

Sanger Sonic plans being finalized to purchase property right next to current location

Restaurant to close doors by January 2020 as crews come in to move utilities for TxDOT widening of FM 455

Owners of the Sonic in Sanger have come to an agreement to purchase the land just west of the current location and right off 10th Street. It's the property where the old Chevrolet Dealership building was demolished this year with the future expansion of FM 455 by TxDOT.

An assistant manager at Sonic of Sanger confirmed that Sonic will be closed in January 2020. That is the TxDOT deadline as crews will come in and start to move utilities for the widening of FM 455 from Marion Road, just east of Sanger High School to the 4-way stop in Bolivar. Unfortunately, that means most of the of Sonic employees will be looking for new jobs when it closes. The TxDOT Right of Way (ROW) reaches the Sonic building. The original plan was to rebuild and turn it from north-south to east and west. But the downside was losing several vehicle spaces for customers to order their food and drinks.

Meanwhile, the Sanger Sonic along with Krum and Denton were sold by Gene Gumfory. It was bought by a group and is controlled by the Sonic Corporate office in Oklahoma City. Lynn Stucky, Republican member of the Texas House of Representatives for the 64th District in Denton County

and long-time resident of Sanger owns the property right next to Sonic, which is 0.56 acre. He confirmed on Tuesday that he has reached an agreement with the Sonic Corporate representatives on a sale price. He said Sonic wanted to do core samples of the soil to make sure it's not contaminated and confirm from TxDOT the two entrances from this property that connects to 10th Street and FM 455. They are testing the soil because the old Chevrolet Dealership was on this location for several years and the building was just torn down this year.

"These things take time," Stucky, said. I think it is a great location for them, especially with the expansion of I-35, as well." In the I-35 expansion, the Shell station between Stucky's property and the highway will be taken by TxDOT's (ROW). He confirmed that Sonic plans on using both properties when they rebuild.







Born and raised in Spencer, Buddy followed profession-




Perhaps most importantly, it was in Texas where Buddy met the love of his life--Teri Lane (Browning) Zubradt--


whom he married on October 11, 1987. The loving couple welcomed Buddy's most cherished gift, his daughter Courteney, to the world on August 19, 1988.
