Election Day is Saturday

Early voting for the May 4, 2019 School Board General Election ended Tuesday, April 30th at 7 p.m. At 6:50 p.m. on Tuesday, with thunderstorms and tornado warnings in the area, 338 ballots had been cast at the Sanger Church of That doesn't count the votes from other locations during early voting.

Place 5 School Board Candidates are: Lisa Cody, Mitch Hammonds, Guy Saenz, Briony Houchin and Brandon Knight. Current Board President Ken Scribner is not opposed for Place 4. He has been on the board for three terms from 2010-2019 and ready for another three years.

"In regards to the election, let me say how proud I am to be seeking another term on the Sanger ISD board of trustees and am humbled by the fact that I did not face an opponent in this election cycle. I am honored to serve this town of ours and blessed with a team of board members that have our students, staff, parents and taxpayers best interest at heart," said Scribner, on Wednesday morning.

"For the past 9 years, 6 of which I served as board president, I have witnessed all sides of school business including the good and the bad. One thing I can assure you is that this board will continue to strive for excellence within Sanger ISD even as we

struggle with anticipated growth, state funding and the multitude of other issues we face daily. As you are aware the board has been researching and interprospective viewing candidates for the job of Superintendent. LOCAL HORSE RESCUE GROUP TO SPONSOR A NORTH TEXAS TRAINING **CHALLENGE AND HORSE SHOW**

Planned events include an open horse show, a saddle raffle, silent auction, and Training Challenge with \$7,500 in cash prizes

The Bluebonnet Equine Humane Society (BEHS) will host its second annual Help A Horse Horse Show, Adoption Event, and Training Challenge. BEHS was one of the winners in the 2018 HelpA-Horse Competition were winners are picked based on number of adoptions, donations received, an adoption video, and an adoption campaign. This year, they're adding a Training Challenge to the event line-up to increase the rates of adoption as well as give horses in the rescue an opportunity to work with a trainer.

Trainers applied to the Training Challenge by January 15, 2019 and a partner (a rescue horse) was assigned to them. They've worked together and will compete against other trainer and horse teams on May 4, 2019 at the JimADee Arena in Sanger, TX. A total of \$7,500 in prize money will be shared among the winners and the horses will be available to adoption immediately following the competition.

Rescued horses are placed in foster homes where they are rehabilitated by experienced horseman and professional trainers until they are healthy and ready for adoption to loving homes. 


J.C. (Jack) Belcher

"helmet" was a curse word.



He worked closely with Angelo George to help the George family develop the recipes and he supplied the choicest cuts of brisket in the early days of the now famous Angelo's BBQ on White Settlement in Fort Worth. We were always treated like kin there. We always sat at Skeet's big round table and never had to ask for anything. Still the best spot in the whole wide world if for no other reason.

Financial Gifts Can Brighten Anyone's Mother's Day

Mother's Day is fast approaching. This special holiday reminds us of the joy we receive from the powerful bond between mother and child. To help mark the occasion, you may want to consider making certain financial gifts, including the following:

For your mother:

IRA contribution – If your mother is still working, she is eligible to contribute to an IRA, but she might not always fully fund it – so you may want to help. You can't contribute directly to your mother's IRA, but you can write her a check for that purpose, though, of course, she can use the money however she likes. In 2019, the contribution limit for a traditional or Roth IRA is \$6,000, or \$7,000 for individuals 50 or older. (A Roth IRA does have income limits that can reduce the contribution amount or eliminate it altogether.)

Insurance premium - If your mother has life, disability or long-term care insurance, why not offer to pay some of the premiums this year? Long-term care premiums, in particular, can

be quite costly, especially for older policyholders.

Introduction to a financial professional - If your mother doesn't already work with a financial professional, consider introducing her to yours, or to someone else who is recommended by friends or relatives. A financial advisor can help your mother move toward her retirement goals - and, at some point, also can work with legal and tax professionals to assist your mother with her estate plans.

For your children:

529 plan contribution -If your children are still of school age, you may want to contribute to a college savings vehicle. One popular choice is a 529 savings plan. When you invest in this plan, your earnings can grow tax-free, provided the money is used for qualified educational expenses. (Be aware, though, that withdrawals not used for qualified education expenses may be subject to federal and state taxes, as well as an

additional 10% penalty.) As the 529 plan owner, you have flexibility in using the money. For example, if you've designated one of your children as the 529 plan's beneficiary, and that child decides not to pursue any higher education, you can switch the beneficiary designation to another child or to vourself.


You can choose the 529 plan offered by any state, but your contributions might be tax deductible if you invest in your own state's plan. Tax issues for 529 plans can be complex, so, before investing, consult with your tax advisor.

Shares of stocks - Giving stock shares to children is a good way to help them learn some of the basics of investing. You can track the progress of their stocks with them, and even do some research together about why prices may be going up or down. By getting children involved early, you may help instill a lifelong interest in investing.

Charitable gifts - Many children are now concerned about various social issues. You can help encourage this involvement - and possibly an appreciation of the value of philanthropy - by making a gift to a charitable group whose work aligns with your child's interests.



more businesses to Sanger? City staff (City Manager, Development Services, & Economic Development) are doing a great job in this area. As City Councilman, I will find ways to support these efforts.

qualified for the seat of Councilman? I have served as a Commissioner on the Planning and Zoning Board, and on the Board of Adjustments for the City of Sanger since July of 2018. I also have over five years of experience in municipal government and budgeting.

9. What can the City do to attract more businesses to Sanger? The City has a great opportunity to capitalize on water and recreational business opportunities being so close to Lake Ray Roberts. The most important thing we can do as citizens is to shop local!

10. What would you say to residents about the current state of the streets that are in need of repair? And if you believe more money should be made available for ongoing street repair, where will this money come from? We can all agree our streets need improvement, some more than others! Unfortunately, it is not just the streets. There are underground utilities and infrastructure that need attention as well. I am thankful the city is taking an approach where both above and below ground utilities are addressed simultaneously; however, there seems to be more streets that need repair than funds available. Additional funding does not just 'grow on trees' so to increase the funding for streets would decrease funding elsewhere in the budget, but there are ways to reduce the expense of a project. For example, grouping large purchases/projects together in the bidding process can sometimes reduce the overall cost of a project. I would recommend prioritizing our City's projects, and exploring ways to reduce costs.

11. What do you believe are the most important projects to be either started or completed in the city in the next two years? The infrastructure of our city is a top priority. I know we would all be grateful for the completion of the upgrades and repairs at the Water Treatment Plant. I don't have an agenda regarding specific projects, but I do support comprehensive planning for the future.

12. Is it important to you to keep the property tax rate from rising for the residents of Sanger? It is very important to me to keep the property tax rate from rising, but it may be unavoidable to meet the growing needs of the city.

13. Do you think our main street/downtown is healthy and successful? If not, what would you do to change that? I think our downtown area is on its way to being healthy and successful. I would like to see more 'anchor' businesses. I think there is a heavy dependence on a single business in that area, but for a healthy and successful downtown area, I think there should be more than one business.

14. What's most important for the city as far as growth and new homes being built? I think it is important to ensure our city stays healthy as it grows; maintaining and improving our infrastructure is a key element to ensure that health.

15. If you could change one thing in our zoning code, what would it be and why? I am not aware of any changes that need to be made at this time.

16. If you received a \$1 million grant to use for the city any way you wanted, what would you do with it and why? I would use the \$1M for our first responders. A top priority is the safety of our citizens. Sanger High School, Butterfield Elementary School, and several new, multi-phase housing additions east of the railroad tracks create a challenge for our first responders. An important project would be building, and outfitting a second fire station to service the areas







Three Indians qualify for State Track

Sanger's Payten Vidourek qualified for State at the Class 4A Region II Track & Field Meet in Commerce last week, claiming first in the 800 meters with a time of 2:00.27. Vidourek was fourth in the mile (4:34.57). Vidourek a great distance runner, didn't run the 800 until late in the track season at District, because he competed in the 3200, 1600 and mile relay most of the year. A participant can only compete in three running events. But, he and Sanger Track & Field Coach Adam Shaw knew he could earn SHS some extra points at district and compete with times being posted during the season in Region II in the 800. Shaw calculated the mile-relay, without Vidourek could still advance to Area Meet. But, even with Vidourek was a long-shot to get out of regionals in the relay. Coach Shaw left it up to the two seniors on the mile-relay: Isaac Morgan and Hank Lemons to decide what to do. They both wanted Vidourek to have the best chance to make it to State, so they gave coach Shaw the ok. Sanger freshman Riley Smart filled in nicely for Vidourek at district, along with Korbin Shumate, who's been second leg on the relay all season, and advanced to area and just missed out on regionals by one place. Shumate qualified in the 800 for regionals and finished ninth out of 16 competitors.

After placing third in the long jump at the District 11-4A/12-4A area meet to qualify for the Class 4A Region II track meet, Lemons was on the outside looking in as far as qualifying for the state meet goes. Lemons was seeded 15th entering the regional meet but well surpassed his personal record (20 feet, 7 inches) on his final jump Friday afternoon, recording a 22-5 1/2 to stun the field and grab one of two state qualifying

Lemons finished second behind Crandall's Havden Pruitt (22-6) and will be competing at the 4A state track and field meet May 10 and 11 at Mike A. Myers Stadium in Austin. (State seedings will be published in the May 9 issue of the Sanger News).

Lemons will be joined in Austin by Smart, who continued to thrive. Smart, whose dad, Rocky Smart, was hired as the head football coach at Sanger in February, placed second at regionals in the discus to secure a spot at state. Smart's third throw of the day (148-4) was enough to secure the silver medal behind Wills Point's Joshua Etheridge (151-8 1/2).

Isaac Morgan was fourth in the 300 hurdles (40.40). Morgan had the second fastest time after prelims with a 39.58, but he clipped a hurdle in the finals and ran a 40.40. Others that placed: Creed Carter was fifth in the pole vault (13-0) and Kaela Wilkerson was sixth in the high jump (5-2) for the Lady Indians.
