





DEA's Take Back Day provides a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

DEA National Take Back FAQs:



What can I turn over at the DEA Take Back event? All solid dosage pharmaceutical products and liquids in consumer containers can be accepted. Individu-als should ensure that the cap is tightly sealed to prevent leakage.



Can I turn over illicit drugs? No. Illicit substances such as marijuana or meth-amphetamine are not part of this initiative will not be accepted.



Do you collect information on individuals disposing of medications? No. This program is anonymous and all efforts will be made to protect the anonymity of individuals disposing of medications. No questions or requests for identification will be made.



Will you accept needles for disposal? No. Intravenous solutions, injectables and syringes will NOT be accepted at this event.



Can I drop off liquid medication? Yes. Liquid products should remain in their original containers with the cap tightly sealed to prevent leakage.



Do I need to take the medication out of its original container? No. You may dispose of your medication in the original container if you choose, but you are encouraged to remove any identifying information from the label if applicable.



Last Friday night at Stephen Baker Field at Indian Stadium featured another classic District 5-4A battle as the Sanger Indians hosted the rival Krum Bobcats. Despite a strong first half and several explosive offensive plays, the Indians ultimately fell short as Krum stormed back to win 49-35

Fast Start, First-Half Fireworks

The game began with a tough break for Sanger — a fumble on the opening kickoff gave Krum early field position. But the Indian defense held firm, limiting the Bobcats to just a field goal. That stop lit a spark for the Sanger offense, and quarterback Reed Sebastian wasted no time responding, hitting Joel Rodriguez on a 21-yard touchdown strike to give Sanger the lead.

From there, the Indians caught fire. Sebastian threw another touchdown — a 44-yard bomb to Rodriguez and connected with Wyatt Pennington on a 9-yard score. The senior quarterback also punched in two short touchdown runs himself, helping Sanger take control with a 35-24 halftime lead.

Second-Half Struggles

After the break, momentum began to shift. Krum opened the second half with a big kickoff return and quickly cut into the lead with a field goal, making it 35–27. From that point forward, the Sanger offense went cold — shut out in a half for the first time since September 2024.

Meanwhile, Krum's offense capitalized on Sanger penalties and turnovers, scoring 22 unanswered points to seal the comeback victory.

SHS earns Division I Rating at UIL Region 2 Marching Band Contest

The Spirit of Sanger High School Band competed in the UIL Region 2 Marching Band contest along with all 30 of the bands Class (1A-6A) from ther Region last Saturday at C.H. Collins Stadium in Denton. Bands compete with schools that share their UIL classification (1A-6A). At this stage bands are awarded a "Rating" instead of a number. A rating of 1st division is best to 5th division being the worst. In order to advance to the Area round you must be awarded a 1st Division by 2 of the 3 judges. Sanger was awarded a 1st Division by all 3 judges. There were 7 bands in the UIL 4A classification that competed. All were awarded a 1st Division and advanced to the Area round.

It's a huge "Area" geographically according to Robert Smith, SHS Band Director. As far north as Burkburnett HS on the Oklahoma border to Robinson HS south of Waco. There are 5 "Areas" comprising 31 Regions. Those "Areas" combined, sent 27 bands to the 4A State marching contest in 2024.

In Sanger's UIL Area B, there are 49 UIL class 4A bands, and 31 of them advanced to the Area level by earning a 1st division. For every 5 bands that advance to the Area level, one band will advance on to the State level. "This Saturday Oct. 25th we will compete against all 31 qualifying bands head to head, and this time receive a numbered score instead of a rating. The number this time allows judges to rank bands among one another to determine the top 12 highest scores," said Smith. Those bands will move onto a Finals round that same evening and compete again for placement. This time the excitement builds, because now the top 6 bands at the end of the Finals judging will advance to the UIL State Marching contest in San Antonio on Nov. 5th. "Our Area is a tough one for sure with 3 of the Area B bands placing in the Top 10 of the UIL State Marching Contest. Sanger has never competed in the State Marching Contest but we have our eyes on the goal of making school history very soon," added Smith.

Sanger boys win regionals, girls place second

The SHS varsity boys and girls cross country teams qualified for state on Tuesday. The Indians won the Class 4A Region Meet for the first time since 2015 held at Harold Patterson Sports Complex in Arlington. Note: SHS has made it to state several times since 2015, but hasn't won the toughest region in the state in Class 4A. The Lady Indians placed second behind Celina and ahead of Prosper Richland, who are district foes and on the
