


### Rosemary Elaine McAninch

### James Douglas Harper


August 27, 2007 - September 24, 2025

## **Bolivar Lodge Celebrates Sesquicentennial**

Bolivar Masonic Lodge celebrated their Sesquicentennial 150th anniversary Saturday, August 9th, at 4 PM in the Family Life Center at First Baptist Church Sanger, Texas. The program featured the Texas Grand Master Raborn L. Reader, Jr. who spoke to the audience and congratulated the Lodge on its 150th anniversary. There were about 150 in attendance. He then presented several Masonic Service Awards. Those receiving 25 year Service pins were Steve Estes, Mike Irvin, Michael York, and William Green. 40 Year Service pins were presented to Kenny Ruland, Conrad Shifflett, Joey Higgs, and Ricky Wilson. The coveted 50 Year Service pins were presented to Charles Kesseler and Dickie Amyx. A home-cooked meal was prepared by Steward Glenn McDaniel.

Bolivar Masonic Lodge was es-

tablished June 4, 1875 in Bolivar. The Lodge moved to Sanger in 1894 as the town began to flourish with the establishment of the railroad. The first meeting in Sanger was held in the F.M. Ready building and rent was \$8 per month. In 1900, Bolivar Lodge moved once again and rented the upper floor of a new building owned by J.L. Burt.

In 1905, a permanent home for Bolivar Lodge was built by devoted mason J.W. Milligan. He offered the upper floor of his new building to be constructed and owned by the Lodge. The first meeting was held there on June 10, 1905, and is our current home for the last 120 years. Not until the early 1960's did the Lodge purchase the bottom floor of our current building to be used as a dining hall. Bolivar Masonic Lodge is the oldest continuous service organization in Sanger and continues to serve the community after 150 years.


Refrigerant-based appliances (like refrigerators) must have a tag certifying that all refrigerants have been removed by a certified technician.

Individual items cannot exceed 100 pounds.

Construction debris, demolition waste, and remodeling materials are not accepted. For more information:
