Election information 2020

Deadline to register to vote - Oct. 5; to request a ballot by mail - Oct. 23

Some deadlines are nearing for the 2020 Election. Right now, everyone needs to be sure that they are registered to vote at his or her current address.

Denton County residents can go to votedenton.com to check.

The DEADLINE TO REGISTER OR CHANGE INFORMATION IS OCTOBER 5th. If changes are needed, the best idea is to go to the Denton County Elections office at 701 Kimberly in Denton and do it in person if at all possible. Also: Check at the Sanger Public Library, Sanger Chamber of Commerce, and Gypsy Cowgirl for voter registration cards.

Anyone in Texas can check on voter registration at the Secretary of State Election Division website at votetexas.gov. Look at "Am I Registered?"

Both of the websites have information on registration, on vote by mail, and much more.

If you have any questions after looking at these websites, call the Denton Elections Office at (940) 349-3200.

EARLY VOTING IS OCTOBER 13-30! As election time draws closer, please CAREFULLY check where you can cast your ballot. Polling places change, so be sure to go to votedenton.com. **Sanger residents will notice many location changes.** The Sanger News will list all the polling locations and both sample

ballots in the coming weeks.

Early voting is your best bet because you can vote at any early voting site in the county in which you are registered.

On November 3rd, you have to go to your specific precinct polling location.

Many people want to know where they can find factual, non-partisan, information on the candidates which will appear on their ballot. A great website for this is the League of Women Voters site, vote411.org

The most important thing you can all do is to be sure that you are informed individuals who go vote and each and every election.

Election day is Tuesday, November 3, 2020.

The deadline for registering by mail to vote is (postmarked by) Monday, October 5, 2020.

The deadline to register in person to vote is Monday, October 5, 2020.

The deadline to request a ballot by mail is (received by) Friday, October 23, 2020.

The early voting period runs from Tuesday, October 13, 2020 to Friday, October 30, 2020, but dates and hours may vary based on where you live. Denton County residents need to check at votedenton.com

Sanger Library Open for Computer Use, Browsing by Appointment

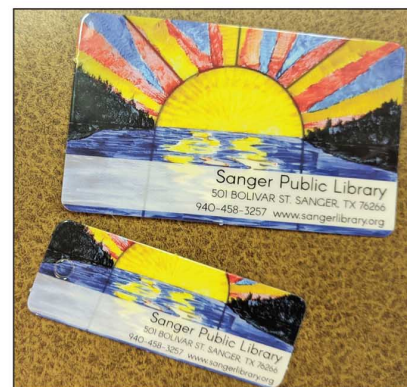

The latest step in the library's phased reopening has been making all of the shelves available for browsing; patrons are now able to come in and pick out books and other circulating materials! Computer use on one of three available workstations is also by appointment.

With the limited space in the library's small building and the continued need for physical distancing, the decision was made to keep the appointment system for now. Curbside pickup no longer requires an appointment after the notification that requested items have been put on hold, just a call to let staff know the patron is on his or her way so that materials can be checked out and be ready for pickup.

Appointments are generally limited to 30 minutes and can be scheduled between the hours of 10:30 am-5:30 pm Monday-Thursday, 10:30 am-4:30 pm on Fridays and 10:30 am-1:30 pm on Saturdays by either calling the library or filling out the online form on the website at www.sangerlibrary.org.

If you don't have a Sanger library card, now would be a good time to get one since September is Library Card Signup Month! The American Library Association

Lessons from Experienced Investors

Those who have lived a long time have done a lot, seen a lot – and can teach us a lot. And that's certainly true when it comes to investing.

Consider some of the lessons you might learn from experienced investors:

Regulate your emotions. In the investment world, there's always something coming at us that could sound scary: political flashpoints, economic news, and even those once-in-a-generation occurrences, such as the COVID-19 pandemic. But older people may take these events in stride; in fact, baby boomers and members of the Silent Generation (born between 1925 and 1945) are coping better emotionally with the impacts of COVID-19 than younger age cohorts, according to the 2020 Edward Jones/Age Wave Four Pillars of the New Retirement study. And by keeping control of your emotions, you may be less likely to make moves such as selling quality investments with good fundamentals just because their prices have fallen in the

midst of an overall market decline.

Learn from experience. By definition, the older we get, the more experiences we will have. And most people do indeed learn from experience. Investors, too, benefit from having seen and done things before. Did you chase a “hot” stock only to have found it cooled off before you bought it? Did you buy too many of the same type of investments, only to see your portfolio take a bigger hit during a downturn than it would have if you had diversified? In the investment arena, as in most walks of life, patterns emerge, and once you learn to recognize them, you can learn from past mistakes.

Know yourself. When we reach a certain age, most of us know ourselves pretty well. But you don't have to wait decades to gain this knowledge – at least not when it comes to investing. For example, you should quickly gain a good sense of your ability to withstand risk. How? Just consider how you react when the market declines sharply. If you find yourself losing sleep over your losses – even if they're just on paper – you might be taking on too much risk for your own comfort level. Conversely, if market downturns don't bother you as much as lack of growth in your portfolio, you might be investing too conservatively for your

own risk tolerance.

Take a longer-term perspective. When we're young, we sometimes are more inclined to desire instant gratification – we want results now. Translated into the investment world, this could mean we want to see big returns in a short period. However, despite the popular mythology, it's quite hard to turn enormous profits on investments overnight – or even over weeks or months. But as the years pass, we learn the value of thinking long-term – how investments we made years ago, and have added to steadily, are now yielding results that can help build the resources we need to reach our objectives.

Don't go it alone. Some of us, when we're young, have a tendency to think we have all the answers and don't need much help in our endeavors. But age gives us the wisdom to recognize that, although we may have acquired much knowledge over the years, we can still use some help in specialized areas, such as creating a long-term investment strategy.

These suggestions are appropriate for anyone – and they can help you on your journey toward your goals.

Most of Texas will be able to loosen some coronavirus restrictions, including letting many businesses increase their capacity to 75%

Retail stores, restaurants and office buildings, which have been open at 50% capacity, will be permitted to expand to 75% capacity. Hospitals will be allowed to offer elective procedures again, and nursing homes can reopen for visitations under certain standards.

The new reopening stage applies to 19 of the state's 22 hospital regions. The three hospital regions excluded are in the Rio Grande Valley, Laredo and Victoria. Abbott said those regions' hospitalizations are still “in the danger zone,” which he defined as places where coronavirus patients make up 15% or more of all hospitalizations.

At the same time, Abbott said the state was not yet ready to reopen bars, saying they are “nationally recognized as COVID-spreading locations.” He stressed, though, that the state is looking for ways to let bars reopen safely.

Abbott unveiled the new standard during a news conference last Thursday at the Texas Capitol that marked Abbott's first major announcement about the re-

opening process since early summer. In late June, Abbott shut down bars and ordered restaurants to scale back to 50% capacity as case numbers started to surge.

Days later, Abbott issued a statewide mask mandate.

A few weeks later, key coronavirus metrics began to trend downward. Those statistics include daily new cases, daily new deaths, hospitalizations and the positivity rate. For example, the state reported 3,249 hospitalizations last Wednesday, a drop from several days in July when the tally was above 10,000 but still higher than springtime numbers than hovered around 2,000 or lower. Also, last Wednesday, the seven-day average of daily new cases was 3,415 – again, a significant decline from July highs but still clearly above the levels in April, May and June.

Still, there have been

regular questions about the reliability of the state data. Last week, state health officials announced they were changing the way they calculate the positivity rate – the ratio of cases to tests – an acknowledgment that the previous method was flawed.

The governor reminded Texans that doctors have said the goal is not to eradicate the virus but to “contain the disease, to limit its harm and to maximize the health care system's ability to treat both COVID patients as well as other medical needs of the community.”

When it comes to further reopenings, he emphasized the state will consider all data but “rely most heavily” on hospitalizations, calling that metric the “most important information about the severity of COVID in any particular region.” It is also the “most accurate

formation available on a daily basis,” Abbott said.

To that end, the regions that will be allowed to further reopen must have seen coronavirus hospitalizations make up less than 15% of all hospitalizations for seven consecutive days, according to the governor. If coronavirus hospitalizations rise above the 15% threshold for seven consecutive days in a region, a “course correction is going to be needed,” Abbott said, suggesting the solution would be a reversal of the area's latest reopenings.

In addition to stores, restaurants and offices, the businesses that will be able to shift to 75% capacity on Monday include manufacturers, museums, libraries and gyms.

As for elective procedures, Abbott said the restoration is effective immediately. In early July, also as part of Abbott's response to the statewide surge, Abbott expanded a ban on elective surgeries to cover more than 100 counties across much of the state.

The new rules governing nursing-home visitation go into effect Sept. 24. They apply to “all nursing-home facilities, assisted-living centers, state supported living centers and other long-term care facilities,” Abbott said.

After Abbott's news conference, the state Health and Human Services Commission detailed the new visitation rules. They allow residents to designate up to two “essential family caregivers” who will be trained and then permitted to go inside a resident's room for a scheduled visit. The designated caregivers do not have to socially distance from the resident, but only one is allowed to visit at a time.

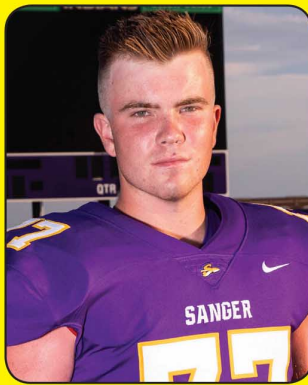

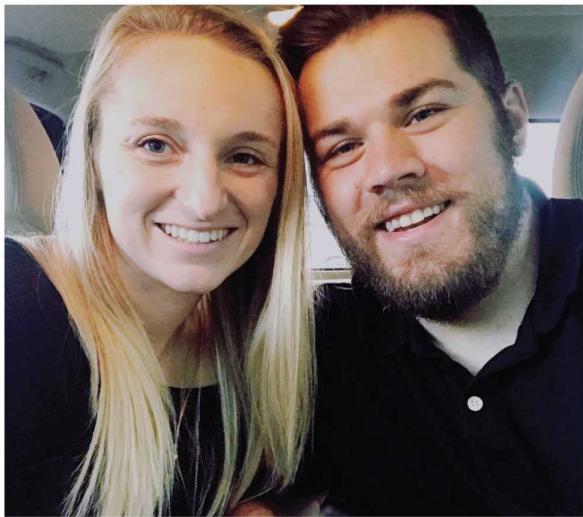

2020 North Texas Fair and Rodeo approved for October 16-24, 2020

The North Texas Fair Association will cut crowds in half — but the bulls and broncos will still buck, and the music will go on as scheduled.

After Denton Mayor Chris Watts green-lighted the 2020 North Texas Fair and Rodeo last week, officials said they're preparing to stage the city's biggest event as safely as possible. Organizers announced the local event was planned but postponed about the same time the State Fair of Texas announced the 2020 event had been canceled.

The local fair and rodeo will open Oct. 16 and run through Oct. 24. The popular annual North Texas Fair and Rodeo Parade will take to the streets at 10 a.m. Oct. 17.

"Basically, whatever local COVID-19 mandates require us to do, we will do," said Glenn Carlton, the executive director of the fair association. "We are under a mask mandate, and we ask our patrons to comply with it. If the [pandemic] improves, we might relax it, but for now, we will ask patrons to wear a mask."

The bulk of the fair and rodeo takes place outdoors, and Carlton said officials will halve attendance so that attendees can practice social distancing.

"In the rodeo arena, the [seating capacity] is 4,000," Carlton said. "So we're going to keep everything to 50% of that capacity, and on a first-come, first-served basis. That really should only be a problem on Friday and Saturday. People might not be able to get tickets for those days, but during the week, the attendance is less."

The fair has a contingency plan for both weekends. Rodeo events and concerts will be broadcast on a screen set up in the grassy area of the fairgrounds.

"People can bring their lawn chairs and set up on the grass and see the events. Same thing with the concerts," Carlton said.

During the concerts, fair staff will set up barricades around the main stage, and capacity in that area will be reduced to accommodate 877 people.

"Overflow for the concerts will be in the rodeo arena, and we'll run our concerts on the Fun Zone screen, too, on the lawn," Carlton said. "Normally, our concert area is about 7,000 square feet. With the addition of the screens, our concerts have 90,000 square feet."

Mayor Chris Watts said he decided to give the rodeo a green light because the association provided a sound plan.

"I think it was pretty simple. No. 1, they presented a very comprehensive safety plan," he said. "No. 2, the issue, it seemed, with the council body, was: Do we want to add additional restrictions above and beyond the declaration? We didn't need to do that because the safety plan was comprehensive."

Watts said Gov. Greg Abbott's declaration already exempts part of the fair, permitting rodeos to continue. The council could regulate some of the event's features, but Watts said the association took pains to enlarge common areas and add spaces for people to gather.

"They created a plan with public safety in mind, so we didn't need to add any requirements," Watts said.

J.C. Kieffer, a coordinator for the livestock contests, said competi-

tions have been going on throughout the pandemic. At the North Texas Fair and Rodeo, livestock

Carlton said volunteers will ask people to wear masks and follow the rules, should they see someone shirking them. For food, games and rides, the event again will use a payment system that requires patrons to load money onto a wristband — known as Magic Money — at kiosks or through a smartphone app.

"We'll have volunteers stationed at all those kiosks to disinfect them, but you can just load money onto it using our app and not have to touch anything," he said.

Admission costs \$15 for adults Monday through Wednesday and before 6 p.m. Thursday through Sunday, and \$20 on Thursday through Sunday nights. A four-

day ticket costs \$60, and a season pass costs \$120. Senior and military admission costs \$14 at the gate with proper identification or military documentation. Teachers can get in at \$5 off at the gate with valid school ID. Children ages 7 to 12 get in for \$5, and admission is free for ages 6 and younger.



competitors will have to wear masks, practice social distancing and observe spacing guidelines in the bleachers when watching the shows. Handlers will march their cattle, lambs, goats and pigs in front of judges and onlookers to see which competitor has reared an animal that meets breed standards.

"It's actually fairly easy to control the animals' spacing," she said. "The competitions are already divided into smaller groups for judging, too."
