Sonic rebuilding

Cranes lift HVACs and Sonic sign on Monday.

Workers were busy Monday stripping the Sonic Restaurant, getting it ready for demolition. With the widening of FM 455, Sonic is rebuilding and turning the restaurant from north and south to east and west. Sonic Corporation bought the land, where the old Chevrolet dealership was for many years, just west of the current location and will use both parcels of land for the new Sonic. They are hoping to have it completed in two to three



Carl Garrett

August 31, 1947 - August 24, 2020

Carl Leonard Garrett, a Denton and Sanger native who went on to play nine seasons in the NFL, died on August 24 at the age of 72. He was born August 31, 1947 in Denton, TX to Ava Morning Garrett and Mr. Fredrick Douglas Garrett Sr. Carl gradu-



ated from Fred Moore High School in Denton. He played collegiate at New Mexico Highland University in Las Vegas, NM. He was drafted in the third round in 1969 by the Boston Patriots AFL-NFL common draft. He rushed for 691 yards and five touchdowns on his way to being named the American Football League's rookie of the year. He was the last player to re-

ceive AFL's Rookie of the Year Award, as the AFL and NFL merged soon after. He was also a kick off and punt returner for the Patriots.

As he completed a league best five yards per carry average prior to the 1971 season, Carl was involved in a bizarre trade to the Dallas Cowboys in exchange for Duane Thomas, a dispute between Thomas and the Patriots resulted in the two players returning to their teams. While Carl had a career high in yards from scrimmage and rushing yards, in 1971 would be his last season with the now New England Patriots. The final five years, Carl spent with the Chicago Bears, the New York Jets and the Oakland Raiders. As a kick off returner and his four carries in Superbowl XI against the Minnesota Vikings helped the Raiders win. His three carries set up the first score and a touchdown in the second quarter. Hall of Fame wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff was named the MVP of the game and recalled Garrett's contributions to the Raiders that season. Garrett spent the last two seasons of his career that spanned from 1969 to 1977 with Oakland.

"Adding Carl Garrett was a big plus," Biletnikoff wrote in a first-person account of the 1977 season published on the Raiders website in 2019. "[We brought] somebody in for a specific role and he played the role well."

In the 1977 season, Carl retired. After two marriages, Carl met and married Pau-

Indians beat Clifton, home opener against Lake Worth

The Sanger Indians varsity football team got a big win last Friday against Clifton at Aledo High School 25-14. Sanger started fast, taking the opening drive and scoring on a 1-yard run by Tallyn Welborn. The touchdown was set up by a 48 yard reception from quarterback Rylan Smart to Dewey Terreault. But, the extra point attempt was blocked and ran back for 2-points for Clifton. Sanger drove right down the field again on the next offensive possession, but was kept out of the endzone on Clifton's 1-yard line. The score remained 6-2 at halftime.

Clifton came out and took a 14-6 lead in the third quarter. Midway through the last frame, Smart had a 5-yard touchdown run. That score was set up by a 30-yard reception to Zach Shepard. The 2-point conversion failed and Sanger trailed 14-12. Creed Carter had blocks; Jyneese an interception return for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter to get the lead back and Welborn added a 52-yard touchdown run for insurance.

"I was proud of our guys for playing hard in a physical ball game," said Sanger head coach Rocky Smart. "I felt that our defense forced Clifton to earn their yards, and we didn't give up any big plays while forcing three turnovers. Creed Carter's pick 6 was a big play for us in an extremely important part of the game. Offensively we moved the ball well overall, but I feel we still have lots of room to improve which is exciting. Anytime you have zero turnovers while forcing three and win the explosive play battle (over 20 yard plays) you have a great chance to win.'

Shepard, also had an interception and Jyneese Jones recovered a fumble. Linebackers Carson Stamper (19 tackles) and Carter (20 tackles) led Sanger's defense and combined for three tackles for a loss.

Lake Worth won an exciting back and forth game last week to McGregor 47-43. They run a very multiple offense, and they have some really good skill players Sanger will need to slow down. On defense they are a 3-3 and 3-2 team with their fronts while playing cover 3 and various man coverages behind their front. "The formula for winning will consist of making sure we don't give up big plays to their speed guys when we're on Defense.
