

# "SONGS OF SANGER"



"Songs of Sanger", authored by Idaleene Scheu Fuqua, was originally published in 2011 and the very popular book sold out quickly. This book has now been re-printed and available for purchase.

Fugua, whose father Fred Scheu was the station master for the Santa Fe Railroad at the Sanger depot, lived in Sanger as a young girl, and has shared many memories of the families, friends, businesses, community, young men serving their country, and special events held within the community from many years ago. Did you know that at one time there was a rodeo in downtown Sanger at the northeast corner of Third and Bolivar? It was quite an event with rodeo clowns, bull-riding on livestock from local farmers, and townspeople attended the event each week with great enthusiasm.

One of Fuqua's nostalgic memories was at the Wilfong building. The current Wilfong building at the corner of Fourth and Bolivar streets was formerly Jess Smith Drygoods store for many years after Mr. Wilfong sold the business to Mr. Smith. The lovely windows are still in place today, and were displays for goods to be sold. At Christmas-time, the store windows were as magical as Neiman-Marcus windows at Christmas. There was always a Christmas tree, holiday decorations, and gifts for the children on display in all the windows lit up for the holidays. Ms. Fuqua writes about Mr. Wilfong decorating the windows for Christmas and the doll she spied before Christmas one year; she hoped, wished, and prayed that Santa would be good to her and bring that doll with its wardrobe



trunk full of clothes. Late one night, the Christmas tree in the window caught fire before Christmas and she thought Santa could not possibly bring her that doll as she had hoped. She awoke Christmas morning and Santa did not disappoint. This doll is still around and owned by a friend of Idaleene. The Sanger Museum hopes one day this doll will be donated to our operation.







The University of North Texas was also present to remind students of our continued partnership in the Eagle Advantage program where the top 20% receive automatic admission. #collegebound...







6. How long have you been a resident of Sanger? The majority of my life, went from 1st grade to HS school graduation here, 25 plus years.

Why did you choose to run for City Council? It was not a thought or idea that I had, I never had a desire to run for any office. However, I was approached my multiple people with the city who stated they believed that I should run. I believe we should all do our part, and if people think I can help, the least I can do is try.

Why do you believe you are qualified for the seat of Councilman? In all truth, I'm not certain that I am qualified



for the position. But for the past few years I have been on the 4A board. I have learned much about our city and how a city works, it really is fascinating to be a part of it. I do know of the things that are coming our way as a city. There is no use in fighting it, it's coming regardless. We need our city and our city chamber to work together, which thankfully they are.

10. What would you say to residents about the current state of the streets that are in need of repair? And if you believe more money should be made available for ongoing street repair, where will this money come from? Yes, many of our streets need major overhauls, not just a temporary fix. We need input from the citizens as well. We are still operating as a small town, but one that is trying to adjust to our needs. Yes, more money should be available. 



# Six Sanger girl scouts earn Bronze Award



Six girl scouts of Sanger troop 5960 completed their Bronze Award on Saturday, April 17th at Grace Bible Church. They also passed out flyers to friends, families, and their neighborhoods. Parents assisted with the advertising by promoting the event through their social media channels and groups.

The carnival overall had 12 stations that reflected classic carnival games along with raffle tickets to earn


