

Popeyes expected to start construction in April

Sanger Crossing is a 75,465 square foot retail development and grocery-anchored shopping center that includes a 50,565-square-foot Tom Thumb grocery store, 24,900 square feet of contiguous inline retail shops, and 15 single-tenant pad sites. Whataburger has already started construction on one of the pads and Popeyes will be next. The famous Louisiana fried chicken is landing in



Sanger! Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen has filed permits to construct a brand-new, ground-up location at the northeast corner of Keith Drive and West Chapman Drive.

The \$1.5 million project will see the construction of a standard 2,622-square-foot restaurant, featuring the brand's

latest New Orleans-inspired design. Unlike a renovation, this is a full "ground-up" build, meaning the site will be developed from the dirt up to include the new building, drive-thru, and parking.

Construction is scheduled to kick off on April 1, 2026, with a projected completion date of De-

cember 31, 2026. Panda Express is anticipating breaking ground in 2026 and 7 Brew is opening next month. They are delivering FREE small drinks February 27-March 5 (25 minimum) to local businesses and organizations to give them a boost of 7 Brew energy before they officially open their doors!

May 2nd elections to be held for City Council and School Board

Bilyeu is unopposed for Mayor

Elections for the City of Sanger and the Sanger Independent School District (SISD) are set for May 2, 2026. Gary Bilyeu, who has served as a city councilman for 16 years, has filed to run for mayor and stands unopposed with the final filing day Friday, February 13. The incumbent mayor, Thomas Muir, announced in early January that he will not seek another term after more than a decade in office, having served since May 2010.

In the race for Place 4, Margie Tisdale, a special education teacher at Sanger High School, recently filed her candidacy. On the final filing day, Allen Chick, who has been a council member since 2010, also entered the race for Place 4. Meanwhile, Mark Bulger, a longtime Sanger resident, is running for Place 2 and is unopposed.

For the Sanger Independent School District, three positions are on the ballot: Place 7, currently held by Bruce Elsey; Place 6, held by Mitch Hammonds; and Place 1, held by Jarrod Roberts. Elsey and Hammonds will run without opposition, while Roberts will face Drew Hall in the contest for Place 1.

The Sanger News will feature profiles of these candidates in April, just ahead of the early voting period.





Rib & Wing Cookoff held at Uptown Rail Brewery

Uptown Rail Brewery hosted the inaugural Rib Cookoff Association Rib & Wing Cookoff contest on Saturday, February 7th. Nearly 40 competitors participated, with several local cooks making a strong showing. Notably, Dennis Jordan won first place in the spare ribs category, while Coty Alambar took home the top prize for baby back ribs.

A celebrity BBQ competitor, Johnny Trigg, was also present, setting up his "Smokin Triggers" smoker just behind the local brewery. Trigg, who hails from Alvarado, Texas, is a renowned chef on the competitive barbecue circuit.

He is a two-time Grand Champion of the Jack Daniel's World Championship Invitational and has appeared on the TLC reality television show BBQ Pitmasters. Trigg was featured in the first two seasons of TLC's BBQ Pitmasters. He was among four chefs who traveled to Kuwait to cook for U.S. troops stationed there, preparing over a hundred briskets



at each location. In 2012, he was inducted into the Barbecue Hall of Fame by the American Royal Association. He returned to BBQ Pitmasters for season 3, where he not only took first place in the turkey and pork belly competition but advanced to the finale, ultimately being crowned the overall Grand Champion and earning the title of BBQ Pitmaster.

At a young age, Gene moved with his family to Denison, Texas. He thoroughly enjoyed his childhood and had very fond memories of growing up in Denison and he continued to visit the area often until his passing. 





Your credit score matters more than you may think

Your credit score can play a surprisingly big role in your financial life. From renting an apartment to getting a cellphone plan, your credit score can open doors or close them.

Your credit score predicts how likely you are to pay bills on time. Lenders, landlords and even some employers use this number to evaluate how responsible you appear to be. A higher score signals that you're reliable with money, which can lead to lower interest rates on loans, better insurance premiums and easier access to cred-

it. Some service providers may even waive security deposits if you have a strong score.

The most common credit scoring system is the FICO score, ranging from 300 to 850. A score above 670 is considered good, while anything above 740 is very good and above 800 is exceptional. Most scoring models look at similar factors, with payment history the most important. Making payments on time accounts for 35% of your FICO score, so even one late payment can hurt you.

If you're looking to improve your score, start with the basics. Pay all your bills on time by setting up automatic payments or reminders. Keep your credit card balances low and pay them off in full when possible. Avoid applying for new credit too often, as each application can temporarily lower your score.

A Chapter 7 or Chapter 13 bankruptcy filing can drop your FICO score up to 200 points. For unpaid taxes, the IRS can report tax liens to your credit report.

Those just starting to build credit might consider applying for a secured credit card or becoming an authorized user on a family member's account. Some services will even report your rent and utili-

ties to credit bureaus, helping you establish a positive history.

Many banks also offer free credit monitoring. Review your reports regularly to catch errors and track your progress.

You can check your credit report for free once a year from each of the three major credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian and TransUnion) through annualcreditreport.com, a site they jointly operate.

Taking control of your credit score is an investment in your financial future. If you need some guidance to help you build or maintain your credit score, a financial advisor can be a great resource. After all, the habits you establish today will make borrowing easier and less expensive tomorrow, giving you more flexibility to pursue your goals.
