Elva will be remembered dearly for being a very strong, prideful, loving, accepting, and forgiving wom-



May 18, 1945 - December 5, 2022






#### Bill Harper

#### Louise Tobin

1918-2022

She was a grandchild of Civil War veteran and pioneer of north Texas, Lemuel Noah Edwards, who is

credited with founding Aubrey Texas, in the mid-nineteenth century. Mary Louise Tobin, born on Armistice Day, November 11, 1918 amid an influenza pandemic and over a hundred years later surviving the COVID pandemic, passed away in her granddaughter's arms on November 26, 2022. She was 104 years old.

Notably, Louise Tobin was the last survivor of the swing era of the 1930s. Yet, she will be re-



membered as having been much more than that. Indeed, Louise was blessed to have lived many lives during her 104-plus years. She was the daughter and eighth child to Hugh and Edna Mae Tobin. She was the little sister whose singing publicly in church and social functions by age nine spurred her older sister Dora to enter Louise in a CBS Radio talent contest in 1934 which launched her professional singing career. She was the love and first wife of Harry James and mother to Harry and Tim, often calling them "my two, beautiful boys." Louise was Benny Goodman's star vocalist during the height of the swing era, 1939. She was wife, business partner, and featured vocalist with Andrew "Peanuts" Hucko. Married in 1967, Peanuts was the love of her life and her professional partner, traveling the world together until his death in 2003. Louise was grandmother and great grandmother, "mamalou", leaving behind a caring, loving family and countless friends and fans all over the

Throughout her life, Louise was a person of strong faith. In addition to her belief in God, she also found support from the strength of her family, most recently evidenced in the angelic care of her granddaughter Karen James Casteel and her family.

As an artist, Louise has been described as "one of the most jazz-oriented and blues-inflected singers of the swing era." She leaves a recorded history dating from 1939 to 1992. Louise has received many accolades and awards including a tile on the Denton Arts Walk of Fame and an Honorary Doctorate from Texas A&M University-Commerce where she also donated the materials for an archive appropriately named the Louise



# anger Jury Trials

We have all seen tv shows such as Bull or movies with various scenes featuring jury selection and jury trials. Have you ever wondered how much of what you see on television is made up vs. reality? I recently sat in on one of our Sanger Jury Trials. Here is what I learned.

In Texas, when you receive a speeding ticket or a citation for not taking care of your property or letting your animals run around without a leash, you have the option to pay the fine by mail or in person at the Municipal Court as directed on your citation. If you feel the citation was given to you in error or you disagree with the charges,



you have the opportunity to appeal and request either a jury trial or a non-jury (bench) trial. If you opt for a jury trial in Sanger, this is what you can expect.

Since the Pandemic, Sanger has opted, until recently, to hold court in our historic church, giving more open space for social distancing. Other than the change of location, the set-up was very much like what you would see in the movies. There was the judge's bench, prosecutor, and defendant tables, the jury box, audience chairs,

bailiff, and a jury deliberation room.

Before the trial started, Sanger residents arrived with their jury duty summons and anxiously awaited knowing if they would be selected for the trial. While waiting for the defendant to arrive, the judge carefully explained the jury selection process. The moments ticked by as the judge, jury, and prosecutor waited for the defendant to show. About ten minutes past the scheduled start time for the trial, and with the defendant being a no-show, I expected the judge to cancel the trial and either issue a warrant or reschedule. Much to my surprise, the prosecutor, having been in this predicament with this defendant before requested that the judge have our local police department give the defendant a visit, to which the judge agreed and granted the request. In my mind, this is something you would only see in the movies. However, another benefit of living in a small town was brought to life.

After the judge granted the request, and while we were waiting to hear from the officer tasked with checking on the defendant to see if he intended to come to court, the room was a bit in disbelief, but you could sense that everyone found it a bit



funny. Finally, the bailiff informed the judge that the defendant was indeed home, had forgotten about the trial, and was on his way.

If you have never been to court, let me caution you that shorts and flip-flops are not considered the proper attire. Showing up with this lack of regard to where you are is one sure way to upset the Judge.

After the appropriate reprimand for his attire, the jury selection was underway. There was no Bull

(the character from the show) sitting in the courtroom reading the behavior and faces of the jury pool. This case was not a life-or-death high-profile case. However, some questions were allowed, though not necessarily asked, by both sides to allow both the defendant and the prosecution to eliminate potential jury members. Only one person was eliminated on this day. The judge removed him because he was a close family member of a City of Sanger employee. The following six jurors were selected, and everyone else was free to leave for the day. At this point, the judge told the prosecutor to proceed with his opening statement or forego the statement and call his first witness. Mr. Coleman, the prosecutor, opted for the latter

Mr. Coleman, being the seasoned attorney that he is, presented his case, called his witnesses, and closed with ease. The judge then asked the defendant to call his first witness. Once the defense rested, the jury adjourned to the deliberation room to decide the outcome.

From where I was sitting and having watched the entire trial, I thought the deliberation would be relatively

uick. In the grand scheme of things, and knowing that for major trials, the jury can be out for days, the thirty minutes or so that it took wasn't that long.

If someone opts to take their case to a jury trial, they

ultimately put themselves in the hands of their peers. The defendant gets to present all of his or her facts in the case, call witnesses, and provide documentation to support

his case. The prosecutor bears the burden of proof and gets to argue his or her side of the case. He or she has the same opportunities to provide evidence to return a guilty verdict. The jury takes the information provided by both sides and ultimately decicles guilty or not guilty. Additionally, they set the fine amount for each conviction within a parameter defined by the court. With this in mind, it makes sense that the defendant has solid evidence, witnesses, and supporting documentation that supports a verdict of not guilty. After watching the painful process of the defendant presenting his side of the story, the long deliberation process, and

the jury handing down a guilty verdict that included a fine of \$1400, one should probably weight the consequences of receiving a guilty verdict against the initial fine amount. Even with this defendants' multiple charges, his total cost, had he just paid the fine, would have been significantly less than the fine handed down by the jury.

Cybercrime is booming. In 2021, the FBI reported that cybercriminals scammed nearly \$7 billion from Americans - a figure slightly higher than the gross domestic product (GDP) of Switzerland for that year, according to research organization World Economics. How can you protect yourself from cyberthieves?

Here are some suggestions that can help:

Watch out for "phishing" attempts. You may receive emails that appear to be from a legitimate firm, requesting information your financial institution would never request online — confirmation of an account number, password, Social Security number, credit card number and so on. These notes can look official, often incorporating a firm's logo, so pay close attention to what's being asked of you.

Think twice before clicking or downloading. If you are suspicious about a communication, don't click on a link or download an attachment - instead, go to your financial firm's website or use their app to verify they sent the information or request.

Become adept with passwords. Use a different password for each of your accounts and change
