District Realignment...

SHS in new football and basketball districts

The UIL District re-alingnment was announced Thursday morning and Sanger High School was moved to two new districts (football - 4A Division I) and basketball district (and all other sports). Sanger is back in Region 2 in football in District 7 with Anna, Argyle, Celina, Melissa, Paris, Paris North Lamar for the next two football seasons.

Sanger's old football district (District

4-4A D1 Region I) is now changed to Burkburnett, Decatur, Gainesville, Mineral Wells, Springtown and Wichita Falls Hirchi.

SHS moved to 4A District 11, Region 2 in basketball and all other sports. District 11 is Anna, Aubrey, Celina, Gainesville, Melissa and Sanger.

Argyle, Bridgeport, Decatur,

Krum and Springtown will be in District 8, Region I the next two years in the basketball district.

If you want to project first round playoff opponents, Districts 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16 meet in bi-district. For SHS, in football the top four teams make the playoffs and will face District 8

Denton County burn ban back on

Denton County is under another burn ban, and it looks like this one may stick around for a while.

Fire officials say high winds, low humidity and dead vegetation have created the perfect conditions for wildfires throughout the area.

The National Weather Service in Fort Worth expects critical fire weather conditions in and around the county through Mon-

day, according to its website.

County Judge Mary

Horn signed the burn ban
into effect before Tuesday's

Commissioners Court meet-

ing, restricting all outdoor burning of combustible material, such as wood, lumber, leaves and brush. It also restricts outdoor cooking, welding, cutting-torch operations and other outdoor activity involving open flames.

Most fire agencies are preparing additional brush trucks and firefighters for the days ahead. Extra staffing also is needed to fill in for the crews battling large grass fires in rural parts of the county.

Denton County Emergency Services Director Jody Gonzalez said the

grass fires appear to be getting larger and more frequent. In these conditions, a lit cigarette or a spark from outdoor work can cause extensive damage.

The forecast shows a 20 percent chance of rain Saturday and for the middle of next week. But it's unlikely to produce enough rain to affect the burn ban, Gonzalez said.

"It would temporarily hold us off [from wildfires] if [rainfall] was an inch and a half," Gonzalez said. "But soon as the dry weather comes back ... that'll put us

right back into the danger."

The burn ban generally restricts outdoor cooking with some major exceptions. It doesn't restrict cooking with propane or natural gas in a "complete and full" enclosure. It also doesn't limit cooking with wood or charcoal in a full enclosure, as long as the area 5 feet around the enclosure is cleared of combustible material.

At least one water

source needs to be stationed in areas where workers need to use open flames, Gonzalez said.

City and School Elections

Muir to run for another term as Mayor

The filing date ends February 16, 2018 to register as a candidate in the school board and city elections. In the school board race, Places 2 and 3 are up for election on Sanger ISD school board. Place 2 is currently held by Ann Marie Afflerbach, who was appointed by the board last year, to replace Dr. Kevin Polk, who passed away. She officially filed last week and remains unopposed as of Thursday morning.

Russel CeBallos is the incumbent for Place 3. He has decided not to continue on the school board.

"I had a conversation with Sara York, who filed for Place 3 last week, and felt that it is time for a change. I feel with a competent candidate like Sara that it is the perfect time for me to step away," said CeBallos.

Sanger High School senior Jackson Sweet and Sarah Peers York are the candidates for Place 3 now.

Candidates can pick up election packets at the Sanger ISD Administration Building at 601 Elm Street from 8am-4pm. For more information, contact Lisa Cody at 940-458-7438.

Thomas Muir has filed to run for another term as City of Sanger Mayor. He did not have any opposition as of Thursday morning. City Council Place 2, held by Gary Bilyeu and Place 4 by Allen Chick are the two city council seats up for

election. Bilyeu has already signed up for another term. As of Thursday morning, there were no candidates for Place 4 and Bilyeu didn't have an opponent.

The filing date started January 17, 2018 and ends February 16, 2018 for the city races. Candidates can pick up election packets at the City of Sanger office at 502 N. Elm Street. Call 940-458-7930 for more information.





Handy things you didn't know Google Photos could do

Most people think of Google Photos like a dusty old album on the shelf. Every once in a while, you flip through those old snapshots with a friend. Remember that trip to the beach?

That was so nice. Like most Google services, Photos is overflowing with helpful features, which can manipulate, organize, and share your thousands of images. Most impressive of all, you can search through your photos in clever new ways, which shouldn't be surprising, given Google's search engine roots.

If you're not using Google Photos, there is one good reason to at least try it. How'd you like to have an unlimited backup of all your photos and videos? There is a catch. To qualify for the unlimited storage, your photos must be less than 16 megapixels. As far as videos go, Google downgrades any video shot above 1080p. Google offers pay plans that provide more storage space for higher quality files.

Here are 20 of the most exciting powers Google Photos users can wield.

- Download all of your photos: Are you trying to consolidate your photos? You can upload them from your various devices to Google Photos. Then, use Google Takeout, a simple Photos plugin. Takeout lets you download all or some of your Google data. You can select just Photos and even choose exactly which albums to include in the download. Keep in mind this could be a very large download if you have a lot of photos stored.
- Get the Google Photos iOS app: Google Photos isn't just for Android. If you are running out of space on your iPhone or iPad, here's a possible solution. Download the app for your iOS devices, and you can enjoy the same editing backup, archiving, search, and storage features on your iPad or iPhone.
- See the original photo while editing: Here's a nifty, under-the-radar feature of the Google Photos app. When you're editing a photo and playing with a filter, just touch and hold down (or click in a browser) on the image to see the original and quickly compare how the picture first looked. Lift off to see the changed version again.
- Automate backup on your Mac or PC: You probably don't even think twice about Google Photos handling images on your smartphone, but what about your Windows or Mac computer? Download Google's Backup and Sync app for Mac or PC and you can automatically back up images from your desktop or laptop.
- Watch for Google Assistant notifications: If you like surprises, keep an eye out for alerts from the Google Photos assistant feature. It will automatically create stylized photos, collages, and photo albums you might find fun. You can choose to save these automatic creations, ignore them, or delete them. You may also receive "Rediscover this day" alerts showing images from a point in the past. It can be a delightful reminder of good times from years ago.
- Scan your old photos with PhotoScan: Have photos in an album or a frame that you want to make digital? One of the easiest ways to add real photographs to your Google Photos library is to use Google Photoscan for Android and iOS. Follow the on-screen instructions to capture your pictures and then organize and access them with Photos. It's an easy way to bring vintage photographs into the modern age.
- Move photos to archive: Clear out the clutter by moving unneeded photos to your archive. Just select the three dots to access the photo-options menu and choose "Archive." Occasionally, Google will automatically suggest photos to move, which you can review and archive as you
- Un-delete photos: If you trashed a photo and now want it back, just open up the main Google Photos menu, select trash, and then choose the image or images you want to restore. Photos remain in the trash for 60 days before being permanently deleted.
- · Chromecast your photos to a TV: If you have a Chromecast hooked up to your TV, you can open up your Google Photos app on your phone, click on the "cast" icon in the corner, and share your favorite snaps on the big screen for everyone to enjoy.
- · Add a photo to a Gmail email: There's a super-simple way to add a pic from Google Photos into an email when you're using Gmail from a web browser. Look for the "Insert Photo" icon at the bottom of the compose window. It looks like a little landscape picture. Click this icon to access your Photos archive and choose which snaps to include.
- Build a photo book: As much fun as it is to look at photos on a screen, sometimes you just want to hold a real book in your hand. Use the "Photo books" feature to build and order physical books stocked with your lovely images.
- Make an animation: Ready to get moving? Select "Assistant" in Photos, choose "Animation," and then select anywhere from two to 50 photos and let Google create a fun animation from the images. This

Put a Trusted 'Quarterback' on **Your Financial Team**

On February 4, the eyes of most of the country – and much of the rest of the world - will be on Minneapolis, site of the most-watched football game in the U.S. As a fan, you can admire the way quarterbacks in the Big Game direct their teams. But as an investor, you can learn something from the big game by putting together your own team to help you achieve your financial goals – and you may find it helpful to have your own "quarterback."

Who should be on your team? Your financial strategy will involve investments, taxes and estate planning, so you will likely need a financial advisor, a tax professional and an attorney. Ideally, your financial advisor – the individual with the broadest view of your financial situation – should serve as the quarterback of this team. And, just as a quarterback on a football team must communicate clearly with his teammmates, so will your financial quarterback need to maintain consistent contact with the other team members.

Let's look at a couple of basic examples as to how this communication might

First, suppose you are self-employed and contribute to a Simplified Employee Pension (SEP) IRA. Because your contributions are made with pre-tax dollars, the more you put in, the lower your taxable income. (In 2018, the maximum amount you can contribute is \$55,000.) Your financial advisor can recommend investments you can choose from to help fund your SEP IRA. Yet you will want your

financial advisor to share all your SEP IRA information with your tax professional. When it's near tax-filing time, your tax professional can then let you and your financial advisor know how much room you still have to contribute to your SEP IRA for the year, and how much you need to add to potentially push yourself into a lower tax bracket.

Now, let's consider the connection between your financial advisor and your attorney – specifically, your attorney handling your estate planning arrangements. It's essential that you and your financial advisor provide your attorney with a list of all your financial assets -IRAs, 401(k)s, investments held in brokerage accounts, insurance policies and so on. Your attorney will need this information when preparing your important legal documents, such as your will and living trust - after all, a key part of your estate plan is who gets what. But it's imperative that you and your financial advisor convev some often-overlooked details that can make a big difference in the disposition of your estate. For example, your financial advisor might suggest that you review the beneficiary designations on vour IRA, 401(k) and life insurance policies to make sure these designations are still accurate in light of changes in your life - new spouse, new children and others. These designations are meaningful and can even supersede the instructions you might leave in your will or living trust. Consequently, it's important for you and your financial advisor to share this information with your attorney.

It can be challenging to meet all your financial objectives. But with the right team in place, and a quarterback to help lead it, you can keep moving toward those goals – and you might cut down on the "fumbles" along the way.

is especially entertaining if you have a sequence of action shots that go together.

- Create a slideshow movie: Look under the "Assistant" feature in your Google Photos app for the "Movie" option. This lets you select up to 50 photos or videos to put into a slideshow video. You can customize your creation by choosing different filters and selecting a soundtrack. Google offers a selection of fun tracks ranging from dogs barking "Blue Danube" to upbeat jazzy tunes. You can share your movie creation with friends or publish it to social media or YouTube.
- The power of search: Google applies its high-level search expertise to sorting your photos, so you can search by location or look for particular objects. For example, "camping" or "tent" should pull up images of your outdoor adventures while "Hawaii" should bring up your fabulous vacation shots.
- Locate photos using dates: If you use Photos in a web browser, then look for the subtle timeline of dates along the side. You can use this to quickly navigate to a specific period. You can also type a month or year or even a specific date into the search box to find photos.
- Find your adorable pet pictures: Google uses machine learning to visually sort out different pets. So go ahead and search your photos by "cat," "dog," or even "tabby" or "golden retriever." The system isn't perfect, but it works surprisingly well.
- Label people by name: Click on the search bar and look for the row of faces that appear in little round circles. Click on a face and you now have an option to add a name by typing it in or choosing it from your contacts. Pro tip: you can also name your pets this same way.
