





Craver Ranch, which was annexed by the city in 2008 and fire stations 2009, is located in far north Denton north of Shepard Road between FM 2164 and FM 2153. The project will require at 7,091 single-family residen- least 20 years to build out, which translates to about 400 new homes per year, Knight added. At build-out, the estimated value of the development is \$5.1 billion, per city documents.

The proposed development location is near two proposed alignments for the regional outer loop project overseen by the Texas Department of Transportation. No alignment has been selected, but one would run through the proposed development while the other would pass just south. TxDOT officials are expected to complete the study for the area in fall 2026.

Mia Hines, a senior planner with the City of Denton, said the master-planned community proposal is similar to other proposals approved in communities with frontage on the outer loop, such as Celina.

"Around this outer loop, we're seeing a lot of master-planned types of communities," Hines said.


One resident who lives near Craver Ranch, Olivia Lilley, said approving the development will impact which outer loop alignment is chosen by TxDOT.

"If you were to pass these items tonight with this developer, it would affect the outer loop alignment," Lilley said. "Now, it'll go through our homes and our land."







At the Sanger Police Department, our mission is simple and important:

To enhance the quality of life in our community through excellent police service, respectful treatment of everyone we encounter, and a strong commitment to building relationships with the people we serve.

One part of enhancing quality of life is promoting safety, which includes traffic control and enforcement. If you're stopped by a Sanger police officer, you may receive a warning or a citation depending on the circumstances. These are issued using our electronic ticket-writing system, which helps save time and ensures everything is clear and easy to read.

This system also provides an opportunity for you to share your feedback. If you choose to provide your cell phone number, you'll receive a text with a link to evaluate your interaction with the officer. You can also access the survey using the QR code on the citation or warning.

I know being stopped isn't anyone's favorite moment, especially if a ticket is involved. However, regardless of the reason for the interaction, our expectation is that every officer treats you with professionalism and respect. This feedback is your

chance to let us know how we're doing. The survey includes a 1-5 rating scale and space for written comments, and we truly value your input.

Over the past year, 328 people have taken the time to complete a review, and our officers have earned an average rating of 4.3 out of 5. Considering that some ratings reflect frustration with receiving a ticket rather than the interaction itself, that score speaks volumes about the dedication of our team.

Thank you for helping us stay accountable and for partnering with us to keep Sanger safe. Please continue to drive safely, and if we happen to catch you in a momentary lapse, we hope you'll take a moment to let us know how we're living up to our mission.

mobility plan amendment will allow a proposed east-west connector arterial to run around an existing floodplain as opposed to through it, according to city documents.

#### What they're saying

During the meeting, several residents voiced their opposition, citing increases in traffic, inadequate infrastructure in the area and impacts to the area's environment, such as displacing wildlife.

Some council members also expressed concern about the cost of extending infrastructure and city services, and the compatibility with the city's comprehensive plan.


"We have to make the right decision not to do leapfrog [development]," Beck said. "It costs extra to the city. This will not pay for itself."

Other council members cited potential benefits, such as building more homes to meet the area's population growth.

"I am of the opinion that when there is more housing available, it drives down the price of housing for everybody," council member Brandon Chase McGee said. "By virtue of the next 20 years of this project, if it is completed and built out, it will provide more housing options for people who are coming here, allowing many of us to stay in our homes."

#### What's next?

Hines said the proposal for
