Clarification of Learning Platform:

ISD Superintendent Dr. mandatory January: He wanted to be more transparent with the district's decisions. "I apologize for any misunderstanding or confusion created by first closing three of our campuses, followed by a letter the next day closing our online learning platform," he stated in a release on December 16th.

It has been a challenge all year long to keep the doors to the campuses open for instruction. The virus has played havoc in education as it has many other occupations. When the SISD students are forced to be quarantined due to "close contact," or test positive for COVID, they have the option of moving to the online learning platform and continue to stay pluggedin. However, when the teachers are forced to quarantine or test positive, SISD struggles to classrooms from an educational standpoint and/ or a safety perspective. Please follow guidelines at Sanger Cemetery

The Board of Directors for the Sanger Cemetery Association is making a final plea to have family members remove any items at graves in the cemetery that are not within the cemetery Rules and Regulations. A mass letter was sent in 2018, giving everyone ample time to make these removals. The cemetery Rules and Regulations are on the deed issued to you when you purchased your lot and posted inside the gate on a large sign.

We want to thank everyone who has followed these guidelines and those who have cleaned their areas up. Two weeks from this publication date, all items not within the guidelines will be removed and taken to the North end of the cemetery by the dumpster including, trinkets, benches, arches, and statues. You will have 30 days to retrieve your items and your items only! At the end of the 30 days, all items will be placed in the dumpster or hauled off.

Please note: all unsightly flower arrangements and all bushes will be removed and discarded. Once the cleanup process is complete, the caretaker will maintain this procedure. For your convenience, the Rules and Regulations are below.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY We appreciate your continued cooperation in upholding the cemetery's conditions and regulations as listed below. This reduces the caretaker's amount of maintenance and allows him to keep the grounds in better shape.

Conditions and Regulations of the Sanger Cemetery

1. The tract conveyed shall be for the burial of the human dead and no other use.

The tract conveyed shall not be curbed or enclosed in any manner. Any existing curb that has deteriorated or is damaged cannot be repaired and should be removed. The cemetery board has the authority to remove any such curbing.

3. No glass containers shall be left within the boundaries of the cemetery.

4. No trees, shrubs, ornamental statuary, or other items that would be an obstruction to mowing shall be established on any tracts.

5. The use of the tract conveyed shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Sanger Cemetery Association, as they presently stand or are later

6. The association requires that a permanent marker be placed on the grave as soon as possible after burial. These memorials should only be made of granite or bronze and must set on an exposed concrete pad with a three-inch apron. The association must be notified BEFORE such memorials are set. Please contact (940) 458-3311 for the requirements of placing a monument in the cemetery.



The ber-You might have seen a ries are said to have been mistletoe tree before, but tears of a grieving goddess like unicorns and the Cowboys winning another Super Bowl, it doesn't exist. Mistletoe lives on other trees such as hackberries, oaks, elms and pecans. It's evergreen so when the host kissing under the mistletree loses its leaves, you are left with mistletoe. It can practically take over a tree. So that's why in the winter, you might think that the tree is indeed a mistletoe

Being green, mistletoe does photosynthesize its own food. However, it does take water and some nutrients from the host tree which makes it only semi-parasitic. Mistletoe doesn't kill a tree, but it doesn't help it either. Older or stressed trees could continue to decline with an overabundance of mis-

Birds are the culprits that spread mistletoe around. They feast on the white berries and then poop out the seeds in other trees. Some berries with seed may even hitchhike on a bird to find a new location.

Once the seed has found a new tree, the roots delve into the bark of the branch. Often there is a swollen area where the mistletoe attaches. The roots can spend a few years growing before the mistletoe plant appears.

Getting rid of mistletoe is not easy. The best method is to cut the branch back at least 12 inches in from the mistletoe to ensure that all of the roots are removed. Merely cutting mistletoe where it comes out of the branch or snapping it off only makes the mistletoe more determined. For chemical control a growth regulator can be used but the effects are only temporary.


How did this semi-parasite become associated with Christmas and kissing? First of all, it is noticeable in winter. The Celtic Druids believed this indicated vitality and that the plant had mystical healing properties. They probably were the first to decorate with mistletoe to ward off evil spirits. ving is credited for one of the first mentions in print of mistletoe at Christmas in an 1820 book. And in the classic "A Christmas Carol," the first printing in 1843 included illustrations depicting kissing under the mistletoe. I found it interesting to read that the original custom involved removing a berry in order to be kissed. Once all the berries had been picked the kissing was over. That would definitely be a factor on "when to arrive at a party." Of all the years to talk about kissing under mistletoe, this is not the right one. I hope the sprig of mistletoe hanging on my front porch doesn't send a mixed message to all the hard-working delivery persons who have made my life safer this year. Perhaps I need to explain that it's simply a symbol of love and friendship, not an invitation to spread germs!



Sanger ISD Learning Platforms

Dear Sanger ISD Families,

COVID-19 has presented many challenges across the world. The primary responsibility of Sanger ISD is to provide students with an exceptional education while providing for their health and safety. Sanger ISD has provided learning opportunities for both remote and in-person learners as methods of instructions so that students can have access to curriculum and academic success. Upon reviewing grades and attendance from our first two grading periods, Sanger ISD administrative staff and Board of Trustees have decided to revise the learning plan options for our students. We believe that in-person learning instruction provides students with additional support and access to teachers, academic conversations with peers and stability leading to higher academic success.

We have been asking our teachers to start their day earlier than ever to deal with the challenges associated with COVID-19. While doing all the little things to keep everyone safe we have several teachers teaching on two different platforms serving both in-person learners and remote learners. Our staff has performed all these tasks while putting in more hours and days than any school year prior. Despite all of our efforts, we have learned the online learning has not been as successful as we have hoped for our remote learners. After reviewing all of our data, we are transitioning our current online students back to in-person learning.

After careful consideration Sanger ISD will be suspending our remote learning platform effective January 8, 2021. Beginning on January 11, 2021 all students are expected back in the classroom for in-person learning unless they meet one of the exceptions below:

- 1. A student is medically fragile or lives with someone who is considered medically fragile. Documentation from a medical doctor is required and must be submitted to the campus principal on or before January 8, 2021.
- 2. A positive COVID case requires the student to be guarantined in accordance with the guidelines established by TEA as follows: Any student who has tested positive for COVID, or who experiences the symptoms of COVID, must stay home throughout the infection period and cannot return to campus until all three criteria have been met:
 - At least one day (24 hours) has passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications);
 - The individual has improvement in symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath);
 - c. At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
- 3. A student who has had close contact with someone who is COVID positive must be quarantined for 10 days. The student shall return to in-person learning after their quarantine period.

Students who do not meet the qualifications to remain in remote learning must return to school in-person on January 11, 2021.

While we want to see all of our students return to school in-person, we want to allow enough time for you to make the decision you feel is best for your child. Students who do not meet one of the above exceptions are expected to return to campus. Students not returning to school have the following choices:

- Withdraw to homeschool
- Enroll in private school
- Request to transfer to a district offering remote learning
