be shelled. Being the big sister I, of course, I wanted to get my younger sisshelling. So, I said "Baruse them." Now my sister was not into cooking at all and had not been paying much attention to what I was doing she grumbled a bit and after a few minutes presented me with a plate on which she had broken 5 eggs. I guess you could say there was a bit of a com-Maybe at a later date I will share with you how to transport 5 eggs from a flat plate and get them into a more usable container. I assure you that since I was only about ten years old adult logic was not a part you take your chances. of the equation. But that is enough of that.

We have looked somewhat briefly at the difficulties encountered when giving directions of all sorts whether they be in how to get somewhere specific or to do something we need done. Now, let's take a moment to look back over our life. How many times have you said, been told, overheard the following: "because I said so." I don't know about you but my personal experience as a teacher and parent would want me to answer that though I had have heard it used, the phrase was not part of my communication arsenal. But, since I always try to be truthful I would have to admit that I would not be able to give an accurate number. Sometimes "because I said so," is the only truly workable phrase for the situation. If any parent was being forth coming, they

would have to admit that the phrase was a major item in the parental communication toolbox. As a child I drove my mother to use that phrase on a rather consistent basis because of ter to do the dirty work of my incessant need to know "why." Why carry an umbara, I need five eggs on brella, it's not raining right the blue plate where I can now. Why can't I eat just 5 more pieces of my Halloween Candy? Why can't I stay up and give Santa his cookies myself? Why do I have to eat spinach ugh just because some other child is starving? Seemingly logical answers do not serve in these instances. Or, I guess that sometimes munication breakdown. a more complete answer would just take too long or fly over the mark.

> Whether giving directions or trying to explain why something can or cannot be done anytime you share information And if you want to go into more serious territory then what about sharing likes, dislikes, love, hate, disgust, or any emotion. Sharing of my thoughts there will wait for another time. There is a world of communication pitfalls out there just waiting to ensnare us in a swamp of misunderstanding and confusion. To mix my metaphors here that gives me, a communication junkie, food for thought.

But let me close with this much more uplifting thought from Psalm 141:3: "Set a guard over my mouth, Lord; keep watch over the door of my lips". Sending you blessings. Will share more thoughts
