SISD bond and City of Sanger's MDD voted down

Sanger ISD residents who went to the polls voted overwhelmingly against the \$68 million Proposition A. According to complete results, 62.8% of the ballots cast were against the proposition, with a total of 1,749 voters stopping at the polls or voting by mail 1,098 against and 651 for.

There would have been an 11-cent increase in their tax rate as a result of this bond, according to Sanger ISD. Sanger ISD Proposition A (Total: \$68 million)

New elementary campus (\$62M); A new campus for 650 students (grades 1-5).

Renovations to HS metal fabrication center (\$3M); Upgrades the existing shop building; Provides students with updated programs; Replaces/upgrades critical systems at the end of their life; Upgraded HVAC and the exhaust system; New lights, ceiling and finishes.

Renovations to Butterfield Elementary, Clear Creek Elementary and Sanger Middle School (\$2M); Upgrade the classroom environment to allow flexibility with instruction and collaboration, including modular furniture (student desks, chair and teacher desks)

New buses (\$1M); Purchase new buses to address growing student enrollment.

Sanger ISD released a statement to the public:

Dear Sanger ISD Community, "Following tonight's elections, the results show the bond was not approved. We respect the outcome and are grateful to everyone who took part in the voting process and engaged throughout this effort.

Our focus remains steady: providing every student with a strong, supportive, and high-quality educational experience. Dr. Hunter noted that this period will be used to reflect, gather additional input from the community, and carefully evaluate the next steps forward.

We will continue to keep the Sanger ISD community updated as plans are developed.

Thank you for your continued support of our students and schools."

There was one contested race for School Board Trustee Place 1. Incumbent Jarrod Roberts 797 won over Drew Hall with 777 out of the 1,574 ballots cast. Incumbents Bruce Elsey (Place 7) and Mitch Hammonds (Place 6) were unopposed for their respective places on the school board.

The City of Sanger will have a new Mayor - Gary Bilyeu. He was the lone candidate to fill the position of Thomas Muir who has been the Mayor for 16 years and is turning over the reins to Bilyeu, who has called Sanger home since 1999. It is the community where he met his wife Carrie and where they chose to

raise their two sons Major and Cooper. Bilyeu just finished his eighth term (16 years) on the Sanger City Council, Gary also served as Mayor Pro-Tem.

"I am deeply thankful for the opportunity to serve. My commitment is simple: to lead with integrity, to listen with empathy, and to work every day for the well-being of our community," said Bilyeu on Wednesday morning.

Bilyeu's dedication to public service began long before his council tenure, with past leadership roles including: President of the Sanger Area Chamber of Commerce, Chair of the Planning & Zoning Committee, and member of the Board of Adjustments.

Gary earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of North Texas before enlisting in the United States Marine Corps. Over a distinguished 29-year military career, he rose through the ranks as an Infantry Officer, guided by a deep sense of duty, honor, and service to others.

Professionally, Gary is a Financial Advisor and the owner of KFA Financial, a financial services firm located in downtown Sanger. He currently serves on the board of directors for Cowtown Warriors (a nonprofit veterans organization) and recently finished his term as president of the Sanger Education Foundation.

There was one contested race for City Council member Place 4 between

incumbent Allen Chick and newcomer to the council Margie Tisdale. She won with 428 votes to Chick's 293. Another newcomer is Mark Bulger who was unopposed for Place 2, to fill the void left by Bilyeu to become Mayor.

The City of Sanger Proposition A for an MDD was voted down 404-392 for voters inside the city limits. For the voters that live outside the city limits in the ETJ, it was voted down 323-79.

An MDD is a Municipal Development District, a tool designed to help infrastructure needed to support the local rapid growth. The City currently has a Type A EDC. This Type A sales tax is limited to the City limits only. If the MDD vote passed, the sales tax would be imposed in the City limits and ETJ. Authorizing the creation of the MDD and the imposition of a sales and use tax at the rate on one-half of one percent (0.50%). More than 500 small and mid-sized Texas cities have an MDD in their ETJ.

Sanger TX Senior Center's long journey to re-opening

Over the past two years, a dedicated grassroots group of senior women in Sanger has worked diligently to maintain an open senior center in the community. When it became apparent that the long-standing tradition (established in 1985) of having an open Senior Center was threatened due to the deteriorating condition of the century-old building housing its programs, these individuals took initiative to persuade the City of Sanger of the Senior Center's value as a significant asset to the community.

In May 2025, after learning the Sullivan Building was no longer available for renovation, the Sanger City Council began searching for a new venue for the senior programs. The senior programs were rebranded as the Sanger, TX Senior Center. In June, the council approved purchasing and installing a temporary modular facility on city property, reallocating the original budgeted renovation funds to cover these costs.

The Sanger, TX Senior Center Board collaborated closely with Parks and Recreation Department Head Ryan Nolting to design the floor plan and various features for the new modular building. The elected Executive Board Members—Terri Cornwell (Board President), Sherry Knighton (Board Vice President), and Heather Hamilton Hollowell (Board Treasurer)—were joined by Peggy Williams, former Sullivan Senior Center President, who serves as a Board Advisor. Together, they began focusing on the future planning and goals of the upcoming Senior Center. The SSC Board was further strengthened through the appointment of two additional members, Phyllis Pittman and Kristine Stucky, each bringing valuable expertise to the team.

With the November arrival of the modular segments in Sanger, the SSC Board (Sanger, TX Senior Center) has been diligently working on the necessary paperwork that would lay the founda-

tion for the SSC programs and facility as well as pave the way to completing their non-profit application with the State of Texas.

Unlike most Senior Centers managed by city governments, the Sanger, TX Senior Center (SSC) operates independently. Its day-to-day operations and management will continue as before, directed by an elected board of Seniors. Unlike other centers, SSC does not receive city budget funding; however, as they lease a city-owned facility, they will receive the same building maintenance and care as other city properties, which is very beneficial.

The SSC Board consists of elected volunteers, with five members responsible for overseeing facility operations, delivering daily programs, and coordinating events during these initial months. The Board will be actively recruiting additional volunteers who can contribute their skills and time, as well as individuals interested in serving on various planning committees. Operational funding for SSC programming, insurance, and daily needs will be sourced from membership dues, business sponsorships, and periodic fundraising activities. The upcoming priority for the SSC is to secure its non-profit status, which will enable the organization to apply for grants and other forms of funding to further sustain and enhance its operations.

Upon opening, the facility will operate five days a week with morning and afternoon hours (closed for lunch from 12-1 PM) and offer evening sessions on two designated days. They will offer plenty of opportunities for you to engage with others from your community.

Pickleball and swimming will not be

available; however, the center will provide opportunities for connection with both old and new friends. Current programming will include a men's coffee hour and men's social game time, access to exercise equipment, a walking group, puzzle library, knitting and crochet time, and you might even see chair volleyball on the schedule. Most importantly, they are committed to listening to your feedback and adapting accordingly. Rather than coming up with a predetermined schedule (and they do have plenty of ideas), they will welcome your input to help determine some of their future program offerings.

Their "resident" membership is open to persons 50+ years of age or older from Sanger, Bolivar, Krum, and Valley View. They will also accept memberships from outside those areas. They encourage you to: attend the Ribbon Cutting on May 7th at 11:00 am and Open House Event following the Ceremony (open until 7:00 pm). Where: 125 Bolivar Street Sanger (corner of 2nd and Bolivar).

They will also have times the following week to visit with them and come ask questions: May 11th, 1-3 & 5-7; May 12th 10-2; May 13th 1-3; May 14th 10-2.

Their weekly schedule for members will begin the week of May 18th. Day passes can be purchased for drop-in visits. Feel free to stop by during open hours if you want to ask questions or get membership information - one of our Board members will be pleased to talk to you about membership and our programs. Burnout Isn't Laziness: Signs You're Running on Empty (and What Helps)

A lot of people in our community are doing the most—and still feeling like it's not enough.

You're showing up for work. You're caring for kids, parents, or a household. You're handling appointments, bills, and responsibilities. And yet, you feel exhausted, irritable, numb, or like you can't catch your breath.

Many people call this "stress," but what they're describing is often burnout.

Burnout isn't a character flaw. It isn't laziness. It's what happens when your mind and body have been carrying too much for too long without enough recovery.

What burnout can

look like
Burnout isn't just being tired. It can affect your emotions, your body, and your ability to function day-to-day. Common signs include:

- Feeling drained no matter how much you sleep
- Dreading tasks that used to feel manageable
- Irritability, impatience, or feeling "short" with the people you care about
- Brain fog, forgetfulness, or trouble focusing
- Feeling detached, numb, or like you're just going through the motions
- Increased anxiety, overwhelm, or crying frequently
- Physical symptoms like headaches, stomach problems, or

muscle tension
Sometimes burnout shows up as over-functioning—you keep pushing, but it costs you your peace. Why burnout happens
Burnout often comes from a mix of:

- Too many demands (work, caregiving, emotional labor)
- Too little support
- Not enough rest or boundaries
- Ongoing stress that never resolves
- Feeling like you have to be "the strong one"

And for many people, the hardest part is this: you can't simply "take a week off" from your life.

That's why burnout recovery is less about a perfect vacation and more about building sustainable patterns.

Three small shifts that help (without overhauling your life)
You don't have to fix everything at once. Start with one of these:

1. Lower the bar on non-essentials. Ask, "What actually has to be done today?" Give yourself permission to do "good enough."

2. Create a daily 10-minute reset. A short walk, sitting outside in the sun, stretching, or quietly focusing on your breathing can help your nervous system come down from being in constant alert.

3. Practice one boundary sentence. Try: "I can't take that on right now," or "I need to think about it and get back to you." Boundaries are a powerful burnout prevention tool.

- Identify what's draining you (and what's within your control)
- Build coping skills for stress and anxiety
- Work through guilt around rest and boundaries
- Improve sleep and emotional regulation

Is your home really protected from natural disasters?

homeowner's policy protects against a natural disaster's damage, consider these three things:

Coverage amounts: These should reflect what it would cost to rebuild your home in today's market, not what you paid for it years ago. One option is to add inflation protection, which automatically adjusts coverage amounts based on current costs in your area.

Personal property coverage: Make a list of important belongings and their estimated values to gauge whether your existing coverage is adequate. Keep in mind that high-value items, such as jewelry or fine art, may require additional coverage.

Loss of Use or Additional Living Expenses (ALE): If a disaster makes your home unlivable, this coverage helps pay for hotel stays, temporary apart-

ment rentals and even extra meal costs while your home is being repaired or rebuilt. These costs can add up, so this coverage can be a big help during a crisis.

Standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover every disaster and typically excludes floods – including those that follow a hurricane – and earthquakes. These require separate policies. If you live in an area prone to either, those additions could be worth the additional expense.

If your premiums feel too high, there are ways to lower them without sacrificing coverage. You might qualify for savings with automatic payments or by bundling your home and auto policies. Raising your deductible is another option, although it means you'll pay more out of pocket before coverage kicks in, so make sure your

emergency fund can handle the difference.

If you need help after a disaster, contact your insurance agent or broker quickly. Keep their information somewhere you can access at any moment, even if your phone is dead or the power is out. It's also smart to keep your financial advisor's contact information handy for help assessing the financial impact of a disaster and prioritizing short-term cash needs.

It's also a good idea to review your homeowners policy at least every five years. You might need to review it sooner if something could affect your coverage needs, such as a

home renovation or a significant increase in construction costs. Ongoing reviews help ensure your coverage keeps pace with your home's value and the risks in your area. The time you spend going over

your policy now could save you stress when it matters most.

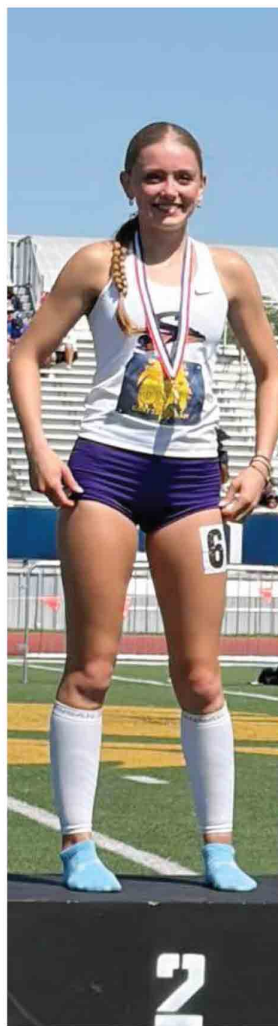
