Approximately 1,000 people have voted at the Sanger Community Center after the final day of early voting ended at 7 p.m. on Tuesday. The Sanger General Election is Saturday May, 7, 2022. The turnout is high, because of the proposed 130 million dollar SISD bond. There is one school board race between candidates Jesse Hunter and Debbie Reaves for Place 4. Bruce Elsey (Place 7) and Lisa Cody (Place 5) are


Robert Leroy Brown





WHAT'S IN THE BOND?

In order to address projected enrollment increases, grade realignment will occur at Butterfield and Chisholm Trail Elementary Schools. This will reduce the number of students and increase the functional capacity at the elementary level within the district.

ADDITIONS AND RENOVATIONS

Clear Creek Intermediate will have a classroom addition and renovations made that will increase the school's functional capacity. This will include a storm shelter, and renovations to the cafeteria and kitchen to match the increased capacity. Capital improvements to the campus including fire protection and controlled entry will also be included in the proposed bond.

The proposed new high school will provide additional space for SISD's Fine Arts programs. The instructional and practice space square footage for band and choir will more than double, allowing more students to participate.

AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE CENTER

The current Ag barn was constructed in 1978 and does not have space for large livestock. Bond 2022 includes construction of a new Ag Science facility, with more than 65 pens with turnouts for large animals, exercise area, storage, lockers, and multiple wash and trim stations. It will be designed to allow future jackpot shows to be hosted by our FFA.

ATHLETIC ANNEX

Bond 2022 includes construction of a new athletic annex. All boys and girls outdoor sports will be consolidated in to a single building, including Cross Country, Track, Soccer, Tennis, Softball, Baseball, and Football. A training room for student athlete treatment and instructional space for CTE will also be included.






ATHAN KIRKLAND FAMILY AND THE PINK **HOUSE HISTORY**

For those that may have wondered about the history of the "Pink House" on the northeast corner of Elm and Fifth Streets, the daughter of Nathan Patrick Kirkland, Miss Bessie Kirkland. lived in the home for her entire adult life.

Nathan Kirkland was a very active businessman and delved into the real estate business. Kirkland and his family consisted of his wife Lou Rainey Dodd Kirkland and eleven children;

seven lived to adulthood: Emmett, Eugene, Walter, Jeff, Ola, and Bessie. The family moved to Sanger from their farm in Gribble Springs, and acreage was purchased and subdivided in the early 1890s. Early neighbors in the eastern portion of Sanger included the families of Henry Peters, Pleas Seals, H.D.



The Kirkland family lived in several locations. After arriving at Sanger, Kirkland purchased a farm east of town, but after the death of their young son, Herbert, the family moved back to town. The big white two-story home was located at the corner of Second and Willow Streets. Their next move was a new home built by Kirkland on the corner of Bolivar and Fifth, where the current child care business is located. In 1913 the Kirklands bought the house at the intersection of Fifth and Church Street. It was later known as the Melson home where Marijohn Melson, singer and musician, lived until they moved from Sanger.



The oldest child, Emmett, built the first garage in Sanger in 1913 (where the child care business is now located) after their home was relocated, which later became the LeGear Ford Motor Company, and eventually an auto repair shop owned by several local men for many years. In this block on Bolivar Street, Dr. Wall's dentistry office was located, and at one time, the Sanger Courier operated in this block but later

located two blocks east.

E.L. Berry, Cashier of the First National Bank in Sanger, lived on the northeast corner of Elm and Fifth Streets, also known as the "Pink House." Berry built a new home just west of town on what is now west of Interstate 35. The big red brick twostory home was built with

special features for protection. Dr. J. Clyde Chapman later owned it. Kirkland purchased the Berry home in downtown Sanger, and the family moved in, with Bessie remaining in the house for the remainder of her life.

Bessie was a graduate of Sanger High School in 1917. She attended college at C.I.A., which is now known as Texas Woman's University. Bessie was an ardent member of the First Baptist Church, and upon the church's 90th anniversary, she was honored as the member who had belonged to the church for the longest period of time. In her interview with Mrs. Gray, Bessie's memories included when the school burned in 1916.

Before Christmas, the students resumed their classes in the opera house (the W.O.W. building). Some classes were held in the old Dunn Building (now the vacant lot where the hardware store burned). The younger school students attended classes in various churches within the community. Bessie was salutatorian of her graduating class of 1917.

Many memories of Sanger by Bessie included the "Chautauqua Week" in the early days. The park area was called The Square, and advance tickets were sold, and culture came to Sanger. Various programs were given, sometimes a lecture, a musical program, and a Shakespearean play. This week was always set aside and never conflicted with the revival meetings that would last most of the summer for two weeks at a time. There was no television to compete with these significant religious events. Churches holding revivals included Baptists, Methodists, Presbyterians, Landmark Baptists, and the Assembly of God.

In closing the interview with Miss Bessie, she was most appreciative of the Modern Era Department of Wednesday Club helping make her home more comfortable with the gift of a new television. Her Sunday School class provided a hot meal each day for two weeks after she was injured from a fall. Sanger was indeed a helping community.

Miss Bessie Kirkland passed away in January 1984 at the age of 85.

As you drive by this home across from the City Park, may you reflect on the history that this home held over the years.







Mother of Thousands Special Event BY LYNNE S. SMILAND

Sanger Public Library will present an unusual event on Tuesday, May 10th at 4:15, with the "Mother of Thousands" plants (also known as Kalanchoe daigremontiana). This plant is a succulent related to the jade plant and other kalanchoe varieties, and like the others it does not need a lot of care.

Mother of Thousands can begin as a houseplant in bright but indirect light. They will do well outside also, especially in the summer. Avoid direct light, especially in summer as the leaves can get sunburned.

The most interesting feature of this plant is how it reproduces: Tiny leaflets emerge around the edges of large leaves. Children especially are fascinated by the baby leaves. They can be plucked off and put in a pot to grow into a medium sized plant, or disposed of. If not plucked off, the plantlets will fall or even blow, perhaps to a place that is unwanted. For this reason the plant can be labeled "invasive," but it can easily be controlled by location and removing the leaflets that are not wanted.

The library will have two more mature plants with many leaflets. some small pots, and potting soil, so that patrons can go home with baby plants. Patrons may also bring their own pots if they wish. A hand out will also be available with more information on mother of thousands plants and their care.
