North Texas Fair & Rodeo starts Friday

The 91st annual North Texas Fair and Rodeo will take place August 16-24. It's time for fried fair foods, family fun, country music and cowboy traditions. The event will kick off with Parker McCollum appearing live on the Budweiser stage



and the fun keeps going with headlining performances from greats such as Easton Corbin, La Zenda Norteña, Jake Hooker & The Outsiders, Ned LeDoux, Kody West, Flatland Cavalry, Josh Ward, Pat Green, and Tracy Lawrence. See concert schedule of events on page 12.

The North Texas Fair and Rodeo (NTFR) continues to bring the best country music to the North Texas area every August, but that's not where all of the focus lies for this rapidly growing association. With a membership and group of volunteers that go back several generations, this event focuses on the importance of family fun, tradition and creating lasting memories.

"We continue to support youth, agriculture and community," said Glenn Carlton, Executive Director of the NTFR. "We strive every year to make this event better than the year before. We want to bring you fun and excitement for the whole family," Carlton said. To do this, the NTFR hosts musical talent, profes-

sional and youth livestock rodeos, exhibitions, a premier midway, and special entertain-DENTON ment attractions.

Last year the

NTFR saw the return of Swifty Swine after a 27 year hiatus from the fair. This year the diving and racing pigs are back to continue the excitement for new and veteran fairgoers alike. The NTFR is also bringing in Jason D'Vaude, a self-taught one-man circus sensation.

The NTFR is a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation of western heritage. All revenue is reinvested into programs, scholarships and facilities. The NTFR contributes around \$500,000 each year to youth in the area. According to the Center of Economic Development at the University of North Texas, the NTFR and its facilities have a \$11,000,000.00 economic impact in Denton County and an approximate \$6,000,000.00 impact on the city of Denton.

touch any of my money if I need some of it before I retire." A fixed annuity is designed to provide you with income during your retirement years. But if you want to withdraw a significant amount of your money before you retire – when your annuity is in what's called the "accumulation phase" you'll likely face a surrender charge, as well as a 10% federal tax penalty. Withdrawals may also be subject to a market value adjustment. However, to access a small percentage of your allocated funds, you might not encounter any fees. And some annuity contracts allow a 10 percent withdrawal with no penalty.

"Annuities cost too much." Many annuities are actually low in cost. Be sure to compare the cost against the value of each additional guarantee, feature, and benefit—and only pay for what vou need.

"A deferred annuity isn't worth the wait." If you set up a deferred annuity, it's true that you won't immediately start receiving income. You will, however, be able to factor future expected payments into your retirement plan.


"When I die, the insurance company keeps my money." If your payout plan includes a beneficiary agreement, your beneficiaries will receive the remaining amount of money in the contract. Read the terms and conditions listed with an annuity, as they will spell out where the remaining money will go after you pass away.


Of course, even if the above concerns are simply misconceptions, it doesn't mean there are no issues about which you must be aware when considering fixed annuities. For one thing, the safety of your lifetime income stream and guarantees will depend on

the claims-paying ability of the insurer that issued the annuity, so you'll want to choose a company that has demonstrated financial strength and stability. One other concern about fixed annuities: They typically don't carry a cost of living adjustment, such as that found in Social Security. You can find annuities that do offer some inflation protection, but this feature can reduce early payments significantly.

If it's appropriate for your situation, a fixed annuity can be a valuable addition to your retirement income. Before purchasing one, though, you'll need to weigh all the potential benefits and issues. But don't be swayed by misconceptions you'll want to base your decision on facts, rather than fears.




