#### Meet the Sanger FD #670

#### BY DONNA GREEN - Director of Marketing for the City of Sanger

I am a big fan of TV shows about First Responders such as Rescue 911, 9-1-1, and 911 Lonestar. I probably have 20 hours sitting on my DVR just waiting for me to find the time to watch. So, you can imagine how excited I was to be invited to spend the day with the 670 in Sanger.

On November 30, Lieutenant Grimes, Welborn, and Shephard, along with Firefighter/Paramedics Lewis and Pearse, spent their day teaching me about firefighter life. I was surprised to learn what they face and do daily.

Full disclosure, I have to admit that I expected the firehouse to be very close to what you see on television. However, the 670 is not equipped with a chef's kitchen, the sleeping quarters look more like military barracks than the fancy bunks on television, and when the alarm went off for a call, there was no fireman's pole for them to slide down. The firehouse has a modest kitchen, a couple of couches, a television, sleeping quarters, along with two restrooms equipped with showers. It is nothing fancy, but it is a clean and cozy home away from home for working 48-hour shifts.



The Sanger Fire Department is still relatively small. They are growing and looking ahead to the future when they have a larger full-time team and a second firehouse. For now, to be a part of the 670, you must be Firefighter and Paramedic certified. When a call comes in, it is all hands on deck. Whether you are a seasoned veteran or a day one probie, you are expected to jump in and do what is necessary.

### The best part about the job is the job. There is not just one thing that makes it great!

I got to see this team in action when our first call came in. I climbed into the back seat of the rescue vehicle and belted myself in. Lieutenant Shephard and Grimes were sitting in the front, maneuvering the vehicle like second nature. The siren whooped as Shephard drove down the center of the road, blasting the horn, expertly moving around stopped cars and through traffic lights. It was an adrenaline-charged beginning to my ride-along experience.

"We have a medical call just outside of the City," the team tells me. This team covers 129 square miles, so I wasn't sure how they measured "just outside the city." They told me it could take nearly 30 minutes to reach the areas farthest from the station.

As we arrived on the scene, the guys wasted zero time getting to the patient. I watched as one paramedic spoke with the patient giving reassurance everything would be ok.

After getting all the serious questions out of the way and moving the patient to the gurney for transport, bracing the neck as a precaution, and administering some pain meds, they began to have some lighthearted conversation, which produced a smile and eased some of the fear. Having safely secured the patient, the ambulance was off to the hospital.

After arriving back at the station, the team restocked the ambulance supplies in preparation for the next call. It seems there is always something to do at the firehouse. They are constantly cleaning something, the firehouse itself, the vehicles, or the equipment. After each call, they have a stack of paperwork to file. They record everything from start to finish. Condition of the patient, supplies used, medicine administered, etc. They monitor the calls in the surrounding cities too. Sometimes they are called to assist with an incident. Monitoring the area activity keeps them informed on each case, so they know what they are walking into

During our time back at the station, after everyone has settled down, I ask each of them, "What's the best part about this job"? Without hesitation, they all agreed that they couldn't name just one great thing. Every day is the best part. Being a firefighter is not a job; it is something you are called to do. With all the dangerous situations they find themselves in, from walking into a burning building with fire temps 500 degrees plus to tending to hurt individuals on the side of a busy highway, they all felt it was the most incredible job ever.

"Most of what modern firefighters do is respond to medical emergencies," Grimes told me. "Technology today has eliminated a lot of the fires we used to see when I first started." He went on to say to me that they get a lot of calls for brush fires. Structure fires are rarer, but they can be severe when they happen.

As the day continued, I learned more and more about their way of life. I was fortunate to see how the fire and police work together on a traffic call. I have always been told that the Fire Department and the Police Department are less than friendly to each other. That certainly is not the case in Sanger, TX. I observed nothing but respect and support from both sides.

Growing up, I always thought being a fireman had to be the coolest job ever. They are smart, quick-witted, and afraid of nothing. They fight house fires and brush fires under some terrifying conditions. They bravely go into places that most would run from, and they provide life-saving care to those in need. People line up to greet them and wave to them as they drive away.

So as an adult with several decades of life experience, how do I feel about Fireman now? It is still one of the coolest professions ever. They are true-life heroes.

### ANGER SANTA FE RAILROAD STATION EMPLOYEES

Submitted by the Sanger Area Historical Society and Museum

anger originated in 1866 as a water stop on the Gulf, Colorado, and Santa Fe Railroad for the steam engines pulling the train cars. The Chisholm Trail ran west of Bolivar with cattle herders taking their livestock to Kansas for the market, and with the railroad arrival, a side track, cattle pens, and a depot were built. Livestock owners began using the railroad for hauling the cattle to market. The town of Sanger sprang up around the railroad stop.

For many years, Fred Scheu was station agent for the newly named Santa Fe Railroad and spent two separate duties in the Sanger location. Scheu served in Sanger from 1916 to 1917 and from 1930 to 1946. He and his wife, Ida, lived at the northwest corner of Peach and 7th Streets with his children Freddie and Idaleene. Idaleene is stil living and reached the age of 98 in October 2021. She resides in Denison currently. The photo of Scheu beside the Sanger depot was taken by his daughter when she was a young girl.

Ella Shultz Hall was a "Santa Fe Railroad girl." Ella grew up in Krum and was employed at the railroad depot in Sanger performing the different duties of a railroad girl, including one of the most difficult; climbing the pole to hang the "Stop or Go" lantern to give notice to the approaching train if there was a passenger waiting to board, or the train could keep going without a stop. In the early years, the ladies didn't wear pants, but Ms. Ella convinced the station agent it would be more lady-like to wear pants because of their duties of climbing the poles. Ella Schultz Hall and Francis Flitten

Hollingsworth were two of the station ladies. Francis Flitten married a local man, Cecil Hollingsworth, and Ella married a local man, Jack Hall. Ella retired from her duties with the railroad, and they had two daughters, Connie and Jacqueline. Ella's daughter, Jacqueline Hall Campbell, provided the photo of her mother at the depot, and her daughter Connie passed away in 2003.

Ella is shown riding her bike to work. Note the cart in the background next to the railroad depot, possibly used for hauling the luggage or goods being delivered to town via the train. Those were indeed the good old days and especially in Sanger, Texas.

Sanger lost its depot building in 1985 as the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad company no longer had Sanger on its stops route. The City of Sanger was requested to move the building from the railroad platform area. The station depot was moved behind Wilson Lumber Yard until 1999, when the depot building was sold and moved to Tioga to be converted to a commercial building. The building is still

located just south of the main area of Tioga on

the west side of Highway 377.

"We knew the offense ran through [Jackson],"


Hilliard said. "And she hit some big shots down the stretch, but our goal was to make someone else beat us and down the stretch."
