Workshop to be held on Noise Barrier on I-35 **Widening and Reconstruction Project in Sanger**

In December 2018, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) conducted a traffic noise analysis in Sanger as part of the environmental assessment for improvements to I-35 in Denton and Cooke Counties. As a result of this analysis, TxDOT is proposing to construct one noise barrier along the northbound frontage road of I-35 for residences along Carolyn Drive, Allen Drive, and Stephen Drive. However, in accordance with TxDOT's Guidelines for Analysis and Abatement of Highway Traffic Noise, the proposed noise barrier cannot be constructed without the approval, by simply majority vote, of the owners of property adjacent to the proposed barrier. The opportunity to vote, for or against the proposed noise barrier, is limited to the owners of property right next to it, because they would be most affected by the noise associated with highway traffic, as well as presence/appearance of the noise barrier.

TxDOT will host a workshop for Tuesday, October 29, 2019 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at Butterfield Elementary School at 291 Indian Lane in Sanger. A formal presentation will be made at 6:30 p.m.

The purpose of the workshop is to provide the owners of the property affected with sufficient information to make and informed decision about it. The agenda for the workshop will include ample opportunity for all attendees to discuss all aspects of the proposed barrier. A brochure entitled "Building Barriers to Traffic Noise" was included to the owners adjacent to it and they are encouraged to review the brochure prior to the workshop. At the conclusion of the workshop, all owners will be asked to vote for or against. The final decision regarding construction and design of the proposed noise barrier will be based on the outcome of the

The Sanger Crisis Center and Bargain and kind to the volunteers. Depot is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization that has been in existence for over 30 years. Their mission is to assist citizens of Sanger in need, by providing food, clothing and monetary help for medications, utilities, rent, and gasoline for Dr.'s appointments. They do operate as a non-profit and depend on the generosity of the citizens of Sanger for donations.

They are assisted by nine volunteers that work countless hours in keeping the doors open. They work different days throughout the week from 12:00-4:00 p.m. So when it's close to 4 p.m., they are ready to go home to their families. With that being said, they actually stop taking donations and preparing food boxes at 3:45 p.m. (no exceptions). This is an ongoing job and the volunteers could stay there until midnight and still not finish what needs to be done. So please be patient

This is just an example of what might be a normal week at the Crisis Center. They have approximately 75 shoppers, 10 families needing food or clothes, 4 needing financial assistance and 25 knocks at the back door dropping donations. In the month of July, they assisted 32 households (100 individuals) with food, 5 households (11 individuals) with clothing, paid medications for 3 individuals, and 8 households received financial assistance which totaled \$1850. This is every week.

"We are so blessed to be able to do this for the Sanger community. But we would not be able to help as many citizens as we do now if it wasn't for your donations and generous contributions. So thank you again Sanger citizens for your continued support."

Consider Some Year-end Investment Tax Moves

It may be hard to believe, but we're getting close to wrapping up 2019. And if you have a year-end to-do list, here's one more item you might want to add: Lower your investment-related taxes. To help meet this goal, consider these moves you could make before year-end:

Increase your 401(k) contributions. If your employer allows it, add some money to your 401(k) before the year is out. (You can put up to \$19,000 in your 401(k) or similar plan for 2019, or \$25,000 if you're 50 or older.) If you fund your 401(k) with pre-tax dollars, the more you put in, the lower your taxable income. After-tax contributions, such as those for a Roth 401(k), won't result in tax savings for 2019 (but should reduce taxes in future years).

Add to your IRA. You've got until the April tax filing deadline to contribute to your IRA for 2019, but why wait until the last minute? You can put up to \$6,000 in your IRA

for the year, or \$7,000 if you're 50 or older. With a traditional IRA, your contributions may be deductible, depending on your income; with a Roth IRA, contributions aren't deductible, but your earnings can grow taxfree, provided you meet certain

conditions.

Donate some investments. Recent tax law changes have resulted in far fewer people itemizing their deductions. However, if itemizing still makes sense in your situation, you might want to consider donating an investment that has gained value since you purchased it to one of the charitable groups you support. You will generally be able to deduct the fair market value of the investment, and you can avoid paying capital gains taxes on the appreciation.

Consider selling investments to realize capital losses. You may have taxable capital gains, either from selling investments that have increased in value or simply from owning mutual funds (mutual fund managers constantly buy and individual investments within the funds). These capital gains could increase the amount of taxes you owe. If vou own some investments that have lost value since you purchased them, selling them would generate capital losses that could be used to offset capital gains. Further, if you have more losses than gains, you can

use up to \$3,000 of your losses to offset ordinary income. Keep in mind that selling

an investment may change the allocation and performance of your portfolio. Also, just because an investment is down in value is not necessarily a reason to sell. And once you sell an investment to generate a capital loss, you need to wait at least 31 days to repurchase it to avoid incurring what's known as a "wash sale." Your financial professional can help you determine if selling any investments makes sense for your situation.

Before making any of these moves, you'll also want to consult with your tax professional. And remember that while taxes are a consideration, they should not necessarily drive your investment decisions. When investing, you need to build a portfolio that's appropriate for your risk tolerance and time horizon and that can help you achieve your goals, such as a comfortable retirement.

Still, if you can make some tax-smart investment moves before the year is out, you may well reap the benefits next April.







Argyle (5-0, 1-0 district) outgained Sanger 560-151. Bo Hogeboom threw for 305 yards and five touchdowns, giving him 69 career touchdowns. Argyle has now won 41

straight regular season games dating back 2015.

Hogeboom, a Houston commit for baseball, completed touchdown strikes of 67, 7, 53, 33 and 24 respectively.

Argyle had a kickoff return right before halftime and also added a 79-yard punt return.

Regional road and bridge updates

FM 720 North - The contractor is working on lime subgrade, placing asphalt, tying steel for southbound lanes from Martop to U.S. 380 and barricades. The contractor will continue to place concrete for inlet tops and sidewalks on southbound lanes. The project is on track for March 2020 completion.

U.S. 380 East – (Loop 288 to U.S. 377) The 95% plans were completed and submitted for review on May 20, 2019. (U.S. 377 to county line) Consultant completed work on 95 percent plans and submitted for review on July 26, 2019. Utilities are working on design.

U.S. 377 North -Tx-DOT provided 30 percent schematic comments on

Aug. 19. Comments are being addressed and work is underway on 60 percent schematic. Public meeting will be scheduled to coincide with 60 percent schematic delivery in spring 2020.

U.S. 380 Feasibility Study – Following public meetings in January; a second public meeting is tentatively scheduled for November 2019.

FM 428 – Project is from east Windsor Drive to West Sherman Drive/proposed outer loop. TxDOT to initiate feasibility study. Anticipate selection of firm by end of 2019.

FM 1385 - Work authorization for schematic and environmental documentation has been executed Kick-off meeting tentatively scheduled for Oct. 8.

FM 2931 - Work authorization for schematic and environmental documentation has been executed. Pending survey and SUE files, expected October and November respectively. Due to change in project managers at onset, TxDOT likely to schedule a second kick-off meeting.

FM 455 - From west of FM 2450 to east of Marion Road: contractor submitted plans to TxDOT for utility relocations on Aug. 20 with the first utility meeting held on Sept. 19. The contractor is finalizing traffic control plans for the corridor and will submit for TxDOT review ahead of 95 percent plan set expected in January 2020.

FM 455 at I-35 - Contractor submitted plans to TxDOT for utility relocations on Aug. 20 with the first utility meeting held on Sept. 19. The contractor is finalizing traffic control plans for the corridor and will submit for TxDOT review ahead of 95 percent plan set expected in January 2020. Funding was approved by the Texas Transportation Commission on Aug. 29.

I-35 North – Environmental approval is anticipated in October 2019 for the estimated \$546.5 million project from U.S. 380 to 0.7 miles north of FM 3002. The project received \$546.5 million in CAT 12 funding. Funding was approved by the Texas Transportation Commission on Aug. 29.

I-35E/Mayhill – This \$53.4 million project to reconstruct the interchange at Mayhill and I-35E is projected to begin in late 2020.

The contractor finalized 60 percent design and submitted to TxDOT for review; anticipate receipt of survey on northbound frontage road in October 2019. First utility coordination meeting was held on Sept. 19.

I-35/35E/35W Merge -TxDOT and consultant are working on bridge layouts for approval from both the district and bridge division in Austin prior to 30 percent plans. The project received \$319.3 million in CAT 12 funding, which was approved by the Texas Transportation Commission on Aug. 29.

I-35E/Loop 288/Brinker/Mayhill – Anticipate the opening of the Brinker exchange soon, dependent upon signal installation. Asphalt paving on southbound main lanes, Brinker, Loop 288; concrete flat work; and constructing center median barrier are activities expected in October.

graphic and to discuss project schedule. Follow-up meeting will be scheduled after NCT-COG meets internally. Town of Prosper working toward designing segments of Fishtrap Road within town limits ahead of potential funding partnership with COG.

Mayhill Road - From north of Quail Creek Road to U.S. 380, paving operations are underway. Currently identifying feasibility of adding McKinney intersection to Mayhill project by change order. Signal equipment is being secured for installation in September or October. Mayhill, followed by Mills, will be the order of start of installations. Driveway designs constructability review and right of entry identification and acquisition. On segment from N. Quail Creek to Colorado, project will be bid as separate job. Design underway for project, which will include bridge over DCTA and regional pond.

Dallas North Tollway, Extension 4B –NTTA is working to obtain rights of entry to complete survey. Contractor completed 90 percent plans and submitted to the county for review on Sept. 5. Construction is expected to begin in first quarter 2020 and finish by first quarter 2022.

Lake Sharon Extension - The city has been working with the contractor and bond companies and anticipates the execution of construction documents by end of September 2019, allowing construction completion by late spring 2020.

Sam Bass Road - From FM 455 to approximately 500 feet north of Nance Road, this estimated \$3.5 million project will rebuild the road as a two-lane rural road and realign the intersection with FM 455. Bid documents were submitted to the county with bids expected to open on Oct. 3. Utility coordination efforts are underway.

Shady Shores Road -TxDOT has drafted funding agreement. City of Lake Dallas has executed ICA to obligate 50 percent of funding for engineering with an agreement to be placed on Commissioners Court agenda for consideration. Town of Shady Shores has executed ICA to obligate 50 percent of funding for engineering. Commissioners Court approved the agree-
