

Former Sanger Mayor Nel Armstrong passes away

Mary Nell (Nel) Haynie Armstrong passed away on Tuesday, January 2, 2018 in Denton, Texas.

She was born on November 28, 1928 in Sanger, Texas to Josie and Richard Haynie but after her Mother's death in child birth she was reared by Effie and Josh Touchstone. She attended Baylor University in Waco, Texas and on August 24, 1947 married her high school sweetheart Billie Jack Armstrong. She is preceded in death by her husband Jack and infant daughter Robbie Ann. Her parents Josie and Richard Haynie, Step mother Myrtle Haynie. Foster Parents Effie and Josh Touchstone, sister Joyce Haynie Clifton, and foster sisters Mildred Touchstone Wagner and Gene Touchstone Parker.

She is survived by her children: Russell (Rusty) Hazen Armstrong and his wife Mary Catherine of Little Rock, Arkansas, Suejo Armstrong of Denton, Texas and Jack Alex Armstrong and his wife Tammy from Forestburg, Texas, 6 grandchildren and 20 great grandchildren.

Nel said most importantly she was a child who sought to serve Him in all that she did. She taught Sunday School for the First Baptist Church of Sanger for over 53 years, served as WMU president, church clerk, and church librarian for over 10 years.

In addition to working alongside her husband on their farm and ranch, Nel worked as Sanger City secretary. She and her husband opened and owned a Christian gift and book store "The Love Shop" in the Golden Triangle Mall in Denton, Sherman and Richardson Malls.

For 15 years, Nel and Jack were in the building business in Sanger and Denton area and as realtors helped in opening the Ebby Halliday Real Estate Agency in Denton. She served as Sanger Area Chamber of Commerce in the 70's and 80's.

She was overwhelmingly elected the first woman Mayor of Sanger, Texas and served in that capacity from 1984-1996. During her terms she served as President Region VIII Texas Municipal league and appointed Charter Member of the Small Cities Advisory Council, serving as Chairperson in 1992-93. She served as general contractor in building the Sanger Library and it opened in 1995. The Sanger City council appointed her as Chair of it's Home Rule Charter Commission in 1999. She served as Chairperson of Sanger Development 4B Corporation.

While member of Denton County Historical Society, Nel was instrumental in Bolivar Cemetery being the first in the state to be designated an "Official Historic Texas Cemetary". In 1999 she founded the Sanger Area Historical Society and served as Board Chairperson and President.

Nel was recognized on the Sanger High Schools Wall of Fame Award. In 1993 she was awarded The Silver Service Award for her 25 years of service to Sanger from the Chamber of Commerce and was citizen of the year in 1999. She also received the first "Community Builder Award" from Bolivar Masonic Lodge #418.

OBITUARIES Allen M. Sweeney, Sr. August 8, 1941 - December 19, 2017

Allen M. Sweenev, Sr., 76, formerly of Sanger, passed away on Tuesday, December 19, 2017 at his home in Gainesville. The son of Isaac Numa Sweeney and Lucy Ann (Allen) Sweeney, he was born on August 8, 1941 in Fort Worth, Texas.

On October 27, 1961, he married Frances Virginia Dollgener in Dallas, Texas. When they first married they owned two Coin Operated Wash-a-terias in Dallas. Allen was a faithful servant to the Lord, Jesus Christ, and was an ordained minister and pastored three churches. He was a 32nd Degree Master Mason with the Bolivar Masonic Lodge #418 and the Order of the Eastern Star Chapter 1027 in Sanger. He was also a member of the Scottish Rite. After mov-



ing to Sanger, he and Frances became members of the Pilgrim's Way Baptist Church and for the past five years, Allen served as Music Minister.

After leaving the ministry, Allen opened Sweeney's convenience store in Sanger (now Hunter's) which became known throughout the area as home of the "Sweeney Burger". Dorothy Jean Cook January 30, 1944 - December 18, 2017


Funeral services for Dorothy Jean Cook, 73, of Wills Point, formerly of Sanger, are scheduled for 11:00 a.m. Fri-

A smartphone can pinpoint exactly where we are located. We can use photos, video calls, and digital "pins" to illustrate the situation.

That's why it's vital for you to share the very important information contained in this article with your family members and friends.

Knowing how to use your phone's safety features is as essential as having a smoke detector in your home. These tools are powerful in an emergency, but they're useless if you don't know how they work.

For iOS gadgets, Apple has provided built-in emergency SOS and medical data tools that you can utilize to assist you when the unthinkable happens. Here are iPhone settings that may just save your life.

How Emergency SOS works:

Emergency SOS is a feature that will call emergency services and notify your personal emergency contacts when you need it.

In the U.S., your iPhone will dial 911 and connect you to an operator. After that call concludes, it will then send a text message to your emergency contacts (unless you choose to cancel). It will send your current location to your contacts and also update them when your location changes.

Even if you keep your iPhone's location services turned off, the phone will automatically turn it back on during Emergency SOS.

• How to activate Emergency SOS:

Previous versions of the iPhone (7 and earlier) let you start SOS mode by pressing the side button five times and dragging the bright red slider over to start the call to 911.

While this action still works, there are additional emergency options for the iPhone 8, 8 Plus, and X.

For Apple's latest phones, press and hold the side button along with one of the volume buttons until you see the Emergency SOS slider appear on the screen.

Now, you have two options. You can manually move the slider to start the call, or you can continue to hold down the buttons. If you choose this second route, the iPhone will start a countdown and then automatically call emergency services.

This is handy if you're in a situation where you can't afford to look down at your phone or if you need to dial 911 discreetly.

If your situation is resolved, you can open the status bar and choose "Stop sharing emergency location" to end the updates to your contacts. Otherwise, it will keep running for 24 hours.

You can also halt an emergency call if you accidentally pressed the buttons down. Just hit the Stop button and then choose "Stop Calling."

• How to turn off Auto Call:

If you're worried about accidentally setting off Emergency SOS, you can always disable the Auto Call feature that starts a countdown timer and then automatically dials 911 when you hold the side and volume buttons down. To do this, open Settings, select Emergency SOS and then toggle the Auto Call slider to off. Even if it's set to off, you can still use the SOS feature by dragging the SOS slider on the screen.



Time is a Key **Factor in** Investing

• Targeted goals - To accumulate resources for retirement, you need to save and invest throughout your working life. But along the way, you'll probably also have some shorter-term goals - making a down payment on a home, sending your children to college, taking a round-the-world trip, and so on. Each of these goals has a specific time limit and usually requires a specific amount of money, so you will need to choose the appropriate investments. • Risk tolerance – The

element of time also will affect your tolerance for risk. When you have many decades to go until you retire, you can afford to take more risk with your investments because you have time to overcome periods of market volatility. But when you're on the verge of retirement, you may want to lower the risk level in your portfolio. For example, you may want to begin moving away from some of your more aggressive, growth-oriented investments and move toward more income-producing vehicles that offer greater stability of principal. Keep in mind, though, that even during retirement, you'll need your portfolio to provide enough growth opportunity at least to help keep you ahead of inflation.

Thus far, we have looked at ways in which time plays a role in how you invest. But there's also an aspect of time that you may want to keep out of vour investment strategies. Specifically, you might not want to try to "time" the

market. The biggest problem with market timing is it's just too hard. You essentially have to be right twice, selling at a market top and buying at the bottom. Also, as humans, we appear to be somewhat wired to think that an activity – especially a long-running activity – will simply continue. So, when the market goes up, we seem to expect it to keep rising, and when the market drops, we think it will continue dropping. This can lead to big mistakes, such as selling after a major market drop even though that can be the time when it may be much smarter to buy because prices are low.

As we've seen, the way you interact with time can affect your investment efforts. So, think carefully about how you can put all the days, months and years on your side. Time is the one asset you can't replenish so use it wisely.

• Medical ID:

Be sure to also use its Medical ID. This is where you store information that your doctor needs to know, especially in emergencies. If you have any health ailments or you're allergic to any medications that emergency responders need to know, you can store it on your Medical ID.

You can list the medications you're currently taking. You can input your medical history, weight, height, blood type and more.

Do you ever worry about who will notify your family if you're rushed to the hospital or you're in an accident? On Medical ID, you can put in the names of your emergency contacts, their phone numbers, and special instructions to call them right away.

Here's how to use Apple's Medical ID: Tap on Medical ID >> Edit. Then, and this is really important, turn on Show When Locked. That'll ensure first responders can see your medical information even when your iPhone screen is locked.

To make an emergency call or to see your Medical ID: Wake up your phone by swiping left to right >> tap Emergency >> make an emergency call or tap Medical ID to see the medical information you have stored.

• Add emergency contacts:

To add emergency contacts, open the Health app and go to the Medical ID settings. Choose to edit and scroll down for emergency contacts. Here you can add your contacts, whether it is a spouse, a family member, or a trusted friend. Select "Done" in the upper right-hand corner to save your changes.

Don't wait to set up your Emergency SOS contacts. Do it now, so it's ready to go when you need it. Hopefully, you won't ever find yourself in a situation where you have to use Emergency SOS, but it's good to know it's available if necessary.
