

system, which uses less water than a sprinkler. A typical drip system includes isolation and control valves, a backflow preventer, filter, adapter, emitters, connecting pipe and tubing. The drip tubing lays on the ground in your bed with emitters placed by the plants or evenly spaced. Adding a three-inch layer of mulch around your vegetable and landscape plants also reduces water consumption by retaining moisture and moderating soil temperatures so that less water is lost to evaporation.

Sanger Buyers Club recognizes scholarship winners



SANGER'S SISTER COMMUNITY - BOLIVAR

Submitted by Sanger Area Historical Society

Bolivar, a small community, approximately five miles west of Sanger, was the original thriving location in northwestern Denton County. The settlement was on Clear Creek, and because of plenty of good water and timber, it became a popular location for people moving west. The Chisolm Trail ran just west of Bolivar, and a need for a community to serve the needs of these trail riders began to flourish. There were routes to the west for those in search of gold. Trading posts were set up along these routes where there could be protection from hostile Indians as they were pushed farther and farther west.

In the late 1840s and early 1850s, the little village that would become Bolivar had 50 to 60 permanent residents. Because the Indian populations were moving westward, the federal government built a fort in 1852, and Bolivar was born. The settlement was close to Clear Creek. Dr. Daily built the first store; a doctor, Methodist preacher, and a carpenter soon followed. Dr. Daily laid out streets to run north and south. When referring to "Main Street," it is now called FM 2450, while First Street is now FM 455.

The town was named New Prospect by Daily. Ben F. Brown had located to the area from Bolivar, Tennessee, and proposed the new name of Bolivar. An election was held, and the Tennessean exchanged mugs of rum for votes for the winner of the new name of Bolivar. Bolivar began to flourish and at one time had four churches, a school building, two hotels, a flour mill, a blacksmith, two stage-lines coming through, and a sawmill and cotton gin.

Jesse Sartin opened the Sartin Hotel, which had a flowing water well in the lobby with his saloon nearby. Other businesses and owners were:

Mr. P.A. Lughinbyhl tells of his father's part in this Indian raid. "The Indian raiders were sighted early in the morning. Demesey Jackson gave the alarm. Chris Lughinbyhl was building the Keep and Terry Mill, a well-known early landmark on the Mill Branch of Clear Creek. The mill was the first grist mill in this part of Denton County. In October 1868, Chris Lughinbyhl was working on the mill and heard the sound of Indians. He quickly hid in the shavings and lumber piles until they passed. In a few minutes, the posse came by, which was following the Indians. Lughinbyhl immediately got his horse, which luckily was overlooked by the Indians traveling in haste, and rode with the men, about 100 in number, who followed the Indians as far south as Denton-Decatur Road where they turned and headed back for Indian Territory." The Denton

Record-Chronicle published a special edition in 1958 listing the men on this ride. Chris Luginbyhl was not named in the article. Lughinbyhl died on May 28, 1910, according to the ledger of the Dr. G.D. Lain.

A settler riding hard to join the posse was not so lucky. A.H. Fortenberry was killed on a prairie north of White's Creek just before he was to join the posse. Fortenberry served in the War Between the States as a Confederate soldier. He was one of a company of 30 men who followed 300 Indians in the northwest part of Denton County. In an article published in Fort Worth and the Texas Northwest, Volume 4, p. 454, the daughter of A.J. Fortenberry (then Mrs. Jane Howard) says the number of Indians was 600; they "scalped him, piled grass on his body,

Bolivar has a rich history in the northwestern Denton County area. Many good families settled in this small community, and detailed information about these families was published by Rheba Marshall and Frances Abelson, which may be found at the SAHS Museum.

Dr. George D. Lain began his practice in Bolivar and moved his family and practice to Sanger in 1900.

- Proof of Residency a current utility bill (the most current bill is required: credit card & cell phone bills, & driver's license not accepted); lease agreement; closing documents on a home; tax or mortgage statement on a home, or a notarized letter stating that the family is living with a Sanger ISD resident along with that resident's proof of residency.
- Most current immunization records

If you cannot upload your documents, you can drop them off at your student's campus. Please besure to provide us with a copy as we cannot return originals. If you need access to a copier, we can assist you at the campus in which you drop off your documents.




