

Joe Don Winkle

September 18, 1937 - March 14, 2022

Joe Don Winkle, of Sanger, Texas, passed peacefully into the healing arms of his Savior on March 14, 2022, at the age of 84, surrounded by his family. Joe was born on September 18, 1937 to Claud and Valta (Rogers) Winkle in Franklin County, Texas. He was a faithful Christian and a member of First Baptist Church

Joe graduated from Winnsboro High School in 1955. Upon high school graduation, Joe attended Texas A&M University and was a member of the Corps of Cadets. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from Texas A&M University in 1959. Joe was a proud Aggie, and anyone who knew him knew he bled maroon.

After college, he was commissioned into the United States Air Force as a Second Lieutenant. He was stationed in Dayton, Ohio at Wright Patterson Air Force Base. From there, he was stationed in Reykjavik, Iceland where he led a team at an important military fueling base. He concluded his time in the Air Force based in Dover, Delaware, but remained as a Captain in the Reserves

On August 28, 1959, he married Jerrie Smith of Little Hope, Texas. They were married for over 62 years. They enjoyed spending time with their grandchildren and great-grandchildren, working at their farm, and traveling together - especially to Alaska where they spent several summers together.

In 1962, Joe began his professional career. He was an Infrastructure Engineer for Housing and Urban Development in Fort Worth, Texas and Alexandria, Louisiana. Much of Joe's career was spent doing disaster relief working with the Office of Emergency Preparedness, currently known as the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). In 1966, Joe began working at the FEMA Region 6 Office on Loop 288 in Denton. Joe and Jerrie raised their family in Denton over the next 17 years. His career at FEMA took him to Washington D.C. as the Deputy Coordinator for their Natural Disaster Program. Joe and Jerrie returned to Denton in 1988 when he became the Region 6 Deputy Administrator for the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Dallas office. Joe retired from EPA in 1994

Nothing made Joe happier than spending time with his family. His family was always his first priority. In his free time, Joe enjoyed spending time outdoors. His first love was quail hunting and training his hunting dogs. He also enjoyed any kind of hunting, fishing, golfing, and watching football â€" especially the Texas A&M Aggies and Dallas Cowboys. Joe always had an assortment of favorite snacks in his hunting backpack, most of which included delectable junk food to satisfy his sweet tooth!





by the school board to include our community, and to listen to the citizens of Sanger. Long before our committee began its work, the effort to include the community had already been started. They listened to students, parents, school staff and community members in meetings before gathering the formal group that would propose a bond to the school board. The topics we covered in our meetings included demographic projections (hint: we are growing and will continue to experience growth), school financing (boring topic, but very informative), our current facilities and projected needs. We toured the school facilities, and our eyes were opened to some glaring needs.

We then got down to working on putting together a package that would meet the most pressing needs of our students, which meant certain facilities would need to be addressed immediately. As the committee developed the bond package according to the needs we observed, something very interesting occurred. 100% of the members of the committee voted to approve each project contained in the bond. We also voted 100% against potential projects that did not get included. We were informed by the committee facilitator that this was not a common occurrence. Because of the work put in by its members and the quality of information shared with us by the district, the committee unanimously agreed on what to include. I completed my time serving on the committee excited about the future of Sanger ISD.

Over the next month, you will hopefully receive an invitation to attend a meeting in your neighborhood, at a local restaurant or coffee shop to discuss the specific items in the bond package. At these meetings, a school representative will be there to discuss the particulars of the bond package, only facts and figures. There will also be a representative from the committee to share their experience and their perspective on the upcoming election and its importance to our community. When you receive an invitation, make room on your calendar to attend. This election on May 7 is crucial to the future of Sanger.

Over the next few weeks, articles will appear in this newspaper outlining the individual projects and why they are necessary.

id The Dalton Gang Come to Sanger?

SANGER

In the autumn of 1919, the United States had just emerged from World War I and the edge of the "Roaring Twenties" was looming. Sanger was enjoying the post-war boom as three banks spied on one another from the intersection of Bolivar and Third Streets. The E.L. Berry bank to become the First National Bank (now offices for the City of Sanger operations), would become the oldest financial institution in town. The bank originally operated as the Farmers

and Merchants Bank and was located on 4th Street in the Dunn Building and faced westward toward the Sanger city park. E.L. Berry and partners bought this bank and in 1905 it was chartered with the name of First National Bank and was then located at the Bolivar and Third Street location. The other

two banks in that section of downtown were not to exist after several years.

Fred Scheu, Santa Fe Station Agent in Sanger, working the "third trick" (shifts with the Santa Fe were called "tricks"). The railroad station depot was open twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; they never closed and were very busy. Fred was well-known around town and always walked to work as there were few automobiles around.

On this particular day in 1919, Scheu and his wife were rooming at the Gary Rooming and Boarding House at the corner of Bolivar and Fifth Streets (home was originally owned by Dr. Ervin Howard, and his son and wife operated


as a boarding house for many years after Dr. Howard's death. The two-story home was located just behind the current Sanger Museum but no longer exists.) As Harry Rucker, the station agent for the midnight trick arrived to relieve Scheu at the depot, he advised he thought something strange was going on "uptown" and to be careful walking home. He said he thought he saw some men go behind the Berry First National Bank building.

Scheu began his walk on the north side of Bolivar Street toward the boarding house westward from the railroad station passing the two-story wooden hotel known as the Burchard Hotel located next to Wilson's Lumber Yard (now a vacant building at the northeast corner of Bolivar

and Second Streets). As he crossed Second Street to the Sartin Store, the wagon yard was next to the Jones Picture Show (now known as Bolivar Street BBQ. Yes, this building was originally a movie theater.), and passed the bank building on the northeast corner (now where the attorney office is located). Across this intersection of Bolivar and Third Streets, there was an electrical wire strung across the intersection with a single lightbulb glowing in the night. Scheu saw someone standing just in front of the bank and as Scheu crossed the street, the man in the shadows lit a cigarette and attempted to act as normal as possible.

Fred had never seen the fellow in front of the

bank building before, and as he crossed the intersection, he tipped his hat and passed by the man, kept on walking past the Dunn Building later to be the Gentle Hardware Store (burned in later years and now a vacant lot). Scheu crossed over to the front of the Wilfong Building and began running on the south side of Bolivar Street to the rooming house; just one short block away. He knocked on the door of Buck and Eula Gary's room; Buck dressed in a hurry, grabbed his gun, and gave one to Scheu. There was no phone service in this year of 1919 which would not happen until the mid-1920s, so the two men made their plans; they would walk a block north on Fifth Street to the corner where the Berry family resided (which is now called the Pink House just across from the Sanger Park and now a residential home). Mr. Berry retrieved his gun and the gang of three crossed over the park and ran south behind the Wilfong Building to George Hughes' home to get more support. And away they went, headed north up 4th Street.

These four men crossed Bolivar Street on Fourth Street and past Sullivan's Furniture Store and Funeral Parlor, and ran down the alley off Fourth Street behind the building that would lead to the back of the bank building. What they found upon arrival in the alley were "warm calling cards" left behind by several horses, and in the still night, the air was strongly odorous. As they entered the bank building, the vault inside the bank was still intact and the floor littered with cigarette butts and the smell of whiskey lingered.

No one ever saw who came to town that night except for Fred Scheu and Harry Rucker. They only saw the one man in front of the bank in dim light, but became apparent an attempted bank robbery had been in place at the time. The men must have realized they had been

discovered in their task and left the premises.

Several days later an elderly lady living one block north at the corner of Third and Elm in a two-story home (no longer standing), went to her cellar to retrieve some of her canned goods and found several of the jars broken and parts of the contents had been eaten, and the rest littered the dirt floor with cigarette butts and empty liquor bottles. Her cow barn was littered with horse manure and bales of hay scattered as proof someone had been in town, but for what reason no one knows other than perhaps the attempted robbery of the bank. Rumors persisted this was the Dalton Gang who was famously known as bank robbers, but no one will ever know exactly who made this failed attempt to rob the Sanger bank.

Fire Marshal Casey Welborn

eet Casey Welborn. He was Lieutenant and was recently promoted to Fire Marshal.
Casey was born in Colorado. When he was just three years old, his father, having been from Denton, decided to move his family back home. They settled in Sanger, and Casey has called Sanger home ever since.

Welborn graduated from Sanger High School in 1995. He married his wife, Tammy, in May of 1998. They have four boys Ryan (30), Dillon (25), Griffin (21), and Talyn (19). And two grandsons (age 5 and 2). The Welborns are a very close family. His three oldest children all reside in Sanger and Talyn, currently away at college, looks forward to graduation so he can move back home.

I asked Casey if he always knew he wanted to be a fireman. Most people might find it a strange profession considering his father was a Police Officer in Denton County. Finding out that he was passionate about public service, firefighting, in particular, was a bit of an accident.

Welborn was very passionate about playing baseball. While away at college, he got hurt and was unable to play. For him, the absence of baseball in his life made college less than appealing.

He was home visiting and attending a football game where he found himself wrapped in conversation with his uncle, the Chief of the Volunteer FD in Sanger at the time, who sensed Casey might have been struggling with his future, and suggested that he should volunteer



with the FD. From his first volunteer day, he fell in love with firefighting.

It would be 6 years before Welborn would join the Sanger Fire Department as paid staff. He served as a volunteer on his off days of working for a private ambulance company as a paramedic. When the position opened for a full-time firefighter/paramedic, he applied and got the job. Since then, Casey has obtained multiple certifications.

He started with Driver, Instructor, Fire Officer, Inspector, Command & Control, and Plans Examiner.

It may seem like a natural progression for Casey to now be the City's, Fire Marshal. However, it wasn't a role that he actively sought out. Casey loves the operations side of the job. Being in the field and leading his team gives him the greatest pleasure. However, the most important thing for Welborn is the growth of the Sanger FD. The FD needed an onsite, 8 AM – 5 PM Fire Marshal. When Chief Pennington approached Casey about the position, his respect for Chief and his love for the Sanger FD, made the decision an easy one. He still gets to go out into the field for large events so, for him, he is living the best of both worlds.

So, what is next for Fire Marshal Welborn? With the I35 expansion project, more growth is expected. He plans to continue his career through retirement serving the residents and visitors of Sanger. Additionally, he would like to see the addition of one, possibly two new fire stations down the line.

What about his plans for ten years and beyond? For Casey, family is everything. He fully expects that he and his wife will stay right here in Sanger. Having the grandbabies close by is not something he is ever willing to give up.
