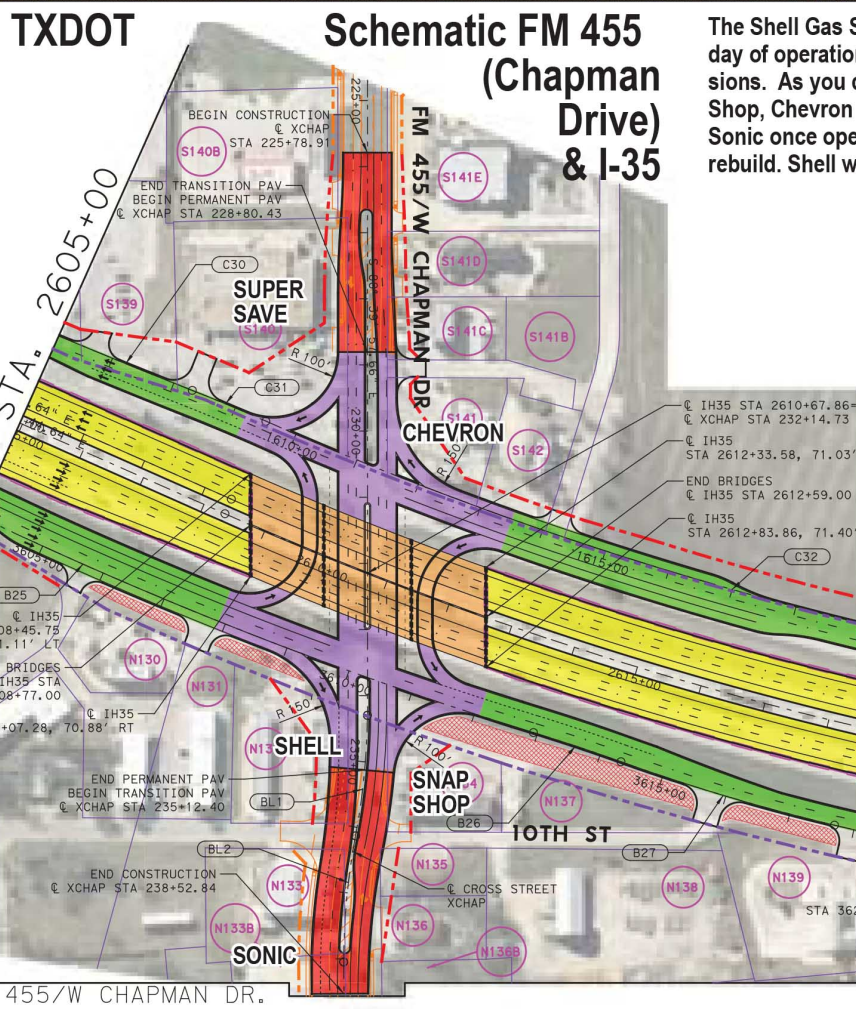

The Shell Gas Station and Convenience Store will be closing this month. Tuesday, December 22 will be the last day of operation. They are the first gas station to close on the corner of FM 455 & I-35 for the TXDOT expansions. As you can see in the schematic on the left, the expansion will take over the properties of Shell, Snap Shop, Chevron and Super Save. Contractors are already moving utilities, as seen in the picture above where Sonic once operated. Sonic will be relocating on this property, but there isn't enough land left for Shell to rebuild. Shell was bought out by the state.

Three SISD schools moved to online-only for this week

Suspending online effective January 8, 2021

Sanger ISD announced Monday that Butterfield Elementary, Chisholm Trail Elementary and Clear Creek Intermediate schools moved to online learning this week. There has been a spike in COVID-10 cases resulting in high quarantine rates for both staff and students. SISD transitioned from face-to-face learning to online learning for the three campuses Tuesday, December 15 through Friday, December 18, 2020. The campuses will be closed to allow for the campus to be deep cleaned. During these four days of closure, all students and

staff switched over to online learning platform and missed zero instructional time. Because of the switch and not losing instructional minutes, these three campuses will not have to make these days up at a later time. During the closure, students were able to receive curbside breakfast and lunch. The Sanger High School, Linda Tutt High School, Sanger Middle School and The 6th Grade Center campuses remained open, offering face-to-face learning. The Christmas Break is December 19, 2020 through January 7, 2021.

There are 135 active COVID cases this week in Sanger's zip code. Sanger ISD announced on Tuesday that after careful consideration the district will be suspending online after the Christmas Break, effective January 8, 2021. Beginning on January 11, 2021 all students are expected back in the classroom for in-person learning unless they meet one of the exceptions listed in an announcement letter from Superintendent Dr. Tommy Hunter, which was emailed to all parents.

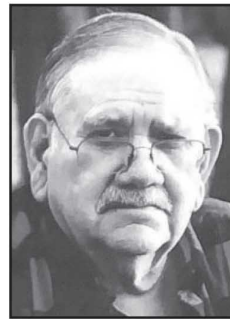

Please follow guidelines at Sanger Cemetery

The Board of Directors for the Sanger Cemetery Association is making a final plea to have family members remove any items at graves in the cemetery that are not within the cemetery Rules and Regulations. A mass letter was sent in 2018, giving everyone ample time to make these removals. The cemetery Rules and Regulations are on the deed issued to you when you purchased your lot and posted inside the gate on a large sign.

We want to thank everyone who has followed these guidelines and those who have cleaned their areas up. Two weeks from this publication date, all items not within the guidelines will be removed and taken to the North end of the cemetery by the dumpster including, trinkets, benches, arches, and statues. You will have 30 days to retrieve your items and your items only! At the end of the 30 days, all items will be placed in the dumpster or hauled off.

Please note: all unsightly flower arrangements and all bushes will be

removed and discarded. Once the clean-up process is complete, the caretaker will maintain this procedure. For your convenience, the Rules and Regulations are below.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

We appreciate your continued cooperation in upholding the cemetery's conditions and regulations as listed below. This reduces the caretaker's amount of maintenance and allows him to keep the grounds in better shape.

Conditions and Regulations of the Sanger Cemetery

1. The tract conveyed shall be for the burial of the human dead and no other use.

2. The tract conveyed shall not be curbed or enclosed in any manner. Any existing curb that has deteriorated or is damaged cannot be repaired and should be removed. The cemetery board has the authority to remove any such curbing.

3. No glass containers shall be left

within the boundaries of the cemetery.

4. No trees, shrubs, ornamental statuary, or other items that would be an obstruction to mowing shall be established on any tracts.

5. The use of the tract conveyed shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Sanger Cemetery Association, as they presently stand or are later amended.

6. The association requires that

a permanent marker be placed on the grave as soon as possible after burial. These memorials should only be made of granite or bronze and must set on an exposed concrete pad with a three-inch apron. The association must be notified BEFORE such memorials are set. Please contact (940) 458-3311 for the requirements of placing a monument in the cemetery.

We're nearing the end of 2020 – and for many of us, it will be a relief to turn the calendar page on this challenging year. However, we've still got a few weeks left, which means you have time to make some year-end financial moves that may work in your favor.

Here are a few suggestions:

Add to your IRA. For the 2020 tax year, you can put in up to \$6,000 to your traditional or Roth IRA, or \$7,000 if you're 50 or older. If you haven't reached this limit, consider adding some money. You actually have until April 15, 2021, to contribute to your IRA for 2020, but the sooner you put the money in, the quicker it can go to work for you. Plus, if you have to pay taxes in April, you'll be less likely to contribute to your IRA then.

Make an extra 401(k) payment. If it's allowed by your employer, put in a little extra to your 401(k) or similar retirement plan. And if your salary goes up next year, increase your regular contributions.

See your tax advisor. It's possible that you could improve your tax situation by making some investment-related moves. For example, if you sold some investments whose value has increased, you could incur capital gains taxes. To offset these gains, you could sell other investments that have lost value, assuming these investments are no longer essential to your financial

strategy. Your tax advisor can evaluate this type of move, along with others, to determine those that may be appropriate for your situation.

Review your investment mix. As you consider your portfolio, think about the events of these past 12 months and how you responded to them. When COVID-19 hit early in the year, and the financial markets plunged, did you find yourself worrying constantly about the losses you were taking, even though they were just on "paper" at that point? Did you even sell investments to "cut your losses" without waiting for a market recovery? If so, you might want to consult with a financial professional to determine if your investment mix is still appropriate for your goals and risk tolerance, or if you need to make some changes.

Evaluate your need for retirement plan withdrawals. If you are 72 or older, you must start taking withdrawals – technically called required minimum distributions, or RMDs – from your traditional IRA and your 401(k) or similar retirement plan. Typically, you must take these RMDs by December 31 every year. However, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Stimulus (CARES) Act suspended, or waived, all RMDs due in 2020. If you're in this age group, but you don't need the money, you can let your retirement accounts continue growing on a tax-deferred basis.

Think about the

future. Are you saving enough for your children's college education? Are you still on track toward the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned? Or have your retirement plans changed as a result of the pandemic? All of these issues can affect your investment strategies, so you'll want to think carefully about what decisions you may need to make.

Looking back – and ahead – can help you make the moves to end 2020 on a positive note and start 2021 on the right foot.

Flu Season and the Coronavirus: How to Prepare

Flu season starts in the fall, and this year, the continuing coronavirus pandemic will complicate the picture. COVID-19 and the flu are both contagious respiratory illnesses. You may be wondering:

If you get sick, what should you do?
 • How important is it to get your flu shot this year? (Spoiler alert: very.)
 • Flu and Coronavirus Symptoms: How do I tell them apart?

Unfortunately, the short answer is, you can't. If you come down with any kind of illness, the best thing to do is call your doctor, explain your symptoms and self-quarantine until you know what's going on.

SARS-CoV-2, the coronavirus that causes COVID-19, is a new germ we haven't encountered before, and symptoms can vary from one person to the next.

Because some coronavirus symptoms are similar to those of bronchitis, the common cold, the flu and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), this year it is likely that a test will be necessary to tell the difference.

If You Have Symptoms: What to Do

Call your doctor. If you or your child has a fever, cough, congestion, sneezing, sore throat, runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or any other symptoms of infectious illness, stay home, call your doctor and follow his or her recommendation. It is likely that he or she will recommend that you are tested for the flu and COVID-19.

Seasonal Flu 2020: Will this year's flu season be severe?

It is hard to predict how bad the seasonal flu will be. Each year there are several different flu viruses around, and the

viruses mutate (change) from year to year. The flu shot is updated each year to protect you against three or four of the worst flu strains that are expected to show up during that season.

Human behavior is also a factor. This fall and winter, it may be that our behavior changes — such as wearing a mask and practicing physical distancing, and closures or cancellations affecting school, work, travel and public events — help contain the spread of the flu and other respiratory viruses, in addition to COVID-19.

But there is another factor to think about: Doctors are noting that fewer patients are getting recommended vaccines. Many people get their flu shots through their employer, school or local health department. Because of the pandemic, some of these large-scale vaccination events might not take place this year. Flu shots are available at S&J Pharmacy in Sanger.

Fall and winter months bring the flu season. Here is what you need to know to help protect you and your family from the flu and COVID-19.

Avoid the Flu and Other Illnesses During the Coronavirus Pandemic

Both the flu and COVID-19 are spread through infected droplets and particles in the air, and can cause severe illness — even death.

As cases of COVID-19 continue to appear, other respiratory illnesses, including the flu, haven't gone away. A flu outbreak in a location that's also experiencing a lot of COVID-19 cases could overwhelm hospitals and make it hard for doctors and hospitals to care for a sudden surge of sick patients.

Can you have the coronavirus and the flu at the same time?

Unfortunately, yes — and if you have the coronavirus and the flu at the same time, the resulting impact could be even more severe than having either infection alone. By this fall, some areas may have a test available that can look for both the coronavirus and flu viruses so you only need one test.

Cold and Flu Season Precautions: What to Do

Get a flu shot. Even if you usually skip a flu shot, this is the year to make sure you get one. It is safe for you to go to the doctor for a flu shot. For the 2020–2021 flu season, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or CDC, recommends that you get your flu shot. Ask your doctor if you should get a pneumonia shot, too.

Don't forget the kids. It's important to ensure your children (over 6 months old) get flu shots — and any other vaccines they need. Learn more about keeping up with routine vaccinations for babies and kids during the coronavirus pandemic.

Care for yourself and your family with good nutrition, plenty of rest, proper hydration, regular exercise and stress management. And always stay home if you don't feel well.

Continue protecting yourself from the coronavirus. Even if you are tired of following coronavirus precautions such as washing your hands frequently, cleaning and sanitizing, wearing a face mask and physically distancing, it's especially important now to keep up the good work — and encourage your family to do the same.

Maintaining these habits through the cold and flu season will help prevent COVID-19 and other fall and winter illnesses, as well.

Re: Sanger ISD Learning Platforms

Dear Sanger ISD Families,

COVID-19 has presented many challenges across the world. The primary responsibility of Sanger ISD is to provide students with an exceptional education while providing for their health and safety. Sanger ISD has provided learning opportunities for both remote and in-person learners as methods of instructions so that students can have access to curriculum and academic success. Upon reviewing grades and attendance from our first two grading periods, Sanger ISD administrative staff and Board of Trustees have decided to revise the learning plan options for our students. We believe that in-person learning instruction provides students with additional support and access to teachers, academic conversations with peers and stability leading to higher academic success.

We have been asking our teachers to start their day earlier than ever to deal with the challenges associated with COVID-19. While doing all the little things to keep everyone safe we have several teachers teaching on two different platforms serving both in-person learners and remote learners. Our staff has performed all these tasks while putting in more hours and days than any school year prior. Despite all of our efforts, we have learned the online learning has not been as successful as we have hoped for our remote learners. After reviewing all of our data, we are transitioning our current online students back to in-person learning.

After careful consideration Sanger ISD will be suspending our remote learning platform effective January 8, 2021. Beginning on January 11, 2021 all students are expected back in the classroom for in-person learning **unless they meet one of the exceptions below:**

1. A student is medically fragile or lives with someone who is considered medically fragile. Documentation from a medical doctor is required and must be submitted to the campus principal on or before January 8, 2021.
2. A positive COVID case requires the student to be quarantined in accordance with the guidelines established by TEA as follows: Any student who has tested positive for COVID, or who experiences the symptoms of COVID, must stay home throughout the infection period and cannot return to campus until all three criteria have been met:
 - a. At least one day (24 hours) has passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications);
 - b. The individual has improvement in symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath); and
 - c. At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
3. A student who has had close contact with someone who is COVID positive must be quarantined for 10 days. The student shall return to in-person learning after their quarantine period.

Students who do not meet the qualifications to remain in remote learning must return to school in-person on January 11, 2021.

While we want to see all of our students return to school in-person, we want to allow enough time for you to make the decision you feel is best for your child. Students who do not meet one of the above exceptions are expected to return to campus. Students not returning to school have the following choices:

- Withdraw to homeschool
- Enroll in private school
- Request to transfer to a district offering remote learning

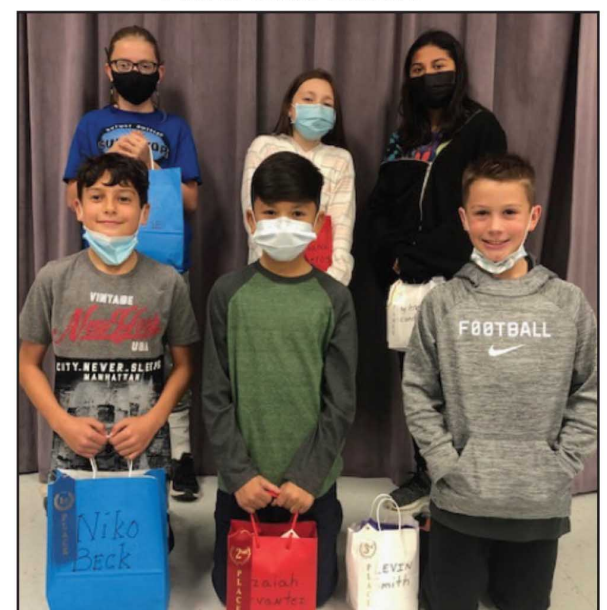

Malone recognized for 1000 points

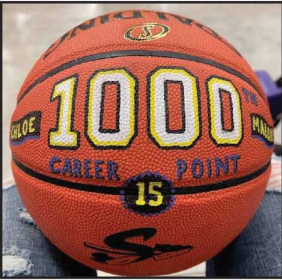
