# First Mayoral race in eight years, Surles runs for Muir's position

Incumbent Muir has filed to run for another term as City of Sanger Mayor, but he'll face opposition this year, as Phillip Surles has also filed for the seat. This marks the first election for Mayor in eight years. The deadline to file was Friday for Mayor, City Council and School Board.

"As the current Mayor, I appreciate the opportunity to serve and make a positive contribution to the long-term future of our community. The betterment

of our community carries a high personal priority," said Muir. "Consequently, I give heavy weight and commitment to the decisions we face as a city council, including those decisions that have immediate impact and those that set the strategic direction of the City.

"Sanger is blessed and I have personally been blessed to serve alongside excellent city council members, city staff, and city boards over my years of service. All of these individuals show similar commitment to our community," Muir said. "Many of them have been long-time residents and I believe all of them have the community at the heart of their motivation. This is what makes the Sanger community truly

#### 10 Must-Have Apps For Your Phone

A new app is like candy: It's fun, bite-sized, and gives you a rush. Whether you prefer the iTunes App Store or Google Play, you'll find an all-you-can-download buffet of mind-blow-

ing software for your mobile device.

People are always asking me what apps they should get. The answer depends, of course, on many things. What are your pastimes? What do you need help with? Some people subsist on Tinder. Others are obsessed with Google Translate, or Pokémon Go, or Pandora. We each have our unique preferences. But certain apps rise above the rest. They're powerful, they're fun, and they're incredibly useful. They're top in their category, and almost every user ends up exclaiming, "Wow, I can't believe how cool this thing is!" Here are 10 of those must-have apps, plus a bonus.

- Waze: What would happen if you combined the geography of Google Maps with the mentality of Twitter? It would probably look something like Waze, a navigational tool that also uses crowd-sourced data. The little map will show you fellow Waze users on the highway, and they routinely report accidents and speed traps to make your trip smoother.

Pact may sound like a crazy gimmick, but it has inspired 11.8 million workouts to date, claiming a 92% success rate.
- Sleep Cycle: We all know about our "circadian rhythm," or sleep cycles. Over the course of 90 minutes, typical sleepers enter different phases of sleep, from light sleep to the dreamy REM phase and back. It would be nice to harness that cycle to our benefit, but how could we? We're asleep! Sleep Cycle is an app that takes data on your sleep patterns, and then it figures out the right time to wake you up. This might sound unsettling at first, but Sleep Cycle has helped millions of people figure out their perfect "wake up" phase. The app also takes irregular sleep into account, and the "intelligent snooze" feature is tailored to your unique waking habits.
- Google Trips: Travel is wonderful for the soul, but it can be a very cluttered experience. You've got plane tickets, handbooks, printed itineraries, car rental details, hotel addresses scrawled on napkins, camera gear, backup batteries, and a million other doodads stuffed in your cargo pants. Google Trips takes your travel information and aggregates it. You can list all of your booking information, all of your itineraries, and all information about local eateries and monuments into one app. Can't get reception in the middle of Mongolia? Google Trips works fluidly offline as well.
- Dark Sky: "They said it would be sunny!" exclaims the frustrated fisherman as rain pours over his boat. If the smiling TV weatherman has lost your trust, and you're skeptical of the free weather app on your phone, consider Dark Sky. Billed as a "hyper-local" weather forecaster, this app is designed to predict the weather in your exact location. This can be especially handy in mountainous regions, where every little valley experiences its own weather, or in the Great Plains, where storms sweep past at a moment's notice. Detailed maps show you exactly what weather is brewing, and you can receive notifications as frequently as you like.
- Mint: For many of us, managing money is kind of like keeping a tidy house. It would be great to keep pristine spreadsheets, scan our receipts, and integrate all of our account information into a single platform. Well, Mint makes that easy. Not only can you keep track of earnings, expenses, and tax information, but you can automatically pay bills and draft budgets, right on your mobile device. What's more, you can check your credit score at a glance, no third-party service required. Remember, it's never too late for a New Year's resolution.
- Magisto: Yes, you could hire a videographer to cast, shoot, and edit your online commercial. Then you get a bill for \$40,000. Is there a cheaper way to do this? True to its name, Magisto as the magical ability to transform amateur photos and footage into breathtaking short videos. Readyto-use templates result in feisty, professional-looking spots, and there's a whole library of royalty-free music to fit any mood. Whether you're a hobbyist hoping to move up from iMovie or a business owner making a professional advertorial, Magisto will make it happen.

#### Is a Managed Account Right for You?

As an investor, you'll face many decisions over the years. How much should you invest? Where should you put your money? When is it time to sell some investments and use the proceeds to buy others? Some people enjoy making these choices themselves – but not everyone. Consequently, the type of investor you are will influence your thinking about whether to open a managed account.

As its name suggests, a managed account - sometimes known as an "advisory" account - essentially is a portfolio of stocks, bonds and other investments chosen by a professional investment manager who makes the buy and sell decisions. Typically, each managed account has an investment objective based on your goals, and you may have some voice in investment choices for example, you may be able to request that the manager avoid certain investments. Or, you might still work with a personal financial advisor who can help you identify and quantify your goals, define your risk tolerance, and track changes in your family situation – and who can then use this information to help guide the investment manager's choices.

Beyond this basic structure, managed accounts can vary greatly in terms of administration, reporting, fees and minimum balance.

So, assuming you meet the requirements for a managed account, should you consider one? There's really no one right answer for everyone. But three factors to consider are cost, control and confidence.

• Cost – Different managed accounts may have

different payment arrangements. However, it's common for a money manger to be paid based on a percentage of assets under management. So, if your manager's fee is 1% and your portfolio contains \$100,000, the manager earns \$1,000 per year, but if the value of your portfolio rises to \$200,000, the manager earns \$2,000. Because the manager has a personal stake in the portfolio's success, this arrangement could work to your advantage. Be aware, though, that other fees may be associated with your ac-

- Control With any managed account, you will give up some, or perhaps all, of your power to make buyand-sell decisions. If you have built a large portfolio, and you're busy with work and family, you may like the idea of delegating these decisions. And, as mentioned above, you can still oversee the "big picture" by either working through a financial advisor or, at the least, having your goals, risk tolerance and investment preferences dictate a money manager's decisions. But you will have to decide for yourself how comfortable you are in ceding control of your portfolio's day-to-day transactions.
- Confidence It's essential that you feel confident in a managed account's ability to help you meet your goals. And the various elements of a managed account may well give you that assurance. For example, some managed accounts include automatic rebalancing of assets, which, among other things, can help you achieve tax efficiency. Other features of a managed account - such as the experience and track record of the manager also may bolster your con-

Ultimately, you'll need to weigh all factors before deciding whether a managed account is right for you. In any case, it's an option worth considering.





Clemmons then got into an altercation with Sanger's Brooke Rollins (11 points), which ended with Clemmons receiving a technical foul for shoving Rollins.


The Lady Indians already had been fouled to stop the clock, and Maci Turkoly hit three of the four free throws to seal the win.



# Argyle is the

# only 9-4A team to advance in playoffs

Sanger High School lost to no. 4 state ranked Dallas Lincoln 82-40 on Tuesday night in the bi-district playoff game. Sanger was outscored 17-11, 15-11 and 20-18 in the final three periods, but dug a huge hole in the first. It took Sanger about a quarter to settle in, but it was too late to give Lincoln a game. Lincoln did the same thing to Krum last year in the first round of the playoffs. Krum lost 77-33. It's just a tough draw for the fourth place team from District 9-4A, and third and second...

Jordan Williams led Sanger with 9 points and five rebounds. CJ Jackson scored eight points and had four rebounds. Payten Vidourek recorded six points and Landon CeBallos chipped in four points. 6'10" post Trey Henderson nailed a 3-pointer from the right side and had three rebounds. Tre Peoples scored 2 points and had 2 assists. Hank Lemons had 2 points and six rebounds. Zach Cochran, Mickey Sykes, Elijah Ritzel, each made a basket.

Lincoln started the game hitting three, 3 pointers inside a minute. And they didn't cool off until the second half. They shot 40 times behind the arc and made 11. Senior point guard Kennedy Lincoln made 5-of-7, 3-pointers. He ended the game with 20 points. He's signed with Oral Roberts University.

Meanwhile, Sanger was 3-for-23 shooting three's. Lincoln got a lot of second and third looks as they grabbed 23 offensive rebounds and 26 on defense. Sanger had 12 offensive and 18 defensive rebounds.

Sanger will lose seniors Landon CeBallos, CJ Jackson, Dabira Ognwuyi, Mickey Sykes and probably junior Tre Henderson. Henderson will need approval from the UIL to play his senior season, since he was homescchooled one year, after he started high school.


The seniors did a great job of helping the Indians to an 18-16 record and making the playoffs. Sanger returns juniors: Jordan Williams, Hank Lemons, Tre Peoples, Payten Vidourek, and Cameron Cockrell and sophomore Zach Cochran. The Leopards hit 10 treys, half of those coming from freshman guard Colby Brasher. Brasher finished with 17 points and was one of three Leopards to reach double figures. Josh Kemp scored 15 and Tyler Goldsworth added 13.

There were eight lead changes in the fourth quarter, and Gainesville looked like it might hang on when Brasher hit a 3-pointer with 1:31 left to give his team a 53-52 lead. Sanger's Trey Henderson hit a 10 foot baseline shot from the right side to give the Indians a lead. And he was 2-for-2 from the free throw line late in the game to put the Indians on top again.
