Denton County OPEN Phase II grants \$35.1 million for businesses to support the local economy, including twelve from Sanger

Denton County Commissioners Court announced last week that 1,215 businesses across Denton County would receive grants totaling \$32 million for a grand total of \$35.1 million in federal funds earmarked in two phases to support the local economy. This includes twelve Sanger businesses with grants totaling over \$215,000.

"The Denton County Commissioners Court is committed to helping our local businesses recover from the financial losses suffered during the COVID-19 pandemic," said Denton County Judge Andy Eads. "These grants allow us to assist many of our small businesses across the county and help initiate the recovery of our local economy."

In Phase II of Denton County OPEN, for-profit businesses headquartered and located in Denton County with 100 or fewer employees were eligible to apply. The amount each business received was based on the documented negative financial impact of COVID-19 between March 1, 2020 and June 20, 2020.

Of the 1,215 recipients in Phase II, 47 percent employ between 1 to 4 people while 21 percent employ 5 to 9 people. A total of 12 grants were awarded for companies with 50 to 99 employees. In Denton County, around 95.6 percent of all businesses employ fewer than 50 employees.

The Phase II grants reached across Denton County with 22.62 percent in Precinct 1, 17.05 percent in Precinct 2, 30.72 percent in Precinct 3 and 29.62 percent in Precinct 4.

In Phase I, Denton County awarded \$3.09 million to 451 businesses, averaging an estimated \$6,872. Around 23.5 percent of the first phase of grants were awarded to businesses in Precinct 1, 16.85 percent in Precinct 2, 29.27 percent in Pre-

cinct 3 and 30.38 percent in Precinct 4.

The total of \$35.1 million for both Phase I and Phase II of the Denton County OPEN business grants is a portion of the stimulus money Denton County received from the U.S. Department of the Treasury under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act also known as the "CARES Act."

Through the two phases, Denton County will have re-invested an average of \$25,357 into 1,385 businesses. An estimated 10,401 jobs are expected to be supported through the grants.

In comparison, Tarrant County earmarked \$30 million for business grants and Dallas County earmarked \$5 million. Travis County set aside \$9 million for business grants while Bexar County awarded \$11.75 million for businesses.

"We immediately identified supporting local businesses as we earmarked the CARES Act funds for distribution within Denton County," said Precinct 2 Commissioner Ron Marchant. "We realized how important it is to stabilize the local economy as well as assist non-profits, supplement food needs and provide eviction prevention measures."

Michael Talley, Director of Economic Development for Denton County, worked with the Commissioners Court to implement a Chapter 381 Economic Development Agreement, which allowed the county to administer and develop a program to make grants of public money stimulate, encourage and develop commercial activity in the county.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has affected our business community hard, especially, our small businesses," Talley said. "The infusion of these dollars

SISD begins with 1,818 campus and 757 online students

Sanger ISD started school on Monday. It's an unprecedented time with the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We have had a wonderful start. As with any first day of school, there will be mistakes or unplanned occurrences that happen across the district. However, I could not be more proud of all the hard work and preparation our teachers did, in making our first day of school a success," said Sanger ISD Superintendent Dr. Tommy Hunter.

Dr. Hunter wants parents and community members to be patient as they are still working through certain issues, such as bus routes and parent pick-up and drop-off. It will take a few weeks for the district to settle in. "We will be making all the necessary changes to get the routine established. Again, we ask our parents to be patient with us during this

time," said Dr. Hunter, on Wednesday.

SISD has 2,575 students enrolled (1,818 - Face-to-Face Learners) and 757 - Online Learners. Enrollment is up a little from the end of school last year. The Sanger News will publish each SISD campus and grade enrollment figures in next weeks issue.

The district will be

sending out another parent survey regarding Learning Platforms. After the first three weeks of school, students are allowed to switch from online to face-to-face learning if they so choose. They will also have the choice to move from face-to-face to online. After this three week window has passed, students will not be allowed to switch

from online to face-to-face until the end of the grading period (9-weeks). Students can move from face-to-face at any time during the year. Due to the planning involved with classroom space and social distancing guidelines, they are only allowing online learners to switch platforms at the grading periods.

into our local businesses is an important step in keeping our local economy thriving.”

“All of us on the Commissioners Court are excited about assisting our local businesses,” said Precinct 3 Commissioner Bobbie Mitchell. “It’s so important that we keep Denton County businesses running to keep jobs and keep people working. That’s what it is all about.”

Get the Most from Your 401(k)

You won’t see any greeting cards celebrating it, and it’s not likely to be on your calendar, but in just a few weeks, National 401(k) Day will be observed. And this type of recognition may be warranted, too, because 401(k) plans have become key building blocks for a big part of people’s lives – a comfortable retirement. Are you making the most of your 401(k)?

Of course, during the past few months, you may have had mixed feelings about your 401(k). After all, at the beginning of the coronavirus, when the financial markets tumbled, the value of your account probably fell significantly, although it has likely regained some ground since the initial drop.

Nonetheless, the recent market volatility and its short-term effects on your 401(k) should not unduly influence your decisions about this important retirement account. After all, a 401(k) is truly a long-term vehicle, in every sense – you contribute to it for decades while you’re working, and you can draw on it, along with other sources of income, for decades during your retirement. Consequently, you’ll want to consistently review your account to

ensure it is working hard for you.

Here are a few suggestions:

Get the match. At a minimum, put enough into your 401(k) to earn your employer’s matching contribution, if one is offered. While employers can set their own rules, a typical match is 50% of what you put in, up to 6% of your salary. So, if you don’t contribute the amount needed to earn the match, you are essentially “leaving money on the table.” (Be aware, though, that some employers have temporarily suspended matching contributions in response to the economic slowdown during the pandemic.)

Give yourself regular “raises.” Every time your salary goes up, increase your annual contributions. Most people typically don’t come anywhere near hitting the maximum annual 401(k) contribution limit (which, in 2020, is \$19,500, or \$26,000 for those 50 or older), and you might not, either, but try to put in as much as you can afford. Not only will you be building tax-deferred resources for retirement, but you’ll be giving yourself a big tax break, because the more you contribute each year, the lower your taxable income (unless you have a Roth 401(k), in which case your contributions aren’t deductible, but your earnings can grow tax-free).

Invest for growth. Because your 401(k) is designed to help fund your retirement, which could

last 20 years or more, you’ll want to build the biggest account possible. That means you’ll need to include investments designed to provide growth within your 401(k), subject to your personal risk tolerance.

Be careful about loans. You can take out loans from your 401(k), but it’s not always a good move. You’ll have to pay yourself back, and if you leave your job, either voluntarily or involuntarily, the repayment may be due at an inconvenient time. (However, as part of the CARES economic stimulus act, many 401(k) loan repay-

ments are being suspended for up to one year.) Furthermore, by taking out money from your account, even temporarily, you can slow its overall growth potential. So, you may want to look for other sources of income before tapping into your 401(k).

National 401(k) Day is just that – a day. But by taking the appropriate steps, you can help ensure your own 401(k) gives you many years’ worth of benefits.

Sanger's varsity takes on Clifton this Friday at Aledo High School

Sanger's varsity football team starts their season on Friday against Clifton at Aledo HS (neutral site). The Clifton Cubs are coming off and 8-4 season. "This will be a great test to see where we are coming into the season," said Sanger head coach Rocky Smart.

Defensively Clifton plays a three and four man front and various coverages using two deep safeties. Offensively they are an extremely run heavy team. They will align in various formations, but will try to establish their favorite play which is called "power".

Coach Smart is in his second season as head coach and the Indians look to improve off their 1-9 campaign last year with a very tough schedule in 2019. This season, the schedule favors the Indians in several of their games.

Sanger's offensive line looks much improved. Nathan Hunt, Morgan Bowland, Victor Macias, Jyreese Jones, Chase Vaughn and Abel Gonzales played solid in the scrimmage. Those six rotate pretty equal on the starting offensive line, according to Coach Smart.

Sanger will have a balanced attack in their spread offense. Junior quarterback Rylan Smart has some threats at the offensive skill positions. Senior receiver Zac Shepard made two tough catches for first downs, in the scrimmage last week, while being hit by a defender each time; sophomore Ben Turnbow is shifty and caught a 50-yard bomb in the scrimmage. Smart also scored a touchdown on the ground and proved he's formidable at gaining yards himself on the ground, and he's more accurate passing in his second-year as Indians quarterback. But, the offense will run through senior running back Tallyn Welborn. He rushed for around 250 yards and three touchdowns in the scrimmage. He's a load to bring down and showed some speed once he reaches the second level.

The defense will be led by linebackers Carson Stamper and Creed Carter; Shepard at cornerback. And, Coach Smart is high on defensive lineman Jaxon Olsen, as well. All four have the most experience.

As of Wednesday, SHS didn't have a JV game to play this week. They are working on adding one for the open week on Thursday October 8th.

Virtual Hay Clinic Planned for Sept 17

TEXAS A&M

This year a large volume of hay has been produced around the county due to the wet year we had in early summer. After we finally were able to get some higher nighttime temperatures back in May, hay season has been going full steam ahead. Some producers were even able to cut earlier than that, taking advantage of the very good stand on cool-season ryegrass that was available in some fields.

Most hay produced for horses each year is highly fertilized bermudagrass while cattle and other livestock hay can vary between non-natives like bermudagrass, johnsongrass, and natives like bluestems, and indiagrass. Quality of the hay depends on which cutting it is; first, second, or third, and the timing of the cutting related to the maturity of the grass. Premium hay is cut between 28-35 days if there are ideal nutrients and moisture.

This is a great time for producers to sign up for our annual hay clinic on September 17, 2020. The program will be held virtually this year, which is a change from years prior. Holding the program virtually will allow program attendees to feel safe and com-

fortable in their own homes during the Covid-19 pandemic. This hay clinic will be very educational for landowners and producers.

The clinic will include free hay testing, sponsored by the Noble Research Institute, to allow for producers to check and see the quality of this year's hay, and even compare different cuttings to see which hay is the best. The test results will give producers protein content, total digestible nutrients, and feeding recommendations for livestock.

To take advantage of the opportunity all you have to do is take your hay sample by Dennis' Farm Store, at 320 Bell Pl. Denton, TX by August 29th. Attend the clinic virtually, and we'll send your results to you. To find out more information about this program visit our Facebook page, "Denton County Agriculture and Natural Resources".
