Laazy H Ranch Christmas Light Display is FREE to the public

Christopher and Maggie Holstead, residents of Sanger/ Bolivar, have been putting up their Christmas display since 2019 at 9719 Bernard Road. This display was carried over from their previous home, and with a larger yard in Sanger, they decided to expand it, thanks in part to encouragement from Christopher's father. "My father was very adamant that we should have a big display out here," said Chris. "After he passed away, we saw a news clip about commercial light displays with drive-through options and the prices were insane. We decided we wanted a display that was free so that everyone could enjoy the lights whenever they wanted, regardless of their financial situation.'

When the Holsteads first started, they had trees, their house, bushes, and about 8 to 10 wire frames. Now, they have over 300. While they haven't yet reached the quarter-million light mark, they fully expect to exceed that number next year. Last year, they used 213 extension cords, and they surpassed that number

this year, with a final count expected only after they take down the display in January.

The couple begins decorating on October 1 and typically works 4 to 6 hours a day, taking about six weeks to set up the entire display. It's just Chris and Maggie who put up all the frames and displays, but a couple of neighborhood boys help them wrap the trees.

You can enjoy the stunning display from the warmth

of your vehicle, as it will remain up through January 2. You can see it from dusk to 11:30 p.m., each night.

This isn't just a seasonal project for the Holsteads; they spend the other 46 weeks of the year repairing lights that need replacing and acquiring new wire frames. "We strip them down and re-light them with LED lights in preparation for the next Christmas season," Chris explained.





Franziska K. Torres


September 27, 1938 - November 20, 2025

Sanger TX Senior Center to open in January

The new Sanger TX Senior Center is taking shape on the corner of 2nd and Bolivar Streets. Board President for the Senior Center - Terri Cornwell, wanted seniors to know that the center will be open for membership to Sanger and Krum residents.

TO THE OLD SULLIVAN SENIOR CENTER....

The Sullivan Family Estate reclaimed the old "Rock House" (Sullivan building) in downtown Sanger back in May of this year that had been gifted to the city for the purpose of a Senior Center. As the Senior programs had temporarily halted their programs in that building (and moved to a temporary location) while the process towards renovation/rehab of the Sullivan building was being worked out by the city, the Sullivan Estate, determined they would reclaim the building (as according to the original deed restriction). The Sullivan Family plans to keep the property and try to do the renovations required to bring it up to safety code and lease it for commercial/ retail use. The Senior Center had outgrown that location, as well.

Meanwhile, with the Senior Center program technically without an actual home base of our own, the Sanger City Council determined that investing in a location for a City Senior Center would benefit the community and be an asset for years to come," said Cornwell.

The location of 2nd Street and Bolivar was determined by Mayor Thomas Muir, City Manager John Noblitt and the City Council to be a good spot to temporarily locate the Senior Center since its property (old lumber yard) is already owned by the City of Sanger. The goal of the City Council, in the near future (to facilitate the property being used for its original purchased intent), will be to find a permanent location for the Sanger Tx Senior Center. Eventually, this property will be part of a new downtown park, in the early planning stages.

There is a name change, as well, from Sullivan

HISTORY OF THE ROCK BUILDING

"The Rock Building," holds a special place in Sanger's history as the town's first permanent structure. Built in 1890 by the Huling family using rock from Ganzer Hill, it has served as a store, bar, café, and even as City Hall with a fire station in the rear. In 1900, the property was purchased by John J. and Emily

Ann Sullivan, prominent Denton County pioneers who had 14 children, including Dr. John Morgan Sullivan.

Born on February 7, 1885, in Sanger, Dr. John M. Sullivan was a dedicated physician who returned to his hometown after completing medical school at Fort Worth and Baylor University. Married to Charlotte Elizabeth Gambill in 1916, he became a beloved

figure in the community, known for his tireless service, even swimming across creeks to reach patients and delivering an estimated 3,500 babies during his 47-year career. Dr. Sullivan was also a committed member of the Methodist Church, Masonic Lodge and a charter member

of the Lions Club of Sanger. He passed away on February 1, 1958, in Denton, Texas, and is buried in Roselawn Memorial Park.

Dr. Sullivan's legacy continued through his sons, Nelson Gambill Sullivan and John L. Sullivan. Nelson, born in 1917, served as a Colonel and lived to the age of 85. John L. Sullivan, born in 1918, became a prominent attorney in Denton and served as Sanger's City Attorney for 25 years. In 1985, Nelson Gambill Sullivan deeded the historic building, which had been in the Sullivan family since 1900, to the City of Sanger in memory of his parents and brother.






SISD police officer suspended

was suspended, recently, over alleged misconduct involving a student and is now under criminal investigation by the city of Sanger's police department.

Sanger Independent School District Superintendent Tommy Hunter notified parents on November 19 that the district was investigating a "serious allegation" of an ISD police officer's inappropriate conduct with a student.

The next day, the Sanger Police Department announced it had received an allegation "of a criminal nature" and "immediately" initiated an investigation into the school district's police officer.

Neither the Sanger PD nor Superintendent Hunter identified the officer or the campus, other than that a secondary school was involved.

The SISD notice sent to parents/ guardians:

"The afternoon of November 19, 2025, Sanger ISD was notified of a serious allegation involving a school district police of-

A Sanger school district police officer ficer and inappropriate conduct with a secondary student. The safety and well-being of our students is the District's utmost priority. The officer was immediately removed from duties and placed on administrative leave.

> The District is actively assisting the City of Sanger Police Department in their investigation and has filed a report with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) as required by law. Due to the laws and policies concerning confidentiality, and given the pending investigation, no further details will be shared at this time."

> The school district established its own police department in 2022. The Sanger ISD Police has seven employees, including the chief, a sergeant, and five officers.

> The City of Sanger PD added, in a press release, that it would provide no additional information while its investigation is in the early stages.
