carry forward the unused portion for up to five years.

What to donate. Think strategically about what you donate. While cash is easiest, donating appreciated stocks can provide additional tax benefits since you avoid paying capital gains taxes on the invest-

ment's growth.

Keep good records. Documentation matters. For donations under \$250, a canceled check or receipt works fine. Cash donations of \$250 or more need written acknowledgment from the charity. For larger non-cash donations of property exceeding \$5,000 in value, the IRS requires a qualified written appraisal. Keep these records with your tax documents in case the IRS requests proof. See IRS Publication No. 526 and No. 561 for information on charitable contributions and valuing donated property.

The bottom line: Charitable giving may start with your heart, but understanding the tax implications helps you give more effectively. Work with a tax professional and a financial advisor to develop a giving strategy that aligns with both your charitable goals and financial situation. With thoughtful planning, you can maximize both your impact on causes you care about and the tax benefits you receive.

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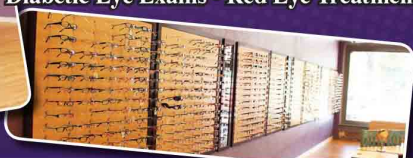
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Indians beat Quinlan Ford in playoffs, travel to Forney to take on no. 1 Carthage

Sanger dominated Quinlan Ford through three quarters Friday and held on late for a 31-20 win, its first playoff victory since 2016.

The Indians led 24-0 heading into the final period before Ford scored two touchdowns within a minute to make it a 10-point game with 4:55 left at Munson Stadium. Sanger then added a touchdown to pad the lead before one more Ford score set the final margin in the 4A Division II bi-district contest.

In the process, Sanger earned just its fourth playoff win since 2000 after taking one apiece in 2006, 2014 and 2015.

Sanger (8-3) advances to face 4A DII No. 1-ranked Carthage (11-0), the defending state champion, in the area round at 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 21, at Forney City Bank Stadium. Quinlan Ford finishes with an overall record of 8-3. The Indians extended their season behind a largely stout effort defensively.

Sanger held Ford's run-heavy offense scoreless for the first 42 minutes of game time and forced it into a fumble, three turnovers-on-downs and two punts on six of its first seven drives with the other series ending scoreless. Dez Sampson led the defense with 11 total tackles, five for loss and six QB pressures. Connor Tillison had 11 tackles, 2 for a loss, 2 forced fumbles and a fumble recovery; Joshua Lindsey had 10 tackles, 1 for a loss and 1 sack; Garrett Weaver had 8 tackles; Cree-

don Boerner had 8 tackles, 1 fumble recovery, Luke Hendricks had 8 tackles, 1 for loss; Kale Barr and Jonas Autry each had 6 tackles. In all, the Sanger defense had 10 tackles for a loss and 15 quarterback pressures.

• Joel Rodriguez added 55 yards on 4 catches

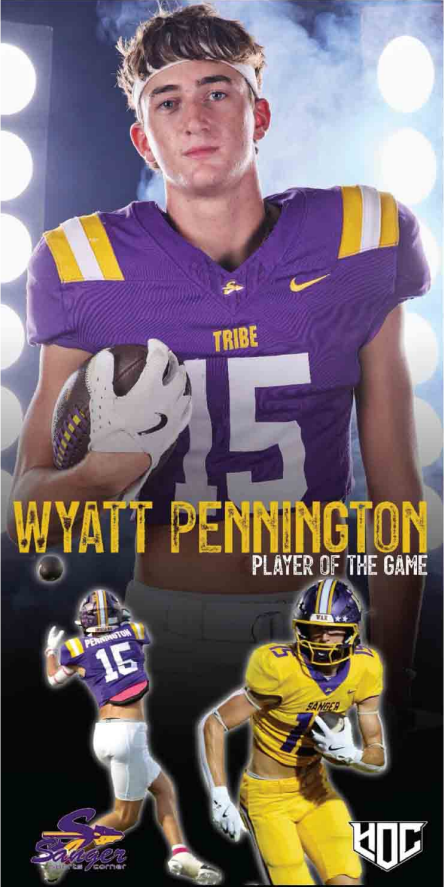
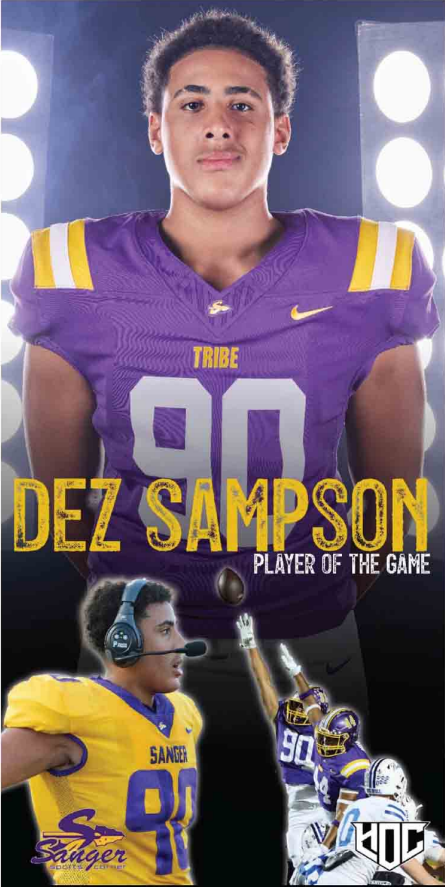

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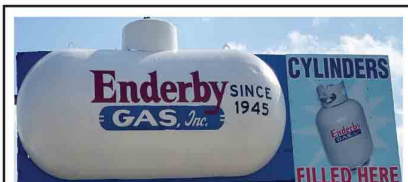
