## SISD board votes to keep start date at August 24 for in-class learning

Argyle, Aubrey and Krum will begin, as well, before the County's Sept. 8 recommendation

Local school districts have given a mixed reaction to last week's Denton County Public Health's (DCPH) recommendation that schools delay in-person classes until at least Sept. 8.

The recommendation came after state officials made clear local health authorities cannot issue a mandate closing schools to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. That power remains with school districts.

Denton and Lake Dallas ISD districts are most closely adhering to DCPH guidance, also have the latest first days of school planned.

Both districts plan to start the 2020-21 school year on Wednesday, Aug. 26, meaning students would be missing eight in-person days of class to fall in line with DCPH's recommended start

date of Tuesday, Sept. 8.

Aubrey and Argyle ISDs, both of which lean further from county recommendations, are set to start Aug. 17. Krum ISD starts back Aug. 12.

During school board meetings last week, Argyle and Krum ISDs decided they will continue ahead with a hybrid model that gives families a choice between remote or in-person learning.

Taylor Poston, a Krum ISD spokesperson, said a survey the district sent out in early July showed the families of roughly 72% of students wanted in-person classes.

She said the district sent out another form to parents last Wednesday. As of Thursday afternoon, 84.5% of respondents favored in-person classes.

Sanger ISD voted, as well, to keep

their start date at August 24 with the option of on-line and in-person classes. Sanger ISD Superintendent Dr. Tommy Hunter sent out a Commitment Survey on Tuesday to families to finalize the number of participating in-person stu-

Argyle board members made the decision following a lengthy presentation and Q&A session with Denton County Public Health Director Dr. Matt Richardson during last weeks meeting, as well as a closed session that stretched to nearly two hours long. The vote to continue ahead as planned before the county's guidance was unanimous. Most board members seemed to agree with Richardson, who holds a master's and a doctorate in public health, about the state of the pandemic in Denton County.

Board members seemed to depart from him when it came to the virus's

threat level in Argyle, despite Richardson's insistence that virus hot spots are not as trustworthy of a metric at this stage of the pandemic.

John Bitter, a board member and Argyle veterinarian, questioned Richardson about what he called "the core of the problem" with school closings — there are more factors involved than purely the

"It's a very nebulous thing, and it's very hard for anybody to ... weigh because sometimes when I hear health officials talk, it's like they're only talking about the consequences on the health side," Bitter said. "Our job is to weigh the other side, as well."

He told board members and others listening he can't provide a complete list of pros and cons. Schools boards are in an unenviable position, he said.

#### COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT MEETING COVID-19 test positivity rate decreases 12.8%, property tax appraisal protests up record high

Denton County Public Health Director Matt Richardson outlined improving COVID-19 numbers at Tuesday's Commissioners Court meeting, citing fewer cases, a decreasing positivity rate and accelerating recoveries as reasons to be cautiously optimistic about the spread of the virus.

Two weeks ago, the county reported 1.156 confirmed cases of the virus, the highest weekly total during the pandemic. Last week, however, the weekly total dropped to 851 cases. Additionally, the positivity rate for tests decreased to 12.8%, from a record-high 23.4%. Richardson said the improvement in numbers is good news but reflects only one week's worth of

The improvement came as the county performed more tests than it has since the end of May. Richardson stressed the importance of the public not loosening on efforts to contain the virus due to the lower numbers and maintaining mask usage and social dis-

"I'm imploring the public to continue this behavior," Richardson said. "Let's not quit what we're doing that could have contributed to this silver lining."

County Commissioner Hugh Coleman asked Richardson if he felt comfortable with the safeguards being taken by school districts. The public health department recommended last week that schools begin face-to-face classes no earlier than Sept. 8.

We're hoping that many parents of students take advantage of a virtual learning option to begin the school year," Richardson said. "That will allow physical distancing in the classrooms. If you have fewer kids, you can space them apart more appropriately."

Richardson said that given mask usage and distancing, a teacher or student testing positive may not require a quarantine of the entire class.

"We're going to be learning about how best to do this, and I'm confident there will be some lessons on the horizon," he said. "As we learn more about this disease, and we learn about children and gatherings, we're probably going to have to adjust on the fly.'

Commissioners also received a report Tuesday on the certified estimate of the appraisal roll for 2020. County Tax Assessor Michelle French said estimates are being used to calculate the tax rates because a number of property owners are protesting their appraised values, and the Denton Central Appraisal District hasn't processed all of the protests amid the pandemic.

French reported the properties currently under protest for 2020 are valued at a total of \$31.8 billion, up about \$30 billion from 2019's \$1.9 billion. She said the fully certified roll, which will be used to create the tax roll, will likely not be available until mid- to late September.







#### Tax relief for homeowners a priority for Denton County Commissioners Court

Tax relief for homeowners has been a priority as we continue to review our Denton County budgets each year. Not only have we kept the county's portion of property taxes low among taxing entities in Denton County, we also decreased the county's tax rate to the lowest since 1986 at \$0.225278 for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

On June 30, the Denton County Commissioners Court approved a residence homestead exemption of up to 1 percent or \$5,000, whichever is greater to all homeowners of the county. This means that the taxable value of your homestead will be lowered by these amounts, thus reducing your county property taxes. This exemption is applicable to the current year's property tax bill, which you will see this fall.

In 2019, we approved a tax limitation for properties receiving an over 65 or disabled person exemption. The Over 65 Exemption the county offers is \$55,000 and the Disabled Person Exemption is \$15,000. Homeowners can be eligible for one or the other, but not both.

The Denton Central Appraisal District, a separate entity from Denton County and not governed by Commissioners Court, is where homeowners must go to apply for any of the above exemptions. Find out more information at www.dentoncad.com or contact the appraisal district office at 940-349-3800.

#### Regional road and bridge updates



Activities expected include City of Denton water lines, storm water drainage lines and culverts; lime treatment subgrade; concrete removal; SW3P activities; barricades; general clean up.

U.S. 380/U.S. 377 - (Loop 288 to U.S. 377) -Frontier is splicing; anticipate completion by mid-July. Low bidder is Ragle Construction, Inc. with a low bid of \$21,269,536.66, at 33.15% over the engineer's estimate. There are 800 working days and 39 months of barricades. Awaiting project award and work authorization.

U.S. 380 East ¬- (U.S. 377 to Collin County line) – Utility coordination meeting held virtually on June 23, 2020.

U.S. 377 North -TNP submitted draft ICI (Indirect and Cumulative Impacts) report on June 19, 2020. Stakeholder meetings with Pilot Point and Krugerville were to be held on July 23, 2020. 





FM 428 - Project is from Loop 288 to West Sherman Drive/proposed outer loop. TxDOT has completed negotiations with HDR to initiate efforts on the FM 428 feasibility study. Awaiting execution of supplemental work authorization.

FM 1385 - Let date for project has been scheduled for June 2024. The 30% schematic was submitted to TxDOT for review on July 7, 2020. TxDOT is reviewing schematic. Virtual public meeting is tentatively scheduled for September

FM 2931 - Let date for project has been scheduled for June 2024. The 30% schematic was submitted to TxDOT for review on June 26, 2020. TxDOT District is reviewing schematic. Virtual public meeting was held on July 7, 2020. Meeting materials are posted on http://www.keepitmovingdallas.com/FM2931 and will remain available online through the comment period deadline of July 22, 2020.

FM 455 – From west of FM 2450 to east of Marion Road; the project is slated to have 100% plans ready in September 2020 with a January 2022 let date.
