

The Sanger Area Historical Society and Museum is asking for the community's help

Membership of the Sanger Area Historical Society and Museum has reached a new low of membership, and we depend upon the community's interest and membership to keep us going. Our yearly dues are \$10 per person. Our expenses are low but we depend upon membership dues each year for computer ink, paper and general supplies for the museum. We average a little over 8 people to visit our museum each Saturday so we are providing a service to the community and visitors. Much of what we do is not openly published but much behind-the-scenes work is continually being done to record and provide the history of Sanger. Sanger is 139 years old. Just think of the history we have, and that we do not want to lose our organization keeping this history for the community. Sanger is growing and it is so important to maintain the history of this old, but wonderful community. Many families have moved to Sanger due to the "small town" feel about it although that may be changing in the very near future.

The most exciting thing we have done this year is to install 5 new shelving units and one storage cabinet in the south room of the museum. We were in great need for more room for our history binders, school yearbooks, local author books, and many miscellaneous scrapbooks which have been donated. We have provided a small desk in the room for anyone that wishes to come and do any research. The cost of the shelving was over \$3,000 but these units will last forever.

In conjunction with the Sanger Public Library, we held a public meeting on July 17, 2025 to present the history of the location of the library, and the complete block with all the businesses that were a part of this block in earlier years. We had a good turnout and saw a few SAHS members at the event. We will be doing more with the library in the future as it is a good mix of their members along with our members and some of the general public. We do like talking about

Marley Meadows


Marley Meadows is a 19.653-acre residential development located within the City of Sanger's Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). The property lies on the west side of Sam Bass Road, just north of the FM 455 and Sam Bass intersection. The project includes 17, 1 acre lots.

Chapman Crossing

This planned residential community spans approximately 68.209 acres along Belz Road, west of North Stemmons Freeway. The development is projected to include approximately 296 single-family lots, along with 11 HOA/open space lots, and 612 multi-family units. Minimum home sizes within the community will range between 1,300 and 2,000 square feet.

Lane Ranch

Lane Ranch has officially broke ground. Lane Ranch will be located along West Chapman Road, just to the east of the Sanger High School. This new development will have 1086 residential lots, 240 multi-family, assisted living, and 43 acres of commercial land.



Oasis Apartments is a planned 82-unit, three-story apartment community located at 4300 McReynolds Road, near Lane Ranch.



Windhaven Estates is developing 19.5 acres located on Marion Road just north of FM 455, across of the new Sanger High School. The development will consist of 30 large residential lots, with lot that are .40 acres and above. This will be a gated community.

Lois Road Estates master planned development is located along Lois Road E and will include approximately 784 single-family lots.

It's the first key step in the University Interscholastic League's process of realigning and reclassifying schools across the state for athletic purposes every two years. Schools have a week after snapshot day to report their enrollment number as of Friday, Oct. 31, to the UIL. Those figures are then used to set cutoffs for the 12 football divisions and six classifications for all other sports.

The UIL will release official enrollment numbers and divisional cutoffs later this year before district alignments for the 2026-27 and 2027-28 school years in football, volleyball and basketball are announced in Febru-





SHS Cross Country runs at state


