Judy Giannasi and his brother John Larry Hall. Anyone who knew Don was touched by his way


of inspiring those around him to do what they love and do it well. Don is survived by his wife Kim, of 39 years. His

Either way, the increase in property values means more tax revenue for the county.

Proposition passed, would let counties borrow against a future increase in tax revenue in a specific area to pay for transportation projects or other infrastructure in that same area. For example, if a water park is coming to town, the county government may decide it needs to build new roads so more people can get to the water park. The extra money coming in from the increases in nearby property value would then go toward paying off the debt for those new roads.

Cities can already do this. But the Texas Attorney General has said counties are not explicitly authorized to do so under the state's constitution.

Prop 2 includes some exceptions. The area in question has to be "unproductive, underdeveloped, or blighted." No more than 65% of the increase in tax revenue could go to a transportation project. None of the money could be used to build toll roads.
