## Sanger Police Department suspends pro-active yellow card program

The Sanger Police Department created a new program to help stop an uptick in vehicle burglaries in the Denton County city. The program lasted four days.

In a letter to the city's community Monday, Sanger Police Chief Waylan Rhodes offered his apologies to anyone who was upset about the department's "yellow card" program.

The program was announced by police on Thursday, March 3, in a Facebook post. Police said officers would be placing yellow cards on vehicle windshields to let the owners know if their vehicles were vulnerable to a burglary.

The department also showed a picture of what the yellow cards would look like. The notice would let residents know if their vehicle was unlocked or had valuable items in plain sight.

The program, however, was quickly met with pushback by the community, with claims the department was violating residents' privacy and that the cards would actually give burglars an advantage.

"Sooo, criminals now just have to look for yellow tags on cars to know which ones are unlocked and which ones have valuables in plain sight?" one person said in Sanger PD's Facebook post.

"I understand your theory here but it's gonna be a hard no for me. Please don't touch any of my cars for any reason," another commented. There were 81 comments on the yellow card post and nearly 200 comments after the letter from the Po-

lice Chief. Not all the comments were negative, many citizens appreciated the effort from the Sanger Police Department. "Please keep it going Chief! I come from a town where the police are reactive and not proactive! Please keep this going! The citizens will appreciate it!!"

On Monday, the Police Chief responded to the community.

"First and foremost, there was never any intent to upset anyone and/or violate anyone's trust. Anyone that truly felt that way please accept my apology," Chief Rhodes said.

Rhodes said the idea of the program came after the department saw one weekend where 11 cars were burglarized. He said there wasn't any forced entry into the vehicles, either.

He added that officers would have done an "outside visual inspection" of vehicles to check the boxes on the yellow cards. Being a victim of stolen property e.g. iPad, credit cards, driver's license can give someone access to your personal information, causing even more problems and inconveniences.



"My effort was simply to be creative/proactive..." Rhodes said. "The last thing I want is for the citizens of this community to not trust their police officers."

The chief went on to say that the program would be suspended. Whether you agree or not with the yellow card program, you should appreciate the idea of combating this kind of criminal activity. This brought a lot of attention about people leaving their vehicles unlocked.

Chief Rhodes added, "I still would like to remind everyone to lock your vehicles, remove items of value or hide items of value from plain sight."

### Sanger Police Department

The Sanger Police Department provides a pro-active program to combat criminal activity, particularly burglary and theft from vehicles. You are receiving this courtesy card either to congratulate you or to notify you about concerns regarding your vehicle. Last night, an officer checked your vehicle and found the following:

☐ **Congratulations!** Your vehicle was found to be locked; no valuables or keys were visible upon inspection. Great job!

#### The following items of concern were found:

☐ Your vehicle was found to be unlocked. This permits easy access to all areas of your vehicle and the items inside. (Please remember to always LOCK your vehicle, even if you only plan to be away temporarily).


☐ Items of value were observed in plain view. This encourages criminals to steal your belongings. (Always remove items of value, or HIDE them out of plain view.)

☐ Keys were discovered inside your vehicle. This makes it easy to steal the vehicle or gain entry to your home if a house key is included. (ALWAYS TAKE your Keys.)

Always remember to:

1. **LOCK** your car, 2. **HIDE** your valuables, 3. **TAKE** your keys.

### V. Wayne Ward

October 2, 1950 - February 25, 2022

V. Wayne Ward loved his family, helping others, and baseball; at 71, he passed away at his home in Keller on Friday, February 25, 2022.

The son of Virgil and Louella (McCollum) Ward, Wayne was born in Denton, Texas on October 2, 1950. He graduated as salutatorian of Sanger High School's 32-member class of 1969 and went on to further his education at North Texas State University, where he obtained a Bachelor of Arts in history, and then at Southern Methodist University, where he obtained both a Juris Doctor and Master of Business Administration.

For over thirty years, Wayne helped hundreds of families across north Texas in his role as a Family Law attorney; he managed his own practice based at the historic Trinity Plantation Building in downtown Fort Worth. Throughout his career, Wayne's kindness and integrity earned him the respect and esteem of his colleagues, as well as numerous professional accolades, including the President's Award of Outstanding Achievement from the Tarrant County Bar Association and the Eva Barnes Award from the Tarrant County Family Law Bar Association. He was also awarded the highest rating given—AV Preeminent—by Martindale-Hubbell for Family Law attorneys; the Fort Worth Business Press cited Wayne as an Attorney of Excellence in Family Law; and Wayne was named to the "Texas Super Lawyers" list for the years 2003-2006 and 2009-2018, which is awarded by Thomson Reuters Lawyer rating services, and published in Texas Monthly magazine.

An outstanding contributor to his local legal community, Wayne was a member and former president of the Tarrant County Bar Association and former president of the Tarrant County Family Bar Association, where he also served on the Board of Directors for more than 20 years. He earned the Texas Bar Foundation Life Fellow and Fellow of the College of the State Bar of Texas. Wayne shared his passion for helping others through legal advocacy in his role as adjunct professor at Texas Woman's University as well as other ad hoc lectures on all aspects of family law.

As a proud and loving father, grandfather, and brother, Wayne cherished time with family. He was



overjoyed to welcome two grandsons in recent years and anoint himself "BubbaPapi", a role in which he could spoil them rotten. Decades earlier, Wayne spent Saturdays watching—and sometimes even coaching—his sons' youth basketball, soccer, and baseball games, followed by multi-generational family gatherings on Sundays with him at the center. He also supported his sons at high school marching and concert band events, traveling all over Texas and beyond to cheer them on. Wayne actively volunteered in his sons' communities, including in both the Hurst-Euless-Bedford and Keller public school systems and with the Boy Scouts of America; he also volunteered in various roles in the Ward family church communities, including at First United Methodist of Hurst and Keller United Methodist. Wayne was a loyal supporter of the Texas Rangers and Dallas Mavericks, and, in honor of his sons, he cheered on the Texas Longhorns, Oklahoma Sooners, and Texas A&M Aggies.

Wayne was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by three sons, Jake Ward of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Wes Ward and his wife Sarah of Dallas, Texas; and Will Ward of Keller, Texas; his sister, Jackie Ward and her spouse of Denton, Texas; and grandsons Myles Otto Ward and Wyatt James Ward.

Wayne was laid to rest at Sanger Cemetery in a family ceremony on March 5; a memorial service to celebrate his life will be held on Saturday, March 12, 2022 at 10:00 am at the Keller United Methodist Church (KUMC), 1025 Johnson Road, Keller, Texas 76248. When you reach the appropriate age, it's easy to apply for Social Security retirement benefits – just go to Social Security's website, fill out the online form and you're essentially done. But many people overlook the next step – completing Form W-4V, which asks you how much federal income tax you want withheld from your benefits. And if you skip this step, you could face an unpleasant surprise when it's tax-filing time, because Social Security benefits can indeed add to your taxable income.

Here are the details:  
If you're a single filer...If your "combined" income is between \$25,000 and \$34,000, you may have to pay income tax on up to 50 percent of your Social Security benefits. ("Combined" income includes your adjusted gross income, non-taxable interest, and one-half of your annual Social Security benefits.) If your combined income is more than \$34,000, up to 85 percent of your benefits may be taxable.

If you're married and

file jointly...If you and your spouse have a combined income between \$32,000 and \$44,000, you may be taxed on up to 50 percent of your benefits. If your combined income is more than \$44,000, up to 85 percent of your benefits may be taxable.

These numbers might seem high, but they don't mean you'll lose 50 percent, or 85 percent, of your benefits – they are just the percentages of benefits you may be taxed on, at your personal income tax rate.

To help avoid a big tax bill or an underpayment penalty, you can file Form W-4V with the Social Security Administration and request to have 7, 10, 12 or 22 percent of your monthly benefit withheld. Your tax advisor can help you choose the withholding percentage that's appropriate for your situation.

The amount of taxes you may need to pay will also depend on when you start taking Social Security. The earlier you take benefits, the smaller your monthly checks, and the smaller the taxes. But taxes should not be a key issue in deciding when you need to begin collecting your payments. Rather, you should consider other factors, such as your anticipated life expectancy, your employment situation, your spending needs and the benefits for your

spouse.

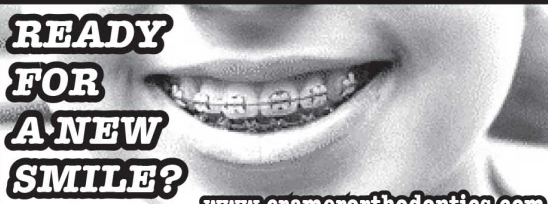
Here's something else to keep in mind: Because Social Security taxes are based on your overall income, as described above, the amount of money you withdraw during retirement, and where that money comes from, can also affect your tax situation. For example, withdrawals from a traditional IRA are taxable and will increase your adjusted gross income, but withdrawals from a Roth IRA will be tax-free, provided you've had your account at least five years and you're over 59 1/2, so this money won't enter into your taxable income calculations and it won't increase the tax you owe on your Social Security benefits. Similarly, withdrawals from health savings accounts (HSAs) used for qualified health expenses also won't count toward your taxable income.

By knowing exactly what to expect from Social Security, including the tax effects, you can more effectively incorporate your benefits into your overall retirement income planning – and the better your plans, the more you'll be able to enjoy your life as a retiree.

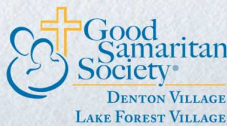

FM 455

# MEET JOHN HENDERSON

Not having reliable transportation, Henderson decided he would forego college and find work that he could be proud of that would allow him the opportunity to learn and grow. From a long line of City employees, Henderson had always wanted to serve the City. He decided to approach John Coker III, the mayor of Sanger at the time, and ask him for a job. Having known John's family history working with the City, Coker told him to apply. Thus began Henderson's career working for the City of Sanger.

1. What is the City ordinance around having goats within the city limits? Goats.

The keeping of goats is prohibited in all zoning districts except where the requirements of a farm are met and further that the pen, corral, fences or similar enclosures are not closer than fifteen (15) feet to any adjacent property line and one hundred (100) feet to any building or structure used for sleeping, dining or living other than the living quarters of the owner or keeper, excluding fencing of pasture or grazing land, and shall be kept in a sanitary condition, and shall also be kept in such a manner as will be reasonably calculated not to become an annoyance to the public.

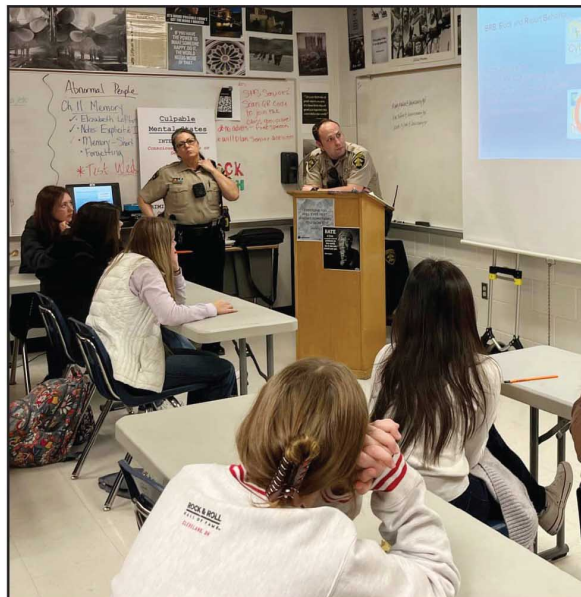

### Mens Results

The Sanger High School Boys Varsity and JV Track & Field teams finished in second place overall at last week's Sanger Invitational. The spot was secured in large part by their 17 first and second place finishes on March 3rd, 2022.

Leading the way was a spectacular team victory in the JV 1600-meter finals where eight of the top ten spots were taken by Sanger students. The eight Sanger spots were as follows: Jose Rojas (1), Cole Daniels (2), Braden Barnes (3), Cade Knavel (4), Kaden Spoon (5), Sam Musgrave (7), Cade Gruber (8), and Andres Nunez (9).

In the Varsity events, Sanger finished second on both the 4x100- and 4x200-meter relays. The relay team consisted of Kolin Shumate, Steven Bush, Kyle Watts (100-m), Colby Lewis (100-m), Austin Shackelford (200-m), and Logan Lewis (200-m).

In addition, Sanger Varsity took the top spot in four events. Colby Lewis won the 200-meter finals with a time of 23.33 seconds and Omar Cruz won the 1600-meter final in 4 minutes and 43 seconds. Rylan Smart secured the discus competition and Steven Bush the triple jump.

The JV team went on to impress with four more number-one spots in addition to the aforementioned 1600-meter race. Braden Barnes won the 3200-meter final with Cole Daniels and Cade Knavel right behind him, all three finishing under the 12-minute mark. Lance Stone and Rosston Knox came in first and third respectively in the shot put finals. Phawensky Cockrell leaped to the top of both the long jump and triple jump finals.

Other top spot finishes that helped secure Sanger's Varsity 2nd place finish included Colby Lewis and Steven Bush finishing second and third respectively in the 100-meter race, Omar Cruz's second place finish in the 800-meter final, Khaedyn Lawson grabbing third place in the 1600, Christian Cortez taking third in the 3200-meter final, and Rylan Smart with second place in the shot put. Alex Limon of the JV team rounds out the top finishers with second place in the 800-meter competition.

Placing second overall is no easy feat and accomplished only as a team. Several Sanger students finished in notable positions to secure a successful invitational.

Notable finishes include Logan Lewis (4th in 400-meter), Khaedyn Lawson (6th in 3200-meter), Aiden Beukema (6th in 110m hurdles), Steven Bush (4th in long jump), Blake Hasten (4th in JV 400-meter), Sam Musgrave (5th in JV 800-meter), Cade Gruber (5th in JV 3200-meter), Lance Stone (4th in JV discus), and Aden West (6th in JV pole vault).

Sanger will compete next in the Van Alstyne Panther Relays this Thursday, March 10, followed by the Aubrey Invitational on March 24.
