Early Voting for March 3 Primary begins Feb. 18

Denton County Sheriff and Sanger resident Tracy Murphree has drawn two opponents from deep within the county's law enforcement bench, making the race for the Republican nomination a battle.

Bryan "Wilkie" Wilkinson, 47, a former jailer and retired deputy with supervisory experience, and Dugan Broomfield, 62, assistant chief investigator with the district attorney's office, are vying to unseat Murphree, 53.

The winner of the Republican nomination is likely to win the office in November, as no Democrat has filed to run for sheriff.

The primary election is March 3. Early Voting runs February 18-28 at the Church of Christ in Sanger and many other locations throughout Denton County. The hours for Sanger are 7am-7pm Feb. 22-28. Feb. 18-21 is 7am-5pm.

If no candidate wins the majority outright on March 3, the top two candidates head to the primary runoff, which will be held May 26.

State Rep. Jared Patterson Wants HOA Residents to Know Their Rights *Homeowners' Associations May Be Unlawfully Prohibiting Political Yard Signs*

It's election season; have you gotten a letter in the mail from your HOA?

State Rep. Jared Patterson wants area residents to know that the law is on their side.

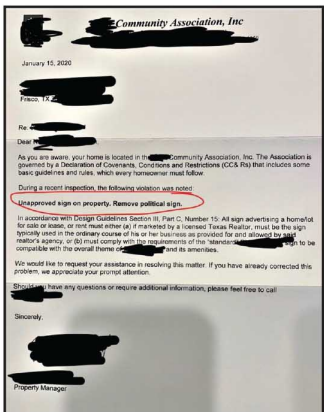
"This is not a partisan issue, this is a First Amendment and property rights issue," Patterson says. "State law protects the rights of HOA residents to have at least one political yard sign within 90 days of an upcoming election."

He's referring to Section 259.002 of the Texas Election Code, which reads:

... a property owners' association may not enforce or adopt a restrictive covenant that prohibits a property owner from displaying . . . one or more signs advertising a candidate or measure for an election...

While HOA's can't altogether prohibit political yard signs, state law does reserve HOAs' right to adopt some restrictions including: the size, number, mounting method, materials used, prohibiting vulgar content and any possible public safety hazards from some of the

Deadline to run for school board, city council and mayor is Friday, Feb. 14

The deadline to file for a place on the Sanger ISD board or City of Sanger, council or mayor is Friday, February 14 at 5 p.m. Incumbent Mitch Hammonds (Place 6) and newcomer Zach Thompson (Place 7) have already signed up for Sanger school board. Two people have picked up election packets for Place 1, but have not returned them as of Wednesday morning. Place 1 is currently held by Jimmy Howard, who said he plans to turn his packet in later this week.

Gleason (Place 7) announced he will not be running for another term. Howard is the current vice-president and has been on the board since 2011 and served three terms. Gleason was elected to the school board in 2014 and served two terms.

Gleason emailed a statement to the Sanger News this week: "I am not running for a third term on the Sanger ISD Board of Trustees. My two terms on the board have been the most rewarding volunteer endeavor in my life. My association with tens of thousands of dedicated volunteers, teachers, administrators, and lawmakers to maintain and increase educational opportunities for all children is difficult to put into

Homeowners vote yes for TxDOT noise wall barrier on I-35

Nelson L. Underwood, Advanced Project Development for the Dallas District of TxDOT confirmed recently that the proposed noise wall barrier on I-35 in Sanger got enough yes votes by homeowners affected by the project and was approved, recently. All that is left is to get the results to TxDOT's Environmental Specialist.

TxDOT hosted a workshop on October 29, 2019 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at Butterfield Elementary School at 291 Indian Lane in Sanger. TxDOT proposed to construct one noise barrier along the northbound frontage road of I-35 for residences along Carolyn Drive, Allen Drive, and Stephen Drive. A formal presentation was made to provide the owners of the property affected with sufficient information to make an informed decision about it. TxDOT wanted to give sufficient time for the homeowners affected to vote yes or no and homeowners were allowed to mail in their ballot votes.

In 2018, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) conducted a traffic noise analysis in Sanger as part of the environmental assessment for improvements to I-35 in Denton and Cooke Counties. In accordance with TxDOT's Guidelines for Analysis and Abatement of Highway Traffic Noise, the proposed noise barrier could not be constructed without the approval, by simply majority vote, of the owners of property adjacent to the proposed barrier. The opportunity to vote, for or against the proposed noise barrier, was limited to the owners of property right next to it, because they would be most affected by the noise associated with highway traffic, as well as presence/appearance of the noise barrier.

The wall barrier will coincide with the already approved TxDOT I-35 widening expansion that will take place in the coming years from Hwy 380 in Denton to Valley View.

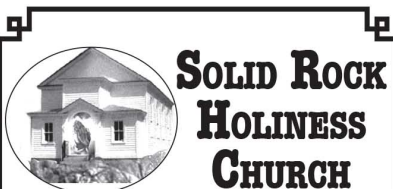

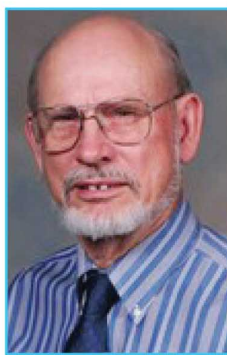

James Dale Davis

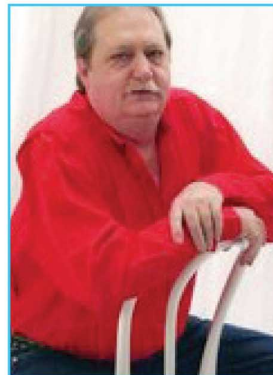

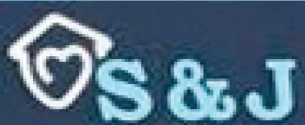

more "creative" signs that may distract motorists.

"We've been getting a lot of calls and emails from constituents telling us that their HOA has sent a letter

stating that they have to take down their yard sign. This tells me that many HOAs may not be familiar with the protection for residents in state law," Patterson said.

"We just want to raise awareness for both HOAs and residents who may run into this as we go into an election year. We want to

make sure all HOA rules are compliant with state law, and we want anyone with questions or issues to know that they can reach out to our office for help."

We really showed mental toughness down the stretch and did a great job closing on the game."

The public school system is able to educate, feed, and meet children's social and emotional needs. 2) The teacher is the most important influencer on the child's education success. 3) I am less critical of the public school system after 5.5 years of intense study through volunteering to throw my hat into an election!

Thank you to all the dedicated volunteers whose names I see time and time again signing up to help insure our tax dollars are maximized to benefit all children!"

Incumbent Jimmy Howard said Wednesday morning he has picked up a packet and is planning on running for another term for Place 1.

On the city side, incumbent Sanger Mayor Thomas Muir has filed to run for re-election. Bilyeu and Joe Falls have both picked up packets, but haven't returned them as of Wednesday morning.

Paperwork must be filed by 5 p.m. on Friday, February 14 at Sanger City Hall and SISD Administration Building.

Muir emailed a statement this week: "Serving my local community is important to me; this is the reason I have chosen to hold a public office over the past years. My wife, Elizabeth, and I both grew up in Sanger and have a heart for the community. We have raised our family in Sanger and want it to be a great place for our kids both now and into the future. Sanger is growing and it is important to plan for this growth, while continuing to improve current facilities and services as resources allow.
