#### V. Wayne Ward


October 2, 1950 - February 25, 2022


For over thirty years, Wayne helped hundreds of families across north Texas in his role as a Family Law attorney; he man-



If you're a single filer...If your "combined" income is between \$25,000 and \$34,000, you may have to pay income tax on up to 50 percent of your Social Security benefits. ("Combined" income includes your adjusted gross income, non-taxable interest, and one-half of your annual Social Security benefits.) If your combined income is more than \$34,000, up to 85 percent of your benefits may be taxable.

These numbers might seem high, but they don't mean you'll lose 50 percent, or 85 percent, of your benefits – they are just the percentages of benefits you may be taxed on, at your personal income tax


To help avoid a big tax bill or an underpayment penalty, you can file Form W-4V with the Social Security Administration and request to have 7, 10, 12 or 22 percent of your monthly benefit withheld. Your tax advisor can help you choose the withholding percentage that's appropriate for your situation.

The amount of taxes you may need to pay will also depend on when you start taking Social Security. The earlier you take benefits, the smaller your monthly checks, and the smaller the taxes. But taxes should not be a key issue in deciding when you need to begin collecting your payments. Rather, you should consider other factors, such as your anticipated life expectancy, your employment situation, your spending needs and the benefits for your

Here's something else to keep in mind: Because Social Security taxes are based on your overall income, as described above, the amount of money more than \$44,000, up to you withdraw during re-85 percent of your benefits tirement, and where that money comes from, can also affect your tax situation. For example, withdrawals from a traditional IRA are taxable and will increase your adjusted gross income, but withdrawals from a Roth IRA will be tax-free, provided you've had your account at least five years and you're over 59 -1/2, so this money won't enter into your taxable income calculations and it won't increase the tax you owe on your Social Security benefits. Similarly, withdrawals from health savings accounts (HSAs) used for qualified health expenses also won't count toward vour taxable income.





FM 455

Quality Excavation continues to work on the relocations and replacement of water and sewer lines as part of the FM 455 project. any publications, including the Webster Dictionary, The Bible, and endless religious sites, define Servant Heart as the following A servant's heart means to have a mindset or a desire to selflessly and sacrificially serve others, regardless of your feelings towards them or what it may cost you. John Henderson, Superintendent, Public Works Streets Division, is the perfect example of someone who gives of himself with a servant heart mentality.

John says that he was blessed to be raised by his mother. As a single and only parent, she filled the roles of Mother, Father, Teacher, Advisor, and even Coach. It was a different time when John grew up, times were hard, and money was short. Being the oldest child, John, beginning when he was about 11 years of age, took on many jobs after school to help make ends meet. When he speaks of his childhood, you can feel his love for his mother and his extended family. John never felt like working to help his mom pay the bills or watching his brother and sister while his mom was at work, helping with their homework, and the household chores were a burden. He is proud of his mother, and he was honored to help give back to her all that she gave to him and his siblings.

Henderson is the 5th generation of his family born and raised here in Sanger. He was able to qualify for the regionals each year in the 2 miles and 800 races. He

After graduation, Henderson attempted to go to college while also working. He was able to attend for one semester when his vehicle broke down. Not having reliable transportation, Henderson decided he would forego college and find work that he could be proud of that would allow him the opportunity to learn and grow. From a long line of City employees, Henderson had always wanted to serve the City. He decided to approach John Coker III, the mayor of Sanger at the time, and ask him fo a job. Having known John's family history working with the City, Coker told him to apply. Thus began Henderson's career working for the City of Sanger.

Our longest-serving City employee, Henderson, has been with Sanger for 28 years. He has never regretted his decision, and he says the City has always been one of his biggest supporters Over the last 28 years, he has worked hard, learned a lot, and has advanced to his current position as Superintendent of



Public Works, Streets Department.

John was always seeking ways to give back to the City of Sanger, who he felt had given so much to him. So, when he turned 21 years old, finally old erough to volunteer with the Fire Department, he went in and signed up to offer his services. Today he still giving heart doesn't stop there. He remembers seeing this cute girl at a store and later meeting her at the park. From the moment he first met her, he fell in love. They have raised three boys and one girl. John is proud to say that they are all very successful, and they all live in

In closing our conversation, John again said that he owed all of his success to his mother for her unwavering support and guidance and to the City of Sanger, who took a chance on him all those years ago. Additionally, he is thankful for the residents of Sanger. Living here his entire life affords him to know many of our residents. He noted that this community has always been there in support of its own over the years. He considers the residents of Sanger, an extension of his family.

With having so many years with the City, I asked John if he had any thoughts on retirement. He told me that he still feels he has much to give back to the City. He joked that he was afraid to slow down; it might kill him. So, for the foreseeable future, John plans to remain a familiar face. He enjoys sharing his knowledge with our new employees, and he still loves the Fire Department.

What is the City ordinance around having goats withing the city limits?

The keeping of goats is prohibited in all zoning districts except where the requirements of a farm are met and further that the pen, corral, fences or similar enclosures are not closer than fifteen (15) feet to any adjacent property line and one hundred (100) feet to any building or structure used for sleeping, dining or living other than the living quarters of the owner or keeper, excluding fencing of pasture or grazing land, and shall be kept in a sanitary condition, and shall also be kept in such a manner as will be reasonably calculated not to become he public







Varsity and JV Track & Field teams finished in second place overall at last week's Sanger Invitational. The spot was secured in large part by their 17 first and second place finishes on March 3rd, 2022.

Leading the way was a spectacular team victory in the JV 1600-meter finals where eight of the top ten spots were taken by Sanger students. The eight Sanger spots were as follows: Jose Rojas (1), Cole Daniels (2), Braden Barnes (3), Cade Knavel (4), Kaden Spoon (5), Sam Musgrave (7), Cade Gruber (8), and Andres Nunez (9).

In the Varsity events, Sanger finished second on both the 4x100- and 4x200-meter relays. The relay team consisted of Kollin Shumate, Steven Bush, Kyle Watts (100-m), Colby Lewis (100m), Austin Shackelford (200-m),

and Logan Lewis (200-m). In addition, Sanger Varsity took the top spot in four events. Colby Lewis won the 200-meter finals with a time of 23.33 seconds and Omar Cruz won the 1600-meter final in 4 minutes and 43 seconds. Rylan Smart secured the discus competition and Steven Bush the triple jump.

The JV team went on to impress with four more number-one spots in addition to the aforementioned 1600-meter race. Braden Barnes won the 3200-meter final with Cole Daniells and Cade Knavel right behind him, all three finishing under the 12-minute mark. Lance Stone and Rosston Knox came in first and third respectively in the shot put finals. Phawensky Cockrell leaped to the top of both the long jump and triple jump finals.

Other top spot finishes that helped secure Sanger's Varsity 2nd place finish included Colby Lewis and Steven Bush finishing second and third respectively in the 100-meter race, Omar Cruz's second place finish in the 800-meter final, Khaedyn Lawson grabbing third place in the 1600, Christian Cortez taking third in the 3200-meter final, and Rylan Smart with second place in the shot put. Alex Limon of the JV team rounds out the top finishers with second place in the 800-meter competition.

Placing second overall is no as a team. Several Sanger students finished in notable positions to secure a successful invitational.





This application was submitted to the TCEQ on January 19, 2022. The executive director has completed the administrative and technical reviews of the application and determined that the application meets all of the requirements of a standard permit authorized by 30 TAC § 116.611, which would establish the conditions under which the plant must operate. The executive director has made a preliminary decision to issue the registration because it meets all applicable rules. The application, executive director's preliminary decision, and standard permit will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Dallas/Fort Worth regional office, and the Sanger Public Library, 501 Bolivar Street, Sanger, Denton County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review at the TCEQ Dallas/Fort Worth Regional Office, 2309 Gravel Drive, Fort Worth, Texas. Public Comment/Public Meeting. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting. See Contacts section. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments or meeting requests is 30 days after newspaper notice is published. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to consider in the permit process.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing. If a public meeting is held, the deadline to submit public comments is extended to the end of the public meeting.

Contested Case Hearing. You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. To request a hearing, a person must actually reside in a permanent residence within 440 yards of the proposed plant. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and registration number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all

disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests which the group or association seeks to protect must be identified. You may submit your proposed adjustments to the application which would satisfy your concerns. See Contacts section.

TCEQ Action. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. The executive director's decision on the application, and any response to comments, will be mailed to all persons on the mailing list. If no timely contested case hearing requests are received, or if all hearing requests are withdrawn, the executive director may issue final approval of the application. If all timely hearing requests are not withdrawn, the executive director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and requests to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled commission meeting. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material air quality concerns submitted during the comment period. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.






