SISD announces Superintendent Finalist

At the Sanger ISD May 8, 2019 Special Board Meeting, Lone Finalist for the position of Sanger ISD Superintendent was announced.

After interviewing five candidates, the Board has named Dr. Tommy Hunter as the Lone Finalist for Superintendent of the Sanger Independent School District.

The District received over 90 applications for the position and after a thorough review; the board interviewed five candidates in the first round. The second round of interviews brought two candidates back to Sanger with Dr. Hunter rising to the top.

Dr. Hunter's passion for student success and best interest was a theme the board heard consistently in the interview process as well as on a site visit to Brownsboro ISD. Dr. Hunter has 24 years' experience as an educator with 11 years as Superintendent; the last three have been in Brownsboro ISD.

Dr. Hunter graduated from Gunter High School. He's worked at Tioga ISD for 13 years as a teacher, coach and campus principal and Superintendent at Walnut Bend ISD, north of Gainesville, for 4 years. He was also Superintendent at S&S Consolidated ISD for 4 years before Brownsboro.

"I have been a Superintendent at districts with 100 students to 2,800 in Walnut Bend and Brownsboro, respectively. With the exception of 3 years, my entire life and career has been in the North Texas area. My wife and I are excited about returning to our home area," Hunter said.

"I look forward to becoming a part of Sanger ISD and the community of Sanger. Sanger ISD has a rich tradition of excellence were student's success and educational opportunities are a priority for the children they serve. As the new superintendent, I will look to continue these great successes, while creating a positive, safe learning environment for both students and staff."

His philosophy of education: All teachers and administrators should provide the most comprehensive education for each student in an environment that supports student achievement. Climate and relationships are the two most important attributes to learning. Educational setting should have an environment, which allows the teacher to act as a guide, allows for student achievement, and promotes future ready skills such as collaboration, creativity,

Lisa Cody wins Place 5 School Board Election

Lisa Cody got 33% of the vote in the local election for School Board Place 5. She was one of the five candidates vying for the open spot and she won with 172 votes. A total of 516 people filled out a ballot (338 during early voting) and 178 on election day on Saturday, May 4. The low turnout can be attributed to not having an election for City Council as the three candidates Dennis Dillon, David Clake and Marissa Barrett were not opposed and Place 4 School Board candidate Ken Scribner didn't face opposition.

I have been blessed with supportive family and friends during the election and look forward to working as a team to provide the best opportunities for all students in our great district. \$2.1 million back to taxpayers thanks to United Way of Denton County's VITA

Nearly two thousand volunteer hours resulted in 11th consecutive year of growth for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program assisting Denton County low to moderate income taxpayers

United Way of Denton County announced the 11th consecutive year of return growth for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program for tax year 2018 with 1,552 returns filed with tax credits totaling \$2.1 million for hard-working Denton County taxpayers.

Seventy volunteers committed a total of 1,956

hours for training, client intake, and tax preparation to help neighbors earning no more than \$58,000 file their federal income taxes accurately and for free at nine sites located across Denton County in the following municipalities: Corinth, Denton, Lake Dallas, Lewisville, Little Elm, Pilot Point, and Sanger. The Sanger location did 84 returns, about 20 more than last year, according to Richard Muir.

"These volunteers are the backbone of VITA," said Gary Henderson, President and CEO of United Way of Denton County.

age 60 saw a 53% increase in returns filed in just two years.

"We get lots of widows coming in who for the very first time in their life have to deal with taxes by themselves," shared VITA volunteer John Hoose. "I'm just happy we're there to help them."

The VITA program, created by the IRS and implemented by United Way of Denton County, has shown steady growth since filing 28 returns for \$14,228 in refunds for the 2007 tax year.

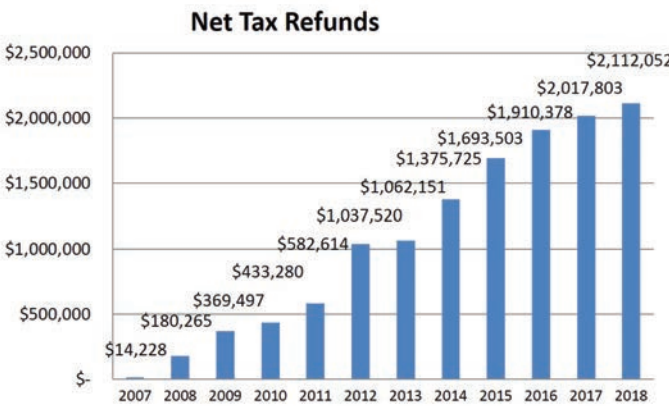



Why Should Recent Graduates Care About Retirement Planning?

If you've graduated from college in the past year or so and started your first job, you're no doubt learning a lot about establishing yourself as an adult and being responsible for your own finances. So thoughts of your retirement are probably far away. And yet you have several good reasons to invest in your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan.

First of all, by contributing to your 401(k), you can get into the habit of regular investing. And since you invest in your 401(k) through regular payroll deductions, it's an easy way to invest.

Furthermore, your 401(k) or similar plan is an excellent retirement-savings vehicle. You generally contribute pre-tax dollars to your 401(k), so the more you put in, the lower your taxable income. Plus, your earnings can grow on a tax-deferred basis. Your employer might also offer a Roth 401(k), which is funded with after-tax dollars; although you can't deduct your contributions, your

earnings can grow tax-free, provided you meet certain conditions. And with either a traditional or Roth 401(k), you generally have a wide array of investment options.

But perhaps the main reason to start investing right away in your 401(k) is that, at this point of your life, you have access to the greatest and most irreplaceable asset of all – time. The more time you have on your side, the greater the growth potential for your investments. And by starting to invest early in your plan, you can put in smaller amounts without having to play catch-up later.

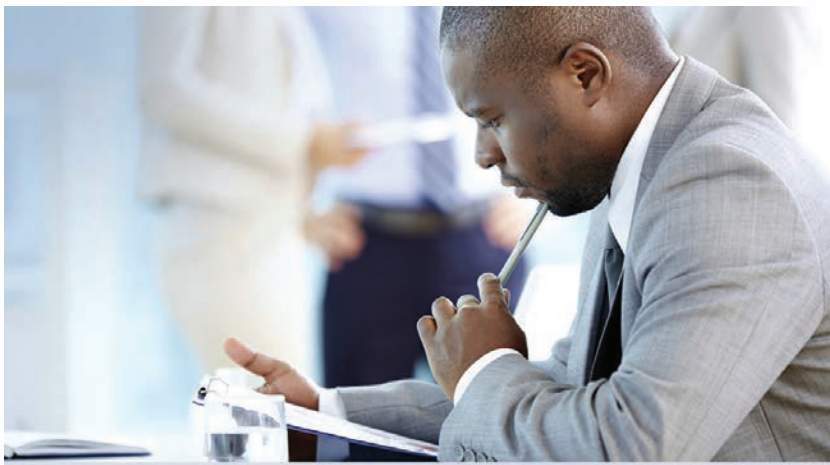
Suppose, for example, you begin investing in your 401(k) or similar plan when you're 25. For the sake of simplicity, let's say you put in \$100 a month, and you keep investing that same amount for 40 years, earning a hypothetical 7 percent rate of return. When you reach 65, you will have accumulated about \$256,000. (Your withdrawals will then be taxable, unless you chose the Roth 401(k) option.) But if you waited until you were 45 before you started investing in your 401(k), again earning that hypothetical 7 percent, you'd have to put in almost \$500 per month – about five times the monthly amount you could have invested when you were 25 – to arrive at the same \$256,000 when you turn 65.

Clearly, the expression “time is money” applies when it comes to funding your 401(k) – there's just no

benefit in waiting to contribute to your retirement plan. This isn't to say that you have a lot of disposable income, especially as you may be paying off thousands of dollars in student loans. But, as mentioned above, the money for your 401(k) is taken before you even see it, so, in a sense, you won't miss it. And you can certainly start out with small amounts, though you'll at least want to put in enough to earn your employer's matching contribution, if one is offered. As your career progresses and your salary goes up, you can steadily increase the amount you put into your 401(k) or other retirement plan.

When retirement is decades away, it can seem like more of an abstract concept than something that will one day define your reality. But, as we've seen, you have plenty of incentives to contribute to your 401(k) or similar plan – so, if you haven't already done so, get started soon.

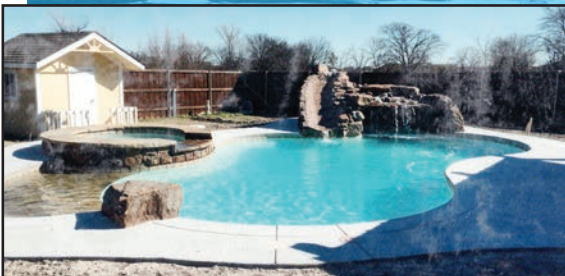

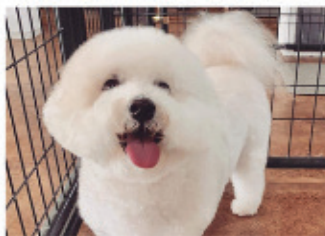

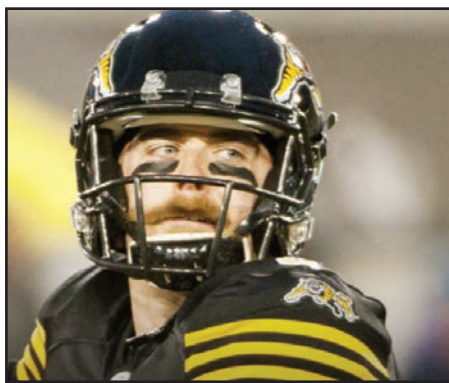

Prior to joining the Jayhawks, Tidwell spent the 2018-19 season at Texas Tech and the five years previous as the head coach at UT-Rio Grande Valley. In his five years at UTRGV, Tidwell’s teams have broken 117 program records and tied 83 others.

He became the fourth head coach to be the winningest head coach at two NCAA Division I institutions, along with Texas A&M’s Gary Blair (Texas A&M and Arkansas), Air Force’s Chris Gobrecht (Washington and Yale) and retired Jane Albright (Northern Illinois and Wisconsin).

Before his stint at UTRGV, Tidwell spent six years as the head coach at Lamar. Tidwell led the Cardinals to a 26-8 record (13-3 Southland), the second-highest win total in program history, and the 2010 NCAA Tournament after winning the Southland Conference Co-Championship and the Southland Conference Tournament Championship.

He has shown off his recruiting prowess time and again, as two of his recruiting classes have been ranked in the top 10. He’s also had six in the top 20 and 12 in the top 50. In total, Tidwell has had 21 recruiting classes in the top 100 in the nation. He is credited with helping sign, develop and coach 40 student-athletes who have gone on to play professionally, including WNBA players Sandora Irvin (Phoenix/San Antonio/Chicago), Natasha Lacy (Detroit/Tulsa/Los Angeles), Adrienne Ross (San Antonio), Danielle Crockrum (San Antonio/Utah) and 2008 Olympian Tamara Abalde.

Prior to joining Lamar, Tidwell spent eight years as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at TCU in Fort Worth. The Horned Frogs made the NCAA Tournament in each of his final seven seasons, including five trips to the second round. TCU also won the 2001 Western Athletic Conference Tournament Championship and the 2003 and 2005 Conference USA Tournament Championships.

While at Baylor, Tidwell helped to lay the seeds of a turnaround for the program by bringing in two top 25 recruiting classes as the Bears broke the .500 mark in 1996-97 for the first time since 1983-84, going 15-13. The Bears then went 20-11 in 1997-98.

Married to the former Teresa Ann Davis of Sanger, a retired special-needs teacher in the Crowley Independent School District, the couple has three sons, Marc, Marty and Michael. They have two daughter-in-law’s, Kristin and



Michele, two granddaughters, Ryan and Skylar, and three grandsons, Matthew, William, and Waylon.

Tidwell also has eight “adopted sons,” Jeremy Pevehouse, Darryl Vrazel, Dave Mishler, Sean McShane, Dr. Chad Hammett, Thomas Bilde, Blake Ivy and Yannick Denson.



Indians advance to play Crandall

When Sanger coach Steve Ford went to watch Crandall play for the first time Saturday — the Pirates’ 5-0 bi-district win over Fort Worth Western Hills — he saw a team that reminded him of the top teams the Indians competed against in District 11-4A play.

Ford said he hopes what he saw will prepare the Indians for a best-of-three series, as the teams square off in a Friday doubleheader at 4 p.m. at Plano John Paul II.

Game 3, if necessary, will be at 2 p.m. Saturday at John Paul II. “They do a lot of things that we do and showed some small ball [tendencies],” Ford said. “They remind me of everybody in our district, so it’s going to be a bloodbath.”

Ford said the emphasis in practice has been cleaning up little things, and the players have responded well to the extended season while bringing plenty of energy.

Going from one-game matchups in the first round to a series this week will put pressure on both Sanger’s and Crandall’s rotations, but Ford said his guys are up for the test on the mound and at the plate.

Trent White, Hagen Coin and Erik Lee pitched in Sanger’s first-round win over Dallas Pinkston and combined to allow just one hit in seven shutout innings. Cade Hamilton was the leader at the plate, going 2-for-2 with a home run, triple and two RBIs.

“We’re going to have to piece things together if it goes three games, but we’ve done it before,” Ford said. “Our arms have been great all year, though. It’s been our defense and our hitting that have let us down sometimes, but pitching has not been the issue, so we match up well pitching-wise.”

Sanger had to wait an extra day when Friday’s bi-district playoff game was delayed, because of all the rain last week. Sanger was originally going to host the one-game matchup against Dallas Pinkston, but moved to a turf field at Bowie High School on Saturday evening. Sanger defeated Pinkston 3-0 as three pitchers combined to throw a shutout. Erik Ly induced a groundout to finish off the game.

The pitching was strong on both sides. Sanger pitchers struck out five, while Pinkston sat down seven.

Sanger got things started in the second inning, scoring one run when Zach Shepard had an RBI single.

Trent White pitched the Indians to victory. He went five innings, allowing zero runs on one hit, striking out five and walking one. Hagen Coin and Ly entered the game out of the bullpen and helped to close out the game in relief. Ly recorded the last three outs to earn the save for Sanger.

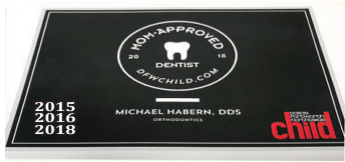

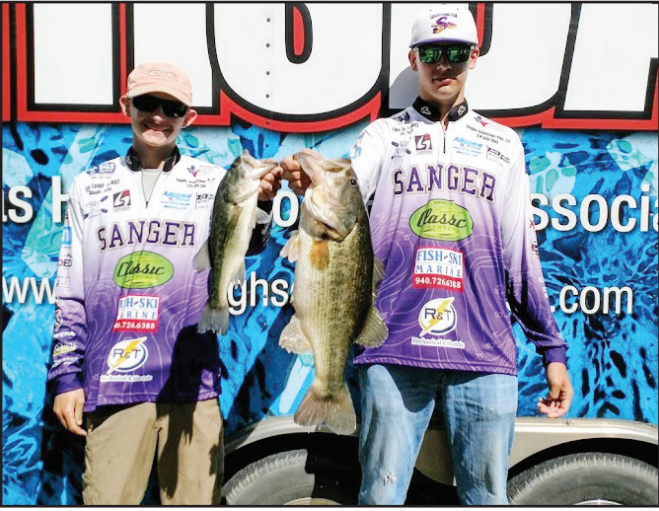

SHS fishing headed to state championship



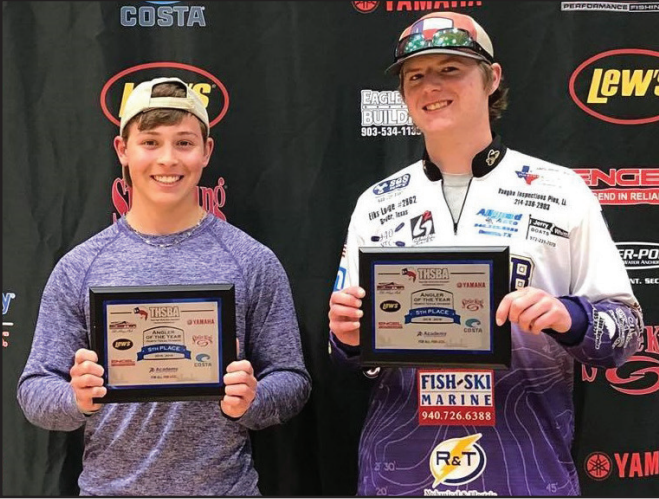
The fish that got Ezra Walden and Ryan Penton to state.

communication, and critical thinking.

“Being an administrator for the past sixteen years, I have come to realize just how important a positive educational climate can impact a child and a school district. I believe it is important that every staff member makes it a point to build relationships with students,” stated Hunter.

Cell Phone Call Scam Warning

No, Sierra Leone is not a person. Several people from Sanger have posted on facebook they have received these calls and thousands of people across the country are reportedly receiving calls from the African country, some caller identifications read “United States.”

The Federal Communications Commission says scam robocalls are targeting specific area codes in bursts, often calling multiple times in the middle of the night.

The FCC advises not calling back, since the scammers are likely trying to prompt you to call the number back, often resulting in per minute toll charges.

The calls are mostly coming from “222” and “232” area codes which are from the West African nations Mauritania and Sierra Leone.

The FCC is referring to the call as a “One Ring” scam, which happens when a robocaller calls a number and hangs up after a ring or two. They may call repeatedly, hoping you call back and run up a toll

that mostly is paid to the scammer.

Police also say to not answer or call the number back. They advise you to screen your calls.

The FCC released the following tips:

- Do not call back numbers you do not recognize, especially those appearing to originate overseas.
- File a complaint with the FCC if you received these calls.
- If you never make international calls, consider talking to your phone company about blocking outbound international calls to prevent accidental toll calls.
- Check your phone bill for charges you don’t recognize.
- “We have taken steps to detect and block these calls to and from our network. Customers should not answer or return calls from numbers they do not recognize.”
- AT&T advises their customers to download the free mobile app AT&T Call Protect, which will automatically block spam calls and will alert you when you received a spam call.
