Sanger man drowns at Lake Ray Roberts

The body of a 63-year-old man who was reported missing Sunday at Lake Ray Roberts has been recovered, according to Texas Parks and Wildlife officials.

Texas Game Wardens said the victim, identified as Charles Luksich of Sanger, was found Monday, March 30, by the agency's Underwater Search and Recovery Team.

Witnesses told investigators Luksich had jumped off a boat to swim and cool down on March 29, but went underwater

and did not resurface. Officials said Luksich was not believed to have been wearing a life vest at the time.

Texas Game Wardens and Lewisville Fire officials said much of the search was focused near the Isle du Bois area, close to a boat ramp where Luksich was last reported seen. Crews used side-scan sonar and other equipment to search the lake, where windy conditions and depths reaching 65 feet made recovery efforts difficult, officials said.

"Our thoughts are with Mr. Luksich's family and friends during this difficult time," the agency said in a statement.

The search involved multiple agencies, including the Texas State Park Police, Lewisville Fire Department and Dive Team, Pilot Point and Denton Fire Departments, and TowBoat U.S.

Family members remained at the lake throughout much of the search Monday and requested privacy.



Lewisville Dive Team and Battalion Chief 1 been dispatched mutual aid to assist in the search, Dive 2 utilized their special "Sea Legs" vessel. The amphibious boat utilizes high-definition sonar to scan the lake floor and covers large areas quickly to provide the best possible chance for a resolution.

STEPHEN BAKER STATUE FUND-RAISING

Unveiling will be September 11, 2026 at the Homecoming Game

The Stephen Baker Memorial Fund Committee is updating the community on the status of fund-raising for the statue of Stephen Baker to be placed at Stephen Baker Field at Indian Stadium.

The bronze casting company also was responsible for the horse and Indian statue located in front of the current middle school (formerly high school.) The artist is working on the maquette for the committee to review and will be available within the next two weeks. "We met with the artist several weeks ago, and were impressed for the research he was performing on how the shoulder pads fit on the backside of the players at that time, and also researching what football cleats looked like in the early 1960s. He is very detailed in his work and our expectation is a statue that will look like Stephen in 1964," said Tona Batis, of the Memorial Fund Committee.

"The Committee is very excited as we near the completion and installation late summer. As of this date funds remaining to be required are a little under \$14,000 from the total contract amount of \$97,500. We are very proud of the community who has an interest in preserving our history and remembering Stephen Baker with the beautiful 7-1/2 foot statue being placed at Stephen Baker Field at Indian Stadium.

The statue unveiling will be performed at the Sanger ISD Homecoming game on September 11, 2026. It is an event you will not want to miss.

Stephen Rory Baker is prominently remembered by the residents who resided in Sanger during the 40s, 50s, and 60s. Stephen was beginning his junior year in high school when a tragic event occurred on August 27, 1964 that ultimately took the life of this outstanding young man. A quarterback-sneak was the final event of Stephen's life He was taken to Parkland Hospital in Dallas late that Thursday afternoon, where the doctors performed surgery to release pressure in his brain. However, early Saturday morning, he succumbed to his injury. Classmates crowded the emergency room of Parkland, awaiting good news from the doctors, but it was not to be.

Four stages of raising confident, money-smart kids

Good financial habits are a little like brushing your teeth. When you learn them early, they become second nature, and you carry them with you for life. And while money can feel complicated, especially today, the foundation starts simply.

Parents can begin the conversation with very young children, and young adults can build on those basics as they take on more responsibility. Step by step, these habits create confidence that helps build long

term financial security and a more fulfilling life.

The following are the four key stages of financial growth.

Stage 1: For very young children, the goal is to make money feel simple and manageable. A great place to start is with three jars labeled "Spend," "Save" and "Share." When kids can actually see their money grow or shrink, the idea starts to make sense. Saving also introduces them to goal setting, and working toward paying for a small toy or outing teaches patience. Most important, you're helping your children see money as a tool they can

understand easily and use with confidence.

Stage 2: If you have tweens (children roughly 9 to 12 years old), they're usually ready for slightly bigger financial ideas. This is a great time for them to earn money through chores or small jobs, helping them see the connection between effort and reward and building a sense of ownership. Conversations about needs versus wants also become more meaningful, because kids are now making real choices with money they earned themselves. Your tween may be ready for a simple savings account to watch their savings grow,

or a reloadable cash card for spending.

Stage 3: By the time teens reach high school or young adulthood, budgeting becomes essential. This doesn't need to be overly strict or complicated. A simple system that helps them track deposits and withdrawals can make all the difference. Whether they use an app, a paper notebook or a spreadsheet, the real goal is awareness. Teenagers also benefit from learning how credit works. Understanding how to build a healthy credit score and how to use credit wisely protects them from costly mistakes in later life.

Stage 4: Then come the early working years, when habits shift from learning to building. One of the smartest steps at this stage is paying yourself first. Automatic transfers to savings or retirement accounts help establish stability without extra effort. Even small retirement contributions matter more than most people realize, because time allows compounding to do the heavy lifting. This is also when young adults can start organizing their money into different buckets for rent, automobile payments, emergencies, retirement and everyday spending.

These habits help lay the groundwork for financial freedom down the road.

Throughout every stage, the theme is confidence. Each small success creates a sense of control and each good habit makes the next one easier. Over time, these habits turn into a lifetime of financial security and fulfillment. When you start strong and stay consistent, money becomes a tool that helps your children support the lives they want.

Everyday Courage—Normalizing Conversations About Mental Health

Talking about your own personal mental health experiences with others can feel daunting, but every conversation helps break down stigma and builds a more supportive community. These don't have to be big, dramatic moments or heavy conversations. Sometimes, it can be as simple as checking in with a neighbor or sharing your own story when it feels right.

Maybe you mention to a friend that you've been feeling anxious, or you ask a coworker how they are really doing. These small moments of honesty create space for others to feel more comfortable being real, and to open up about their experiences too. When we're honest about our feelings, we give others permission to do the same.

If you are a parent or caregiver, talking about emotions with kids is especially important. Let them know it is okay to feel sad, worried, or angry sometimes, and that asking for help is always an option. Model healthy coping strategies like taking deep breaths, going for a walk, or reaching out to talk to a trusted adult so

they see that mental health is a normal part of life. When children witness adults naming and managing their feelings, it helps them feel safe to do the same.

It takes courage to start these conversations, but you do not have to have all the answers. Just being open and willing to listen is enough. If you are met with silence or discomfort, that is okay, keep the door open and let people know you care. Sometimes, the simple act of asking "How are you, really?" or sharing "I've had a hard week, too," can make all the difference.

You might also try regular check-ins at home or work, using supportive language and celebrating efforts to seek help or practice self-care, no matter how small. Remind yourself and others that everyone struggles sometimes, and that needing support is a sign of strength, not weakness.

As a community, the more we talk about mental health, the easier it becomes for everyone to seek support when needed. Whether you are reaching out for yourself or someone else, know that you are not alone.

New Hope Counseling Services is always here to help guide these conversations and provide support, no pressure, just people helping people. Let's keep talking, keep listening, and keep caring.

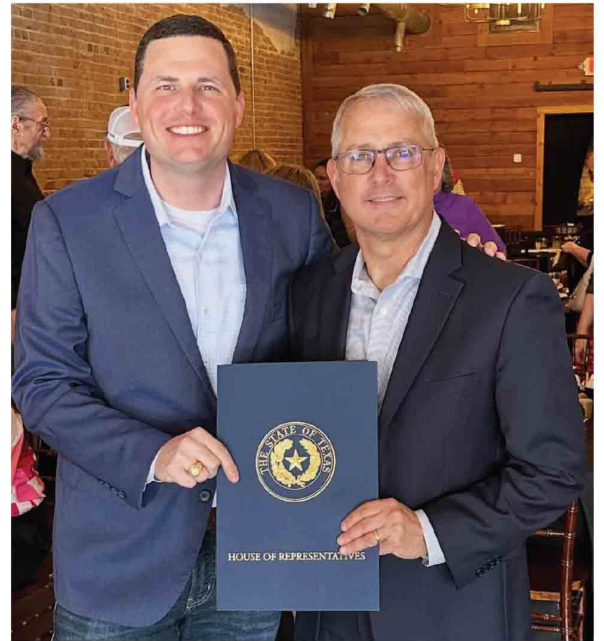

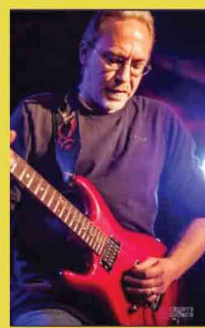

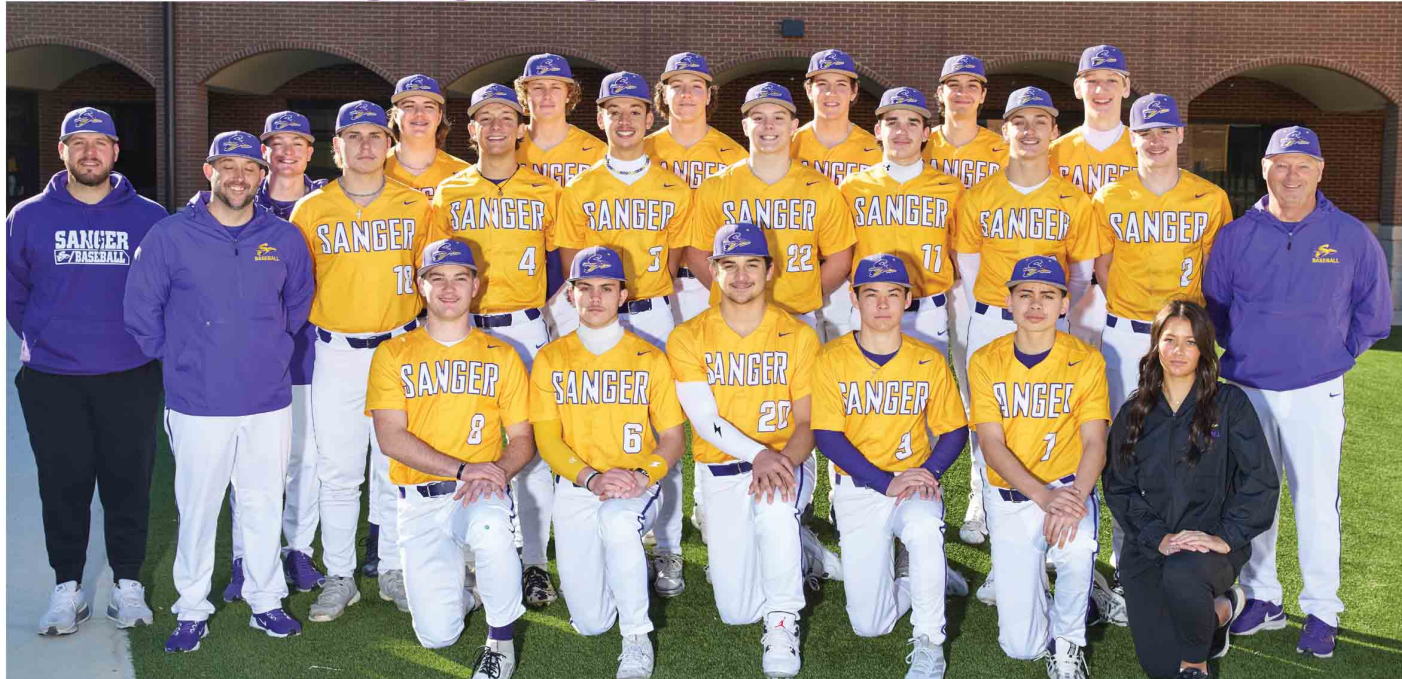

TAKING CARE OF WHAT WE'VE BEEN GIVEN

When a new school bond comes before the citizens of Sanger, one concern I often hear is this: that students don't always respect the facilities that have been provided. I've heard that many times. And I'll admit, I've probably said something similar myself in the past.

But this year, I've paid closer attention to how our students, teachers, staff, and administrators treat the new facilities built from the 2022 bond.

While I can't speak for every campus, I can tell you what I've seen at the Athletic Fieldhouse. Our Head Football Coach invited me to watch offseason workouts. The weight room was full of over 80 boys lifting. Weights, bars, and boys were everywhere. At first glance, it looked like complete chaos.

But then you start to notice—it's actually very organized. Weights on the floor were set aside for the next group. There was a rhythm to it.

What stood out to me most came at the end of the workout. The music switched to the "Clean Up Song" from Barney the Dinosaur. And just like that, every boy in the room started putting things away. Weights, bars, clips—everything went back exactly where it belonged. Even the Sanger logo on each weight was lined up just right.

I asked Coach Rogers how many laps they had to run before they learned to do that.

He said, "None."

Those young men weren't being forced to take care of that space. They wanted to. They understood what they had been given, and they took pride in it.

That moment stuck with me. It reminded me that these facilities aren't taken for granted—they're respected, used, and cared for by the students who walk through those doors every day. That told me something important—what we invest in here is taken seriously.

The buildings in our district are more than just structures. They belong to all of us. And like anything we care about, there comes a time when we need to take care of them so they can continue to serve well. And when something is cared for like that, it's worth continuing to invest in.

Part of the 2026 bond does just that.

A good example is the Metal Fabrication Shop. When it was built, it met the needs of the time and served students well. And in many ways, it still has. But like any building, there comes a time when important systems start wearing out. Things like HVAC, lighting, and other essential parts of the building are near, or already at, the end of their life cycle and need to be replaced.

And this matters, because in Sanger ISD, career and technical education isn't a small part of what we do—it's a big part of it. Around 93% of our students are involved in some form of CTE, and many of them are able to earn certifications before they graduate. That gives them a real head start as they move into the workforce.

With the improvements included in this bond, that shop can continue to be a place where students learn valuable, real-world skills—skills that can lead to good-paying jobs and meaningful work.

The 2026 bond also addresses other older buildings across the district, helping ensure they continue to serve students the way they were meant to.

I love driving by our new high school and seeing how well it's being used. It's something this community can be proud of.

We've been given something good here in Sanger. It's worth taking care of.

I believe this bond helps us do that—not just for today, but for the students coming behind us.

I hope you'll join me in voting yes.


