Second suspect arrested in robbery of **Cool Vapes**

On Wednesday, January 4, Zachary Scott Kershner (27) and Nichole Dawn Williamson (24), both of Denton, were arrested following a standoff with police concerning an aggravated robbery that occurred at Cool Vapes in Sanger on December 14.

Around 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, investigators from the Sanger Police Department and the Texas Department of Public Safety Criminal Investigation Division and warrant deputies from the Denton County Sheriff's Office went to a business owned by Kershner in Denton to attempt to serve an arrest warrant for Aggravated Robbery.

Kershner had barricaded himself in his business and refused to come out or communicate with officers when they attempted to contact him. His presence in the building was confirmed via a GPS ankle monitor he is required to wear as a term of probation, and a search warrant for the business was obtained. Due to the nature of the warrant and Kershner's criminal history, assistance was requested from Denton Police Department's tactical team. Negotiators attempted to contact Kershner, but he continued to refuse to communicate with police. After approximately three hours of trying to speak with Kershner to get him to come out of the business, DPD tactical team entered the business and took Kershner into custody without incident around 1:30 p.m.

Williamson, who had previously been arrested for Aggravated Robbery in connection with the December 14



robbery of Cool Vapes and bonded out, was also located hiding in the business and arrested on outstanding felony warrants for Possession of a Controlled Substance, Penalty Group 1, Under 1 gram (cocaine) and for Endangering a Child. These warrants were obtained after a search warrant was executed at Williamson's Denton home on December 16.

Kershner was arraigned on January 5 and had bail set at \$75,000 for the Aggravated Robbery warrant. Williamson had bail set at \$2,500 (Possession of Controlled Substance) and \$5,000 (Endangering a Child) on her warrants.

The Sanger Police Department would like to thank the Texas DPS, Denton County Sheriff's Office, and Denton Police Department for their assistance in the investigation of the Cool Vapes Robbery and in safely taking these individuals into custody.

"I want to commend Detective Lewis for the many long hours and dedication working to solve this case," said Chief Waylan Rhodes.

At approximately 10:10 p.m. on Wednesday, December 14, the aggravated robbery occurred at the shop at 904 S, 5th Street in Sanger. A male and female dressed in all black, gloves, face coverings, and sunglasses entered the store. They displayed a handgun and forced the employee into a bathroom, then proceeded to take cash and merchandise from the store. They left the store in a red Kia Soul with no license plate visible in the surveillance video. The employee was not harmed during the robbery.

SHS Athletic Director Galbreath retires, Smart will not return as football coach

Galbreath served as coach and athletic director from 2007-2016, transitioning to solely holding the athletic director post in 2016. The Sanger native amassed a 64-44 record in 10 seasons as the Indians' head coach and holds a career record of 80-61.

"I was able to be the athletic director in my hometown for 16 years," Galbreath said via press release. "It is something that I have enjoyed immensely and am very proud of. It is something I will look back on as the best time of my life, career-wise.

"I am proud of all the accomplishments we've had in athletics throughout my 16 years and the way we positively import I've been given."

Longtime Sanger ISD for another season leading athletic director Chuck the program. Galbreath's announced retirement had been in the works for a long time and is unrelated to Smart's departure, according to a Sanger ISD spokesperson.

Smart spent the last Sanger's head football four years at the helm in taking over for Cole Ford, who served as Galbreath's offensive coordinator for his last four years and was the first to hold the head gig after Galbreath stepped down.


Gary Wayne Harden

The Winter Garden

Not much activity is happening in the garden this time of year. The holiday season just ended, and so the garden has been quiet. Any summer vegetables have succumbed to a frost or freeze, so now is the perfect time to think about cool-season plants. Our early springs in Texas can bring some very warm temperatures. These warmer temps make cool weather plants very unhappy. That's why December and January are the best times to get these plants in the ground and well-established.

The nurseries are filled with lots of colorful flowers right now. Check out your local nurseries, which will carry plants appropriate for your growing zone. Big box stores supply plants to numerous parts of the country and will only sometimes have plants suited to our area. Cold-hardy transplants of calendulas, dianthus, flowering kale, pansies, violas, and snapdragons are abundant. One trip to the garden center will give you so many choices it will be hard to narrow down. You will find well-established transplants ready for your garden. It's also quite helpful to see their appearance once you get them planted into your own space.

Remember, cool-season vegetables. Plant kale, spinach, Swiss chard, and lettuce in January. Most greens will thrive in these cooler conditions. Cool-weather crops can withstand a light freeze or frost, and you can protect them from more extreme cold temperatures and wind with a light blanket or sheet. You can also purchase row cover from your nursery for a more permanent solution. During this time of year, it is essential to check the forecast.

Herbs are another category that we can plant now. Cold hardy varieties include chives, mint, oregano, sage, and thyme. Herbs take a bit of time to become established; it is best to plant early in the month and protect from any sudden drop in the temperature. Though rosemary is not on this list, mine has survived two cold winters with minimal protection.

Remember that mulch is your best protection against high winds or cold weather. Mulching your beds at planting time will also prevent moisture loss. Use organic materials such as straw, arborist wood chips, or shredded leaves for best results.

Now is the time to curl up in your favorite chair with all those seed catalogs. For the last two years, many varieties have sold out, so if you have some favorites, I recommend ordering early. Growing from seed gives you many varieties that aren't available from a nursery as a transplant. When considering seeds for your garden, look for varieties that can withstand the Texas climate. Texas A&M has information and recommendations on the best plants for our area. If you plan to start seeds indoors for spring, consider the type of growing station you would like. There are countless choices in lighting, heat mats, and shelving units. 2023 is the year to start your seed-growing adventure!





But in all future years after you've reached your full retirement age, you can earn as much as you want without losing any benefits. Social Security will then recalculate your payments to give you credit for the months your benefits were reduced or withheld due to your excess earnings. Be aware, though, that your earned income can potentially result in higher taxes on your Social Security benefits at







Clear Creek will undergo several projects including adding 10 classroom additions with storm shelter, expanded parking lot, additions to the cafeteria and kitchen, a controlled entrance to the building for security, replaced roof, fire protection system update and relocated playground. This is one of the final phases of design before the documents are submitted to the city for permitting. This is also the final stage needed before bidding for the project begins. Bid Day for this project will be on January 17 at Pogue Construction.

SISD will hold another Design Development meeting for the Ag Science Center on January 23 to hopefully get closer to finalizing the design on that project so they can move on to the CD phase.

Pogue is scheduled to bring a GMP for the Clear Creek project to the board for approval at the February Board meeting.
