We all want it done faster but it is a matter of budgeting to accomplish as much as possible before the checkbook runs out.



6. How long have you been a resident of Sanger? I have been a part of Sanger my whole life. I was a kindergarten student at Sanger ISD and I graduated from Sanger

Why did you choose to run for City Council? Truthfully, I think the City of Sanger can do better in many aspects. We need to hire a City Manager that is qualified and has the same goals that the City of Sanger needs. Preferably, a City Manager that has seen growth. We need to make sure staff is compensated accordingly. That will also help keep quality employees at the City of Sanger. Overall, we need to reevaluate where the funds are spent. Currently, the City of Sanger is working towards adding in sidewalks, revising streets, doing some of the things the residents have asked for for years. The real question is, are we actually fixing the streets where we won't have to do this again in 5-10 years or is this just a patch job because there is a major difference. Pushing Civil Plans through, pushing plats through, while needed, it needs to be done correctly. I believe the process of construction in the City of Sanger, from start to finish, needs some revising and I know which cities have a good grip on how to make that happen.

9. What can the City do to attract more businesses to Sanger? We can discuss incentives. We can work on a municode that makes it more attractive to bring a business to Sanger. As someone who runs / walks the streets of Sanger frequently, there are some that could use a lot of work. As mentioned previously, we need to take a hard look at where all of the money is going with the City currently and start allocating money to not temporarily fix, but to completely redo some of these streets that are Public Right-Of-Way. This will be a long process but the goal is to not have to deal with this again for years and years to come. Money will have to come from appropriate saving while also cutting out what I believe, are many unnecessary costs.

11. What do you believe are the most important projects to be either started or completed in the city in the next two years? As asked by these questions, I would seem to think many of the folks of Sanger agree that the future growth is the most important thing with the City in years to come. Overall, the City of Sanger did well during the snow storms but we need to work on growing our utilities to handle this growth. So a short and sweet answer, infrastructure for growth as well as providing quality City Employees the resources they need in order to best succeed.

12. Is it important to you to keep the property tax rate from rising for the residents of Sanger? Absolutely, many cities in the Metroplex are becoming unaffordable. We need to help keep the City of Sanger an affordable place to live.

13. Do you think our main street/downtown is healthy and successful? If not, what would you do to change that? This is a hard question because I believe they were headed in the right direction before COVID. Although I wouldn't say it was successful even then, I would say they were getting there. I believe we are going to need to encourage businesses to get into some of those downtown buildings. The City of Sanger owns a large lot downtown (What used to be the old Hardware Store many many years ago, as well as the old Kings building), the City also takes up many lots for City purposes downtown. If you want that area to be successful, we are going to have to get more than one or two businesses down there. You'll need a few things that can attract many different types of people and the Chamber, the City and the Zoning Board can help encourage future businesses in that direction.

14. What's most important for the city as far as growth and new homes being built? First and foremost, make sure they are doing it correctly. Second question is, what kind of homes do we want. Do we want more starter homes, do we want this in town? Our church & eatto be a younger community and if so, can our schools handle a younger community (This comes back around to working with the Chamber and School Board)? Hov does our zoning currently set up for what is going where and is that still the direction the City is heading? So to answer the question, the Planning and Zoning Board and the City Council need to evaluate what the goal is, the Zoning Board needs to evaluate if the current zoning designations line up with the goal, and the City Council / Zoning Board need to take a hard look at the Muni Code deciding what is and isn't allowed in certain zoning designations. Me personally, I don't want to be giving people a 20 foot back yard, especially if we are wanting this to be a younger community. Children need room to play.

15. If you could change one thing in our zoning code, what would it be and why? I don't have a major problem with our zoning code currently. There are of course are things that need to be reevaluated especially as we grow but how this code is enforced is something that needs to be executed better. We shouldn't have to make building a fence, putting in a pool, remodeling a home, or even building a brand new home, so

16. If you received a \$1 million grant to use for the city any way you wanted, what would you do with it and why? First and foremost, lets pay our City Staff what they deserve. Lets hire who we need to hire and plan for them to stay on with a raise every year. Put that money aside for 3 years as we plan on growth. With whatever money is left over after that, lets take a hard look at helping the Sanger 4B team get that park built on the other side of the highway. Lets get the young boys in Sanger some new baseball fields then coordinate with the Parks, Zoning and 4B team to evaluate the best solution to the land currently being used for the baseball fields.

17. Where are your favorite places to spend time in town? I love the lake, I am out there frequently. I also love to take a walk downtown, especially around the holiday season. The City does such a great job of decorating downtown during the holidays. You'll also find me running the streets of the Original Town of Sanger - I love to see some of the old homes as well as the history that accompanies the great City of

9. What can the City do to attract more businesses to Sanger?

The most important thing we can do as citizens is to shop local! Unfortunately, businesses (especially large chains and corporations) look at our town's paper profile and where we as citizens are spending our money within our city to decide if their business would succeed here. With Lake Ray Roberts being so close, I think the City has an excellent opportunity to capitalize on water and recreational business opportunities. The City staff, with the united support of City Council, are currently in the process of updating our town's Comprehensive Plan. This plan is an excellent opportunity for citizens to share your vision for Sanger (check it out at https://www.sanger2040plan.com) and is a tool to guide staff when new business opportunities come to town.

10. What would you say to residents about the current state of the streets that are in need of repair? And if you believe more money should be made available for ongoing street repair, where will this money come from?

We can all agree our streets need improvement, some more than others! Unfortunately, it is not just the streets. There are underground utilities and infrastructure that need attention as well. There is more infrastructure in need of repair than funds available. Additional funding does not just 'grow on trees' - to increase the financing for streets would decrease funding elsewhere in the budget, but there are ways to reduce the expense of a project. For example, grouping large purchases/projects in the bidding process can sometimes reduce the project's overall cost. I would recommend prioritizing our City's projects, and exploring ways to reduce costs.

11. What do you believe are the most important projects to be either started or completed in the city in the next two years?

I think the infrastructure of our city is a top priority. City staff have done a fantastic job prioritizing projects in the last two years and have made significant road improvements. I think we are all grateful for the completion of the upgrades and repairs at the Water Treatment Plant! I do not have an agenda regarding specific projects, but I do support comprehensive planning for the future.

12. Is it important to you to keep the property tax rate from rising for the residents of Sanger?

It is very important to me to keep the property tax rate from rising, but might be

unavoidable to meet the city's growing needs.

13. Do you think our main street/downtown is healthy and successful?

If not, what would you do to change that? I think our main street/downtown is on it's way to being healthy and successful - I would like to see more 'anchor' businesses. I think there is a heavy dependence on a single business in that area, but for a healthy and thriving downtown area, I think there should be a high demand for more than one business.

14. What's most important for the city as far as growth and new homes being

I think it is essential to ensure our city stays healthy as it grows - maintaining and improving our infrastructure is a crucial element to ensure that health. I also think it is important to plan with the future in mind and ensure the decision-making process is inclusive of current and future needs.

15. If you could change one thing in our zoning code, what would it be and why? I am not aware of any changes at this time, and I am looking forward to our updated Comprehensive Plan.

I would use the \$1M for our first responders. A top priority is the safety of our citizens. Sanger High School, Butterfield Elementary School, and several new, multiphase housing additions are located east of the railroad tracks, creating a challenge for our first responders when a train rolls through town. Additionally, Sanger currently supports the largest portion of Denton County's unincorporated land, and several multi-phase housing additions increase the demand for our current station and staff. An important project would be building and outfitting a second fire station to service our growing town.
