One of the first voices the future impersonator nailed as a child was his television hero, Barney Fife, from "The Andy Griffith Show."

Today Swanberg takes Barney Fife and over twenty other lovable impersonations, together with his side-splitting stories of growing up, families, and the funny side of church, to over 250,000 people every year. His audiences range from churches looking for fresh and new inspiration, to marriage enrichment seminars, city-wide concerts, business related events and corporate gatherings. Dennis Swanberg doesn't care who he's talking to, as long as he can leave knowing he made someone's day a little brighter. His national broadcast television shows, "Swan's Place" and "The Dennis Swanberg Show", are described by the networks as "an hour of good, clean fun and entertainment as well as spiritual insight and encouragement" and are viewed by over one million households weekly.

## John William Coker III passes away

John William Coker III, 81, of Sanger, passed away on Friday, June 21, 2019 in Denton surrounded by his family. The son of John William, Jr. and Josephine Jo (Weaver) Coker, he was born on July 10, 1937 in Drumright, Oklahoma.

He attended Odessa High School, Odessa College, and graduated from Dallas Institute of Mortuary Science in 1956. On March 2, 1957, he married Winnie Delores Kinkade in Grand Prairie and recently celebrated their 62nd wedding anniversary. They soon moved to Floydada where John worked for Harmon Funeral Home. In 1959, he and Delores moved to Sanger to work for Schmitz, Floyd, Hamlet Funeral Home. They have been members of the First Baptist Church for almost 60 years.

In 1961, John purchased the funeral home and changed the name to Coker Funeral Home. He selflessly served the people of Denton, Cooke, Wise and Jack counties for the next 60 years. The funeral business and serving people were John's true passion and he was instrumental in leading several young men into the funeral profession. John served as a liaison to the Corp of Engineers having to locate and assist with moving the graves in cemeteries that would be covered in water by Lake Ray Roberts. John served as past-president of the North Texas Funeral Directors Association and was a recipient of the North Texas Funeral Director of the Year Award. On the state level, he served on the Board of Directors of Texas Funeral Directors Association and the Texas Funeral Services, Inc.

John loved Sanger and the people who lived here. He always wanted Sanger to prosper and grow. He did not take his civic duties lightly. He served as Past-President of the Sanger Chamber of Commerce, was

the past Tail-Twister of the Sanger Lions Club, City of Sanger Councilman, Denton County Justice of the Peace for Precinct 5, Mayor of the City of Sanger (1996-98), and served 60 years on the Sanger Cemetery Association Board of Trustees. John along with several other men in Sanger worked, formed and coached the first Sanger Little League Program. He served on the Lake Ray Roberts Planning and Zoning and the Red River Valley Commission.

He was a 32nd Degree Mason and member of the Bolivar Masonic Lodge #418, having received his 50-year pin. He served as Past-Patron and was a 50-year pin recipient in the Order of the Eastern Star #1027. He was also a 50-year pin recipient of the Moslah Shrine Temple. He was past-president of the Moslah Car-Vettes, past-president of the Denton County Shriners and a charter member of the Denton Elks Lodge.

As much as John enjoyed all of this, nothing compared to his family. He proudly wore the title of husband and Dad but the title he wore most proudly was "Gran'dad". He was preceded in death by his parents, Mother-in-law, Pauline Kinkade Bell, Father-in-law, Ardie Grey Kinkade and their beloved dog, Harry. Those left to cherish his memory are his wife Delores of Sanger; two sons, John W Coker, IV and wife Loretta of Decatur and Michael Grey Coker of Jacksboro; one daughter DeAnn Coker Burrus and husband Sam of Sanger; Sister-in-law and brother-in-law Shonda and Jim Washer of Sanger; six grandchildren John William Coker, V and wife Megan of Decatur, Ashly L'Rae DoByns and husband Michael of Decatur, Windi Burrus Ward and husband Bo of Argyle, Bradley Grey Coker and wife Jessica

### Investment Strategy Can Be Your ‘GPS’ as You Travel Toward Goals

Summer is here at last. For many people, it’s time to get the car ready for a long road trip. And with GPS-enabled smartphones, it’s now a lot easier to navigate these drives without getting lost. ## Blake Pyron gets new law passed

Texas workers with disabilities will now earn at least minimum wage thanks to Senate Bill 753, a bill that was passed by the Legislature in May.

Blake Pyron of Sanger helped make it official a few weeks ago. The 23-year-old who has Down syndrome, joined Gov. Greg Abbott and U.S. Rep. Michael C. Burgess, R-Pilot Point, for the bill signing.

Blake Pyron’s mother, Mary Ann Pyron, said she and her son have spent countless hours lobbying for fair wages for people with disabilities. Together, they’ve traveled multiple times to Austin and Washington, D.C., to petition lawmakers to revoke Section 14(c) of 1938’s Fair Labor Standards Act. The disputed section allows employers to pay disabled workers less than the federal minimum wage.

Over the years, the Pyron family has formed a close relationship with Burgess, who flew to Austin from Washington to attend the signing ceremony.

“All people have inherent worth, and this law makes certain that each person’s value is recognized,” Burgess said in a news release.

Filed by state Rep. John Raney, R-College Station, and state Sen. Joan Huffman, R-Houston, SB 753 will require contractors to pay workers with disabilities at least \$7.25 an hour, the current federal minimum wage. Texas employers could previously pay disabled workers as little as 2 cents an hour via the state’s taxpayer-funded Purchasing from People with Disabilities program.

Mary Ann Pyron said most people are unaware that many disabled workers earn considerably less than the federal minimum wage.

Employers must adhere to the mandate by no later than Sept. 1, 2022, according to the bill. State Rep. Lynn Stucky, R-Denton, who was a joint sponsor of the bill, said the Legislature needed to ensure that all hardworking Texans are paid fairly.

“Companies that benefit from these state contracts will no longer be able to take advantage of Texans with intellectual and developmental disabilities by paying them less than minimum wage,” Stucky said in an emailed statement.

Blake Pyron is no stranger to the limelight. In 2016, he became the only person with a disability in Sanger to own their own business after he opened Blake’s Snow Shack, a snow cone stand. Plus, he was the youngest business owner in town.

Blake’s Snow Shack got a boost in publicity later that year after a Texas NASCAR team placed the business’s logo above its car’s rear tires.

Mary Ann Pyron said the pride she has in her son is immeasurable. He’s ecstatic to be leading the charge for fair pay for disabled persons everywhere, she said.

“We felt like we made something that was wrong for so many years; we turned it into a right,” she said. “There’s still more work to do, but at least we’re getting something done.”

 The term fireworks shall mean any firecracker, torpedo, skyrocket, Roman-candle, sparkler, spit-devil or other similar thing. (1992 Code of Ordinances, Chapter 5, Article 5.300, Section 5.301)

**Sec. 5.303 Discharging Fireworks Prohibited**  
 Any person who discharges or causes to be discharged any fireworks as that term is herein defined, or other similar thing within the city limits of the City of Sanger, Texas, shall be fined as hereinafter provided. (1992 Code of Ordinances, Chapter 5, Article 5.300, Section 5.303)


**Sec. 5.304 When Fireworks Allowed**  
 Nothing in this article shall be construed so as to prohibit the celebration of certain events with the use of fireworks under the direction and supervision of the fire marshal of the City of Sanger, Texas. It shall be within the discretion of the city council of the city as to when and what celebrations with the use of fireworks will be allowed. 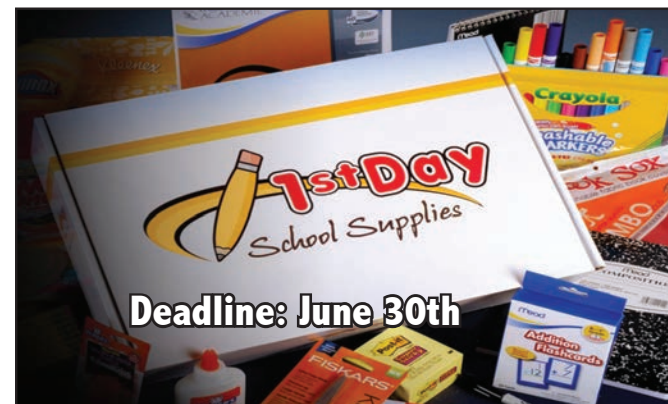

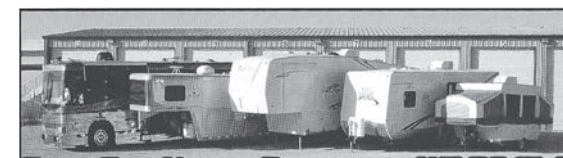

Try over 85 years. While the store has evolved substantially from its early days as a general store, customers see Adams Furniture as one of the last vestiges of a mom-and-pop business -- and its employees are prideful of maintaining that service-first attitude.

“We definitely have a generational following, with many grandchildren of customers choosing to shop with us. Our customers range from 18-98 years old. Once a customer said, ‘Let me show you a picture of this dresser we bought from here in the 1940’s’, Smith said. “It’s kind of neat, actually. People tell all sorts of stories. It’s nice to know you work somewhere with history.”

Adams Furniture is a simple, yet inviting, 10,000 square-foot store located on the southwest corner of farm-to-market roads 407 and 156 in Justin. Although Adams offers a wide-array of Amish and other American-made furniture, Adams specializes in many custom-made options.

Smith said this is crucial because it allows Adams Furniture to put money back into the U.S. economy. Not to mention, American furniture is manufactured under strict guidelines that insure no harmful chemicals are being introduced into homes, Smith said.

“American companies use sustainable and renewable hardwoods harvested from American tree farms,” Smith said. “These trees are grown solely for furniture manufacturing. Most foreign companies continue to clear-cut trees from tropical rain forests, therefore contributing to the loss of rain forests and certainly to global warming.”

All Adams inventory is sold for less than what you may find in a chain store.

Some of the brands it supports include Broyhill, Howard Miller, Serta, Riverside, Mayo, Burkholder, Yutsey and Best Home Furnishings, among others. Most of these can be found right in the showroom floor; the facility is crammed with living room groups, bedroom sets and dining rooms. Also included are many recliners, lamps, desks, bookcases, and just about anything else you might need for your home.

“We can do a lot more special ordering for customers than what you might find somewhere else, and we don’t do service contracts. So if it’s not right, we take care of it right here,” Smith said. “It’s very casual, and when people walk in the door, we know who they are. I think people like that, and we like to think we do it better than any other store in North Texas.”

There is little to no turnover at Adams. Salesman Darrell Field has been there for over 25 years. Eddie and Jon Romine have worked there for more than 18 and 10 years, respectively. What that’s done is create an environment where customers know they can work with the same associates years after their first purchase.

“There are customers that will only work

with Darrell, Eddie, Jon or me, because we know what they like,” Smith said.

Smith added, “You can go to a big-box store, meet a great salesman or saleswoman, but then six months later the same person isn’t there. You won’t find that problem here. We live in a throw-away society, but Adams takes care of its products, and we provide service for everything we sell. We aren’t the only ones out there who believe in service first, but it is rare.”

Smith embodies the family atmosphere, too. He came to work at Adams Furniture in 1969 when he was a freshman in high school, and he’s been there every day since. When he got there, the store was already a staple in the community.

The original owner, Bert Adams, opened it in 1929 as Adams Cash Store. At the time, competition was sparse, transportation wasn’t easy and few residents were willing to drive to Dallas for household items.

For years, Mr. Adams carried a wide-array of items such as furniture, small electrical appliances, dry goods, nuts, bolts and eventually electronics, washers, dryers, microwaves, gift items, guns and ammo and fishing supplies. Customers could order from a catalog, making Adams Cash Store a one-stop shop. Over time the hardware, electronics, appliances and other non-furniture items were replaced with more quality furniture.

This continued well after Mr. Adams turned the business over to his son, Bert R. Adams, who was the one Smith eventually went to work for.

Despite the changes taking place, they never lost sight of the businesses’ roots. Smith was a big part of that. As the younger Mr. Adams reached the point of potential retirement, he looked within the organization for his successor. Smith was an easy choice.
