
Buster James Vaughn

Sanger ISD Dress and Grooming Code

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:					
APPROPRIATE ATTIRE	Male students must wear clean clothing (shirt, slacks, shorts, trousers) that is not torn or damaged. Female students must wear clean clothing (dress, blouse, shirt, skirt, slacks, shorts) that is not torn or damaged. Jeans may have holes located below the fingertips when hands are placed at the side. If jeans are shredded above the fingertip length, undergarments or skin must not be showing. Pants must be worn with the waist at waist level, and shirts or blouses must be buttoned. All students must wear shoes and appropriate undergarments. Sweatshirts/jackets with hoods may be worn; however, the hoods may not be worn on the head in the school building. Leggings and yoga pants must be worn with a shirt, blouse or tunic that covers the backside, and front, must be below fingertip level. 

"At the start of every school year, this is a huge task for administrators to collect and process the applications, a task made bigger because during the pandemic there are more families eligible who may never have applied before.'

The waivers also provide flexibility on the types of foods served to address ongoing supply chain issues, disruptions and procurement challenges.

"The goal is to meet the nutrition standards where they can. We know this works — it's evidence-based," Dean said, pointing to a pre-pandemic Tufts University study that found Americans eat food mostly of poor nutritional quality except at school.





Sanger ISD is participating in the **Seamless Summer Option that offers** Free Meals in School Year 2021-2022

Sanger ISD has announced its policy that this school year, healthy meals will be offered every school day to all students at no cost. Typically, a student's household must meet income eligibility requirements to qualify for free or reduced-price meals. However, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued guidance that allows schools to offer meals to all students at no cost for the 2021-2022 school year. Each school/site or central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed upon request.

While no application or eligibility determination process is required for your student to receive free meals this school year, the income eligibility requirement will likely resume in the 2022-2023 school year.
