

Thomas Muir wins Mayor's race over Joe Falls

Thomas Muir won another term as the Mayor of Sanger. He received 72.73% of the votes 2,275. He was opposed by Joe Falls who tallied 27.27%

Murphree wins Denton County Sheriff with 94% of the votes

Denton County Sheriff Tracy Murphree, of Sanger, will keep his badge for another four years after winning about 94% of the votes Tuesday.

Murphree won the Republican primary election in March 2020 against two chal-

Originally running unopposed, Murphree drew out an opponent in write-in candidate Freyja Odinsdottir, who filed to run in August. Odinsdottir worked at the Denton County Jail as a jailer from 2015 to 2019 and served in the Marine Corps.

Odinsdottir said she was disappointed not only in her results but also the voter turnout compared with the number of registered voters and the voter registration compared with the county population.

"I'm surprised, I guess, that I didn't at least win the City of Denton because I had a lot of support here," Odinsdottir said. "I thought I was going to do well, but I don't think anyone's honestly surprised."

In early voting returns, Murphree had 254,786 ballots casts for him compared with 15,932 for Odinsdottir. Murphree ended

with with 279,130 votes 94.34% with 100% of the votes counted Wednesday morning.

Murphree was first elected in 2016 with 79.84% of the votes, according to Denton County Elections Administration. That race saw a turnout of about 240,000 people.

Sanger's Stucky re-elected to Texas House District 64

Stucky, R-Sanger, was re-elected to Texas House District 64 with 54.92% of the votes 47,990 counted from all Denton County precincts Tuesday night.

Stucky, 62, will begin his third term at the state House in January following his reelection. He gained a challenger in Democrat Angela Brewer, an adjunct professor at the University of North Texas, for the state House

"First of all I'm just honored to be able to represent District 64 again for the third time," Stucky said in a phone call Tuesday night. "Overwhelmingly, it was an awesome victory, winning by more than we did even the last time. It was hundreds and hundreds ... of thousands of dollars pouring out of state from my opponent. The good people of District 64 believed in local representation from someone who's been around for 37-and-a-half years."






OBITUARIES. Gerald Terry Splawn



Fresh Inspiration for Cooking: **New Cookbooks** at the Sanger Library

As many of us have staved home more in the past seven months, many of us are cooking more as well. Sanger Public Library has added 18 new cookbooks to our collection in the past few months to provide our patrons with fresh inspiration and ideas.

Tex-Mex foods are always a favorite, and we have some exciting additions. Mexican Every Day, written by Top Chef Masters winner Rick Bayless, features quick and easy dishes that are almost all ready in 30 minutes or less. Tamales 101 by Alice Tapp, of Tamara's Tamales fame in California, has recipes of all kinds --traditional, specialty, vegan, and sweet. The Homesick Texan Lisa Fain gives us Queso!, with more than 35 varieties, including bacon, spinach, shrimp and crawfish. Salsas and Moles by Deborah Schneider has salsas for table, topping, and cooking, using a variety of chiles and ingredients such as tomatillos and avocados.

We also have Tex-Mex Diabetic Cooking by Kelley Cleary Coffeen, for some lighter versions of favorites. This book, and Fix-it and Forget-It Diabetic Cookbook by Phyllis Pellman Good, are both endorsed by the American Diabetes Association. Another new healthy book is 28 Days of Clean Eating by Sonoma Press. This book features 150 recipes focused on organic produce, humanely raised proteins, and avoiding processed foods and sugars.

The Taste of Home series of cookbooks are quite popular, and we have two new ones. Their Five Ingredient Cookbook has over 425 quick and easy recipes, while the Ultimate 9 x 13 Cookbook has 315 sheet pan recipes. Cooking an entire meal on a sheet pan means fewer dishes to


wash! We also have some new general cookbooks. Kelsey Nixon from the Cooking Channel gives us Kitchen Confidence, which includes many tips and substitutions to mix things up. The Weekday Lunch & Breakfast Cookbook focuses on quick and easy meals. The author, Mary Younkin, is the creator of BarefeetInTheKitchen.com, a website with abundant recipes. The Gourmet Dad is by Dean McDermott, a winner of Celebrity Chef Cook off on The Food Channel and a former host of Canadian Chopped. As a father of five, he knows about picky kids, so his recipes for adults almost always have substitutions or ingredients that can easily be omitted to make the dish

> To end on a sweet note, the library has four new dessert books to enjoy. Flavorful by Tish Boyle has 150 recipes focused on well-loved flavors such as chocolate, caramel and coffee. Baking Gold by Jami Curl uses three different doughs, two batters, and one dry mix, which can be a base for a variety of cookies and brownies. She also has ideas for a brownie party, cookie party, and a sprinkle party. Baking with the Brass Sisters by Marilynn and Sheila Brass (aka "The Food Flirts" from PBS) has over 125 recipes for breads, cakes, cookies, cheesecake, and even savory baked goods. Chocolate-Covered Katie by Katie Higgins is also the name of the author's popular website. Her focus is on healthy desserts and sweet breakfast items using healthier ingredients, such as tofu in a key lime pie cheesecake and adding zucchini to chocolate cupcakes. Most recipes are vegan, some are gluten free, and she gives the nutritional information on each as well.

The proposed improvements include constructing four travel lanes from FM 156 to East 6th Street and six travel lanes from East 6th Street to IH 35 in the City of Krum in Denton County. In the FM 156 to East 6th Street segment, the travel lanes would include one outside 14-foot shared-use lane and a varying 11 to 12-foot inside lane in each direction. In the East 6th Street to IH 35 segment, the travel lanes would include one outside 14-foot shared-use lane and two varying 11 to 12-foot inside lanes in each direction. The eastbound and westbound lanes would be divided with a raised median along the centerline from the BNSF Railway railroad tracks to IH 35. Sidewalks would vary from five feet wide with a three-foot berm to six-feet wide adjacent to the back of the curb. The proposed facilities ROW widths would vary from 120 feet to 300 feet.

The proposed project would, subject to final design considerations, require additional right-of-way and potentially displace one residence and one non-residential structure. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling (214) 320-6628 or by visiting the project website.

The proposed project is anticipated to impact publicly owned Eastside Park, which is a property protected under Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966 and Chapter 26 of the Parks and Wildlife Code. Eastside Park is a 35-acre park located on the south side of FM 1173 at Hopkins Road. The park currently has an existing 10-foot trail extending from FM 1173 south to Dakota Trail and southeast to Meadowcreek Drive. The park is included in the City of Krum Parks and Open Space Master Plan for additional facilities in the future. The proposed project would consist of approximately 1.5 acres (4.4 percent) of the northern edge of the park along FM 1173 to accommodate the roadway widening and reconstruct approximately 150 feet of the trail at FM 1173. TxDOT anticipates making a *de minimis* determination for this use under Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966. A Section 4(f) *de minimis* finding means that the proposed project would not adversely affect the activities, features, or attributes that qualify the park for protection under Section 4(f). Public comment on the effects of the proposed project on the activities, features, or attributes of East Side Park may be submitted as described below.

The proposed project would involve construction in wetlands. The proposed project would involve an action in a floodplain. Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are available online at the project website. These materials will also be available in hard copy form for review at the in-person option.

The virtual public hearing and in-person option will be conducted in English. Year-end Tax-Smart Moves to Consider

As 2020 draws to a close, you might wonder how you can improve your tax situation – especially in terms of your investments. Here are a few year-end ideas to consider:

Be a tax-loss harvester. In taxable investment accounts, you could sell investments that have lost value and use the losses to offset income from any capital gains you might have from selling investments that have appreciated. If you have an overall net capital loss for the year, you can deduct up to \$3.000 of that loss against other kinds of income, including your salary and interest income. Unused net capital losses can carry over to future years. This strategy works best if you're in a higher tax bracket now than you ex-

pect to be in the future. Take into account any costs associated with selling investments and be aware of the IRS' "wash sale" rules, which prohibit you from claiming the losses if you purchase a "substantially identical" security 30 days before or after the sale of a position sold at a loss. You may want to work with a financial professional to find a replacement investment to keep you invested in the market. See your tax advisor before embarking on this type of

tax-loss "harvesting." Avoid mutual funds about to pay out taxable distributions. In December, many mutual funds pay out dividends and capital gains that have accrued over the year. If you're planning to buy shares of a mutual fund in a taxable investment account, avoid purchasing funds on the verge of paying large taxable distributions. Instead, consider a more tax-efficient exchange-traded fund (ETF) or mutual funds that aren't expecting large payouts. Conversely,

if you were planning to sell a fund anyway, you could possibly reduce taxes by selling before the dividends are distributed.

Boost your tax-favorable contributions. If you haven't maxed out vour contributions to your employer's retirement plan, health savings account (HSA), and/or IRA, make additional contributions for 2020 if you can. If your employer suspended 401(k) matches this year and you can afford it, consider increasing your contribution to make up for the lost amounts. Traditional pre-tax contributions are deductible and reduce your taxable income in 2020, while Roth contributions will generally reduce your taxable income in future years, when you take withdrawals from Roth accounts.

strategies Consider in a year without RMDs. If you're older than 72 (or 70½ if you were born before July 1,1949), you typically need to take annual taxable withdrawals technically called required minimum distributions, or RMDs - from your traditional IRA or 401(k). However, you got some relief this year, as RMDs are not required because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Nonetheless, you may want to consult with your financial advisor and tax professional to determine if a distribution from a traditional/pre-tax account still makes sense. If you're in a lower tax bracket this year than you expect to be in future years, you may benefit from taking advantage of lower rates. Alternatively, if you don't need the distribution to cover expenses, you might explore if a Roth conversion makes sense.

Your key motivator, in all investment-related decisions, should be whether your choices will help you achieve your long-term goals. Within this framework, taxes do matter – so, do what you can to control
