City plans for more asphalt paving on Sanger streets

Accepting bids until May 16

The City of Sanger is going out for bid again for its concrete labor and material and asphalt paving labor and material. In 2019-2020 the City contracted to take up and lay asphalt on several streets throughout town. They are planning to do even more and some sidewalks, as well.

The City is still working on all the details and they will have more information in the future, with specifics.

Bid packets and specification for each of these contracts may be picked up Monday-Thursday from 7:30am – 5:00pm at the Public Works office located at 201 Bolivar Street or online at https://www.sangertexas.org/page/public_works_RFQs

Bid packets are available from now through May 16, 2021. All bid packets must be received at the Public Works office no later than 2:00pm on May 17, 2021, late submissions will not be accepted.

City of Sanger announces notice of intention to issue certificates

The City Council of the City of Sanger, Texas (the "City") will hold a meeting at its regular meeting place at the Historic Church Building, 402 N. 7th Street, Sanger, Texas (or if the City is still subject to a stay-at-home order via teleconference and video conference in compliance with an advisory issued by the Office of the Governor) at 7:00 p.m. on the 19th day of April, 2021, which is the time and place tentatively set for the passage of an ordinance and such other action as may be deemed necessary to authorize the issuance of the City's certificates of obligation, payable from an annual ad valorem taxation, as well as a limited (in an amount not to exceed \$1,000) pledge of certain revenues of the water and sewer system, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$20,000,000.00, bearing interest at any rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate now or hereafter authorized by law, as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance and maturing over a period of years not to exceed forty (40) years from the date thereof, for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness of the City (1) for water and sewer system expansion and improvements, electric utility system renovations and line relocations, and city wide street repairs and improvements and (2) for professional services pursuant to Subchapter C of Chapter 271, Texas Local Government Code, as amended.

The estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the Certificates on time and in full is \$28,386,038.75. Such estimate is provided for illustrative purposes only and is based on an assumed interest rate of 2.22%. Market conditions affecting interest rates vary based on a number of factors beyond the control of the City, and the City cannot and does not guarantee a particular interest rate associated with the Certificates.

As of the date of this notice, the aggregate principal amount of public securities of the City secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes (excluding public securities secured by an ad valorem tax but designated by the City as self-supporting) is \$2,368,500.00 and based on the City's expectations, as of the date of this notice the combined principal and interest required to pay all of the outstanding tax-supported debt obligations of the City secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes (excluding public securities secured by an ad valorem tax but designated by the City as self-supporting) on time and in full is \$2,729,358.00





TEXAS A&M GRILIFE **EXTENSION**

Winter storm Uri. which devastated most of Texas, is estimated to have caused 600 million in damages to Texas Agriculture, according to AgriLife Extension Economists.

Our state director recently discussed the storm and its impact. "A large number of Texas farmers, ranchers and others involved in commercial agriculture and agricultural production were seriously affected by Winter Storm said Jeff Hyde, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension Bryan-College director, Station. "Freezing temperatures and ice killed or harmed many of their crops and livestock as well as causing financial hardships and operational setbacks. And the residual costs from the disaster could plague many producers for years to come."

Specifically in Denton County farmers had trouble finding fuel and fuel additives to keep diesel generators and tractors running. Cattle and livestock suffered extremely low temperatures. In the valley in south Texas the citrus industry expected huge loses, and fishing guides are estimating a large impact on recreational fishing on the coast. "It's real similar to the fish kill we had back in 1983 and 1989, it took about 3 years after each one for our fish population to recover," said Port Mansfield fishing

guide Dennis Walker. USDA Farm Service agency has setup multiple programs that provide support for loss from the

Winter Storm Uri Costly for Ag Producers



"Texas's hardworking ag producers feed our neighbors, the nation, and the world," said Acting State Executive Director Eddie Trevino. "When they suffer losses because of extreme weather, helping them get back on their feet is important. We encourage those affected to reach out to their local USDA Service Center to apply for these emergency loans.

Monty Dozier, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension program director for disaster assessment and recovery, said the data related to agricultural losses was acquired through the agency's extensive statewide network of agents and specialists.

"Our people collaborated with agricultural industry groups and other stakeholders to get the most accurate and up-todate information available at this time," Dozier said. "Then the information was assembled and analyzed by agricultural economists and other agricultural experts from Texas A&M AgriLife using a standardized approach.'

Statewide damage estimates are separated into three different groups of agriculture crops across the state, citrus crops, livestock, and vegetable crops. Citrus crops are estimated to have suffered \$230 million in damages, \$228 million for livestock, and \$150 million for vegetable crops.
