School Board reviewing Superintendent applicants

The Sanger ISD School Board had a special meeting on Wednesday to review applications for Sanger ISD Superintendent and set the interview process. The board is working with TASB and will begin interviewing applicants April 22, 23 and 24. In February, the board approved TASB Executive

Search Services (ESS) as their Superintendent search firm.

On April 25 another special meeting will be held to follow up with TASB. Follow up interviews are set for April 29 and 30. On May 8, at 5 p.m., the board hopes to name a lone finalist and on May 30 at 5 p.m., vote to name the new Superintendent.

An exception is the 4B Board which either may be a resident of the City, a resident of Denton County, or reside in a place that is within 10 miles of the City's boundaries within Denton County. Terms are two-year terms and members may serve up to three (3) consecutive year terms.

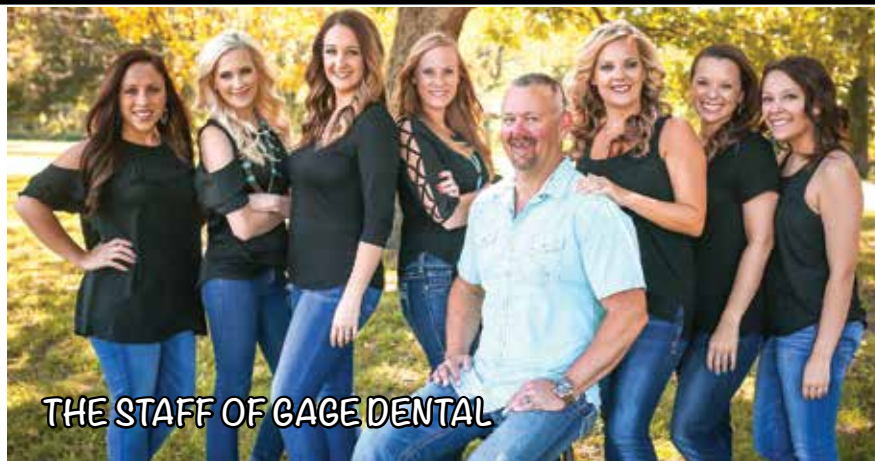

Early voting begins April 22nd for Sanger ISD School Board Place 5 race

The early voting location for the May 4, 2019 City and School General Election has been announced by Denton County for Sanger. The local location will be the Church of Christ at 400 Locust Street. Early voting will be Monday, April 22 - Saturday, April 27 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Monday and Tuesday, April 29-30 from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. A registered voter can vote at several locations around Denton County for the early voting period. See other locations at www.votedenton.com. Sanger residents can only vote at the Church of Christ in Sanger on election day.

There will not be an election for Sanger City Council. Places 1, 3 and 5 were up and the incumbents were Lee Allison (Place 1), William Boutwell (Place 3) and David Clark (Place 5).

David Clark was the only incumbent to run again. Dennis Dillion and Marissa Barrett will fill the other two places. They are both currently serving on the Planning and Zoning Commission for the City of Sanger.

Ken Scribner is not opposed for Place 4 on the Sanger ISD school board. He has been on the board for three terms from 2010-2019.

School board Place 5 was held by Chris Faircloth who resigned in November. There is a full ballot now: Lisa Cody, Mitch Hammonds, Guy Saenz, Briony Houchin and Brandon Knight.

Financial FOCUS

We're getting close to the tax-filing deadline. For many of us, this means it's that time of year when we get our biggest financial windfall – a tax refund. If you have recently received a refund, or are expecting to get one in the next few weeks, what should you do with it?

Of course, you could just spend the money on something you want, but if you'd like to maximize the financial benefits from your refund, you might want to consider other options, including the following:

Invest the money. In 2018, the average tax refund was about \$2,700. For this year, it might be somewhat lower, due to changes in the tax laws and the failure of taxpayers to adjust their withholdings in response. However, if you were to receive in the neighborhood of \$2,700, you'd be almost half-way to the annual IRA contribution limit, which, in 2019, is \$6,000. (If you're 50 or older, you can put in up to \$7,000). If you have already "maxed out" on your IRA, you could use your refund to fill in gaps you may have in other parts of your investment portfolio.

Pay insurance premiums. Let's face it – nobody really likes paying insurance premiums. Yet, if you have anyone depending on you, you will certainly need life insurance, and possibly disability insurance as well. And if you want to help protect your financial resources

later in life from threats such as an extended – and hugely expensive – stay in a nursing home, you also may want to consider long-term care insurance. Your tax refund could help pay for some of these premiums, boosting your cash flow during the months you would normally be making these payments.

Contribute to a college fund. It's never too soon to begin saving for college, which has grown increasingly expensive over the last several years. So, if you have young children, you may want to think about investing some or all of your refund into a college-savings account, such as a tax-advantaged 529 plan.

Pay off debts. You might be able to use your refund to pay down some debts – or perhaps even pay off some of your smaller ones. The lower your monthly debt load, the more money you will have available to invest for the future. Keep in mind, though, that you might not want to look at all debts in the same way. For example, put-

ting extra money toward your mortgage might help you pay it off faster, but you'll also be funding an asset – namely, your house – that might not provide you with the same liquidity as you can get from investments such as stocks and bonds.

Help build an emergency fund. By building an emergency fund containing six to 12 months' worth of living expenses, you can help yourself avoid dipping into your long-term investments to pay for large, unplanned-for bills, such as a major car repair or an expensive dental procedure. Your tax refund could help build such a fund, with the money ideally being placed in low-risk, liquid vehicles.

Clearly, you can help yourself make progress toward a number of your financial goals with your tax refund – so put it to good use.

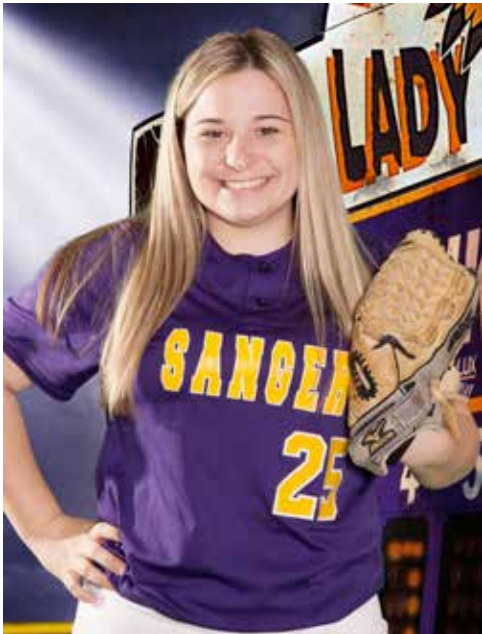

Butterfield and Chisholm Trail Elementary Named Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase Schools

Butterfield Elementary and Chisholm Trail Elementary have received a Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase Schools award for the 2018-2019 school year from the Flippen Group.

Three years ago, both campuses began an initiative to transform the campus into an emotionally safe and relationally connected place for students, staff, and parents.

After researching programs used by some of the nation's most successful schools, Sanger ISD leaders chose to join hands with the Flippen Group to bring Capturing Kids' Hearts to its campus. Teachers and staff learned processes to increase students' connectedness with both peers and adults on campus. They learned how to create a classroom environment where students are excited to enter and learn every day.

Since 1990, campuses across the country have experienced improvements with Capturing Kids' Hearts tools and processes by creating socio-emotional safety conducive to learning. Openness replaces defensiveness. Judging and feelings of being judged are replaced with acceptance and real connectedness to the school. "Discipline problems nearly non-existent," and "Academic achievement constantly improving," are common feedback following Capturing Kids' Hearts implementation.

Through the Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase Schools awards, the Flippen Group recognizes and celebrates campuses that go the extra mile each day, building an environment where students and staff feel safe and connected. Capturing Kids' Hearts campuses across the country were considered for these awards based on the following criteria: 1) nomination based on observation by Flippen Group personnel, 2) level of implementation of Capturing Kids' Hearts processes by all staff as measured by online surveys, and 3) data demonstrating that Capturing Kids' Hearts has made a significant improvement in attendance, discipline, climate/culture, or academics.

A Flippen Group team visited each nominated campus to gather additional quantitative and qualitative data, and to interview students, teachers, administrators, and parents. They used a matrix of key measurements to gather information during the campus walk-through. Finally, an additional survey was conducted to collect feedback regarding the perceived climate and culture of the campus and its conduciveness to learning. Following this visit, the selection team reviewed all accumulated data and selected the campuses to receive the Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase Schools awards.

Sanger native among Who's Who of college softball

@LATechSB Turkoly Named Finalist for National Award

RUSTON, La. – People around Louisiana Tech and Conference USA have known about Lady Techster softball outfielder Morgan Turkoly for four years. Now the nation is taking notice.

Turkoly, the reigning Conference USA Player of the Year, was named one of 10 finalists for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award® on Wednesday, joining a list of the Who's Who of the elite in college softball.

To be eligible for the award, student-athletes must be classified as NCAA Division I seniors and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

The Sanger, Texas, native was named one of 30 semifinalists in early March. She joins nine of the top Division I softball student-athletes in the list of finalists, including Taran Alvelo (Washington), Kelly Barnhill (Florida), Faith Canfield (Michigan), Meghan King (Florida State), Aubrey Leach (Tennessee), Amanda Lorenz (Florida), Riley Randolph (FGCU), Katie Reed (Kentucky) and Sydney Romero (Oklahoma).

The finalists were chosen by national media from the list of 30 candidates announced earlier this season. Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to submit votes online at the Senior CLASS Award website through May 20.

Fan votes will be combined with those of the media and Division I head coaches to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award recipient for softball will be announced prior to the 2019 NCAA Women's College World Series® in Oklahoma City, May 30 through June 5.



Turkoly is one of the top Division I softball players in the country.

Turkoly will end her LA Tech career as one of the most decorated players in program history, both athletically and academically. She is a three-time all-conference selection, a three-time all-region honoree and a three-time all-state recipient through the first three years of her collegiate career.

She was named the 2018 Conference USA Player of the Year as a junior and was the preseason player of the year selection for 2019 by the league coaches. In the past two weeks she has become the program's career leader in runs scored and walks and ranks in the top 10 in numerous other statistical categories, including batting average, on-base percentage, hits and RBI.

In the classroom, she boasts a 3.71 grade point average in accounting and earned her degree this past winter quarter. She is a three-time Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll honoree and a three-time C-USA Academic Medalist. She was named to the C-USA Softball All-Academic team the past two seasons.

The three-year team captain has spent plenty of time giving back to the community as well. Turkoly was the recipient of the C-USA Spirit of Service Award in Spring of 2018. She has been a part of 4-Paws rescue, Boys and Girls Club of Ruston and DART (Domestic Abuse Resistance Team) Pumpkin Patch. She is a Puerta Vallarta School volunteer and Puerta Vallarta Softball Clinic volunteer. She has also helped with the Super One Radio-thon Food

Drive, Christmas community service (Angel Tree through DART) and Hot Halloween Happenings with Beta Alpha Psi. She also returned to her alma mater, Sanger High School, and spoke to the student-athletes about what it takes to be successful on the college level.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their athletic platforms to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

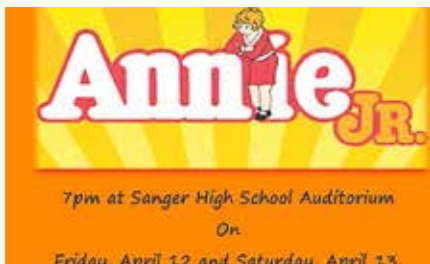

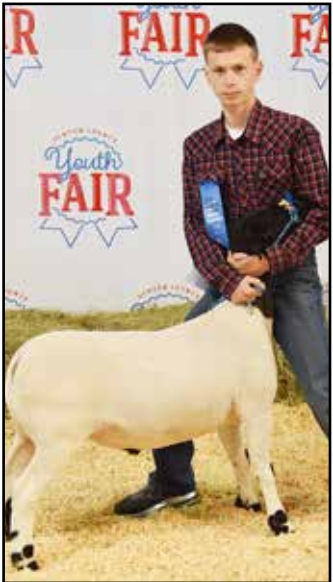
