Your 2022 Income Tax - Done Free by VITA



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance is a program of United Way Denton County. Income tax returns are done by IRS trained preparers at Sanger Public Library on Saturdays, between 9 and 12 (arrive by 11:30). The same team of local volunteers from 2015 to 2021 is again here to help you.

This program has a family income limit of \$60,000 to quality,; larger amounts need paid preparers. You should bring with you: photo ID for taxpayer and spouse (if joint), SS cards for taxpayer(s) and all children listed on the return. Small one person family businesses can often be done; (if employees, inventory, or depreciation it is out of scope for us). Forms we typically help with are: W-2, 1099 INT and DIV, SS 1099, 1099-R, 1099-C, 1099-MISC, 1098-T 1095-A, capital gains, and others. There are other rules that make some returns "out of scope" for us, but most taxpayers with under \$60,000 income we can help.

This service will continue on Saturdays through April 15. No appointments, just show up. If too many come we can refer to our larger facility in north Denton.





DAN DAVISBy Sanger Area Historical Society and Museum (interview by Eunice Sullivan Gray of Ruby Davis Cherry)

The late 1880s brought much to the newly formed 1886 community of Sanger, Texas. New people arrived in the community with ideas of building and showing progress in the area by opening businesses, churches, a school, a post office, and a government of the people for the newly formed town. Many of these transplanted folks were to be instrumental in building Sanger. They came from both local areas and out-of-state.

Dan Davis came to Sanger from Illinois in December 1902. An early Sanger resident, Barlow Everly, remembered Davis arriving on the Santa Fe train. He was called "dapper" as he wore a black derby hat, a Van Dyke beard, carried an umbrella, and wore gloves. This was quite a sensation for the citizens of Sanger, who witnessed this young man's arrival. Davis walked south of Bolivar Street to the west and back easterly on the north side, viewing the small community's businesses and perhaps allowing himself to be viewed.

Davis was a locomotive and stationary engineer by profession who was to become a jeweler, watch repairman, and part-time stationary engineer. He rented a room at Mrs. Howard's boarding house. He married Lizzie Ledbetter Thatcher. She was the widow of Frank Thatcher, who had built two major industries in Sanger and died in 1904. Davis and his wife had one child, Ruby Davis. Ruby married Lockett Cherry, and their daughter was Lona Joyce Snellgrove.

Davis was a genial Yankee gentleman who purchased Charlie Henderson's interest in the waterworks business. With his mechanical ability, he kept the town of Sanger supplied with water. He also operated his jewelry store and watch repair shop, first in the back of Bower's Drugstore and later in Kay's Drugstore.

Davis studied engineering and worked for the Denver Great Smelting Company. He later volunteered for the Spanish American War and spent time in the Philippines.

In 1902 Sanger had 900 residents. Dr. Bower's Drugstore was located in the building recently known as the Bolivar Street BBQ. The Bert Jones, Happy Hour Theater was later located in this building. Davis eventually moved to the Sanger Pharmacy Building owned by Dr. J.C. Rice which later was to become Kay's and Sullivan's Drugstore.


Davis gained the confidence of the people of Sanger and could buy anything he wished on credit. His importance to the community increased, and the Sanger Courier wrote in 1909 that a man couldn't do anything in Sanger without seeing Dan Davis about it first. He helped the owner of the Sanger Courier when assistance was needed in getting more advertising for an issue of the paper. He manufactured a piece for a Linotype machine so the paper could go to press. His jewelry business became a thriving business for jewelers across the United States as he could repair the finest foreign-made clocks that their clientele had invested in.


Thatcher (Davis' wife's first husband) and Charlie Henderson first owned a shallow water windmill pump and a Fairbanks pumping engine. Once the main line was enlarged in the town, a 15-horsepower Stover engine was installed, and an 8 x 8 Ingersol air compressor with a Myers Bulldog pump was placed in the water system. This was in 1908, and in 1910 the old wooden water tower fell and was replaced with a steel and wooden tank. The tank held 900 bbl. and was located on the Davis lot on the southeast corner of 4th and Locust Streets. It was stated that the bottom of the tank was four feet higher than the highest point in Sanger. Until recently, the top of this well could be viewed from the street behind the home of Lona Joyce Snellgrove's home.

In 1919, the engine room was destroyed by fire, and new equipment was installed to a capacity of 23,000 gallons a day. Ruby Cherry, the daughter of Dan Davis, was quoted as saying, "we had to wait for the tank to fill before we could go for a ride in our Model T."

1921 brought a new engine house at the cost of \$1,500, and other improvements were to follow. The entire Sanger community was covered with 81,000 feet of mains for Sanger's 1,500 inhabitants.

Davis and Calvin Dodson installed Sanger's first light plant at the corner of Locust and 2nd Streets. J.M. Stratton introduced acetylene gas lighting to Sanger in 1910 and was a relief to those who could afford to be relieved of using kerosene lamps. This new system was not without fault, though, as Dr. Rob Chambers was quoted saying sermons were sometimes halted while one of the deacons went to investigate what had plunged the auditorium into darkness. For a few years, Sanger returned to kerosene





lamps, but 40 years later, a young man named Thomas Edison made his first public exhibition of a new phenomenon, and electric lights came to Sanger. The light

Many people plan to take an early retirement, so when that day arrives, they're ready for it. But what if you were to face an unplanned retirement? Would you be prepared to deal with the financial issues?

It's something worth thinking about, because any number of factors illness, a spouse's illness, downsizing, other issues - could lead to an abrupt departure from the workforce. But taking action while you're still working may help you make the transition easier on yourself.

Your first move, of course, should be to at least consider the possibility of having to retire earlier than you planned. You can then move on to some concrete steps, possibly including the following.

Build an emergency fund. Under any circumstances, it's a good idea to build an emergency fund — but it's especially important if you want to prepare for an unfore-

If you think you may need to tap into your portfolio sooner than you expected, you may not want to be over-exposed to investments most vulnerable to market volatility. However, these are the same investments that offer you the most growth potential — which you'll need to help stay ahead of inflation. So, look for an investment balance that's appropriate for your needs. As part of this positioning, you may want more about these exchangto shift some assets into income-producing vehiportfolio to boost your li-

quidity. Evaluate your Social Security options. An unplanned retirement may cause you to consider taking Social Security earli-

er than you had planned. You can start taking Social Security when you're 62, but your monthly benefits will be up to 30% lower than if you had waited unlow-risk account. But til your full retirement age, which is likely between 66 and 67. If you have sufficient income through other sources, you may be able to delay taking Social Security until your checks will be bigger — but of course, if you need the money, waiting may not be an option.

Address your health unplanned retirement, and you have employer-sponsored health insurance, you'll have to look for alternatives. You might be able to get extended coverage from your employer, but this could be quite expensive. Of course, if you're already 65, you can get on Medicare, but if you're younger, you might be able to get coverage under your spouse's plan. If that's not an option, you may want to explore one of the health care exchanges created by the Affordable Care Act. To learn es, visit healthcare.gov.

Texas Legislature is Taking Off

Watching a legislative session is like watching a space shuttle launch. After months of watching sparks fly and clouds of smoke billowing outward, the 88th Texas Legislature is about the leave the launch pad. When the final constitutional coupling comes loose on March 10th, everyone in Austin will need to hold on tight as this rocket ship takes off toward Sine Die.

House Committees were assigned in mid-February and spent the last two weeks getting organized as we prepare to start holding public hearings on legislation. The Texas Constitution prohibits the legislature from bringing any policies to the House Floor except for the items listed by Governor Abbott as Emergency Items. More on those in a bit.

As a member of the House Appropriations Committee, I have already begun work pouring over the next budget. My focus on the Article II subcommittee is on how the state will spend nearly 34% of the budget on health care issues. That is only slightly less than the nearly 40% of the budget that will go toward public education and higher education in Texas for the next two years.

Article II will take on several important funding priorities this session, including the landmark Mental Health reform funding for more hospitals and more beds. The Health and Human Services Commission has about 20,000 employees working at state hospitals and state-supported living centers like the one in Denton. The ongoing discussion over Medicaid expansion is an important part of making sure that Texans who are truly in need have access to care.

The budget contains a lot of clues about legislation that will be proposed for programs, such as expanding the Healthy Texas Women, Alternatives to Abortion, and Nurse-Family Program, which helps new mothers learn the skills to raise healthy children. Larger priorities, such as property tax relief -- slated to be almost \$18 billion total between proposals to buy



down local school taxes and the Lt. Gov.'s priority to increase homestead exemptions from \$40,000 to \$70,000.

As we approach the March 10 deadline to file bills -- also the 60-day deadline to hear bills -- we will likely see some of the larger items start to move. Those include Governor Greg Abbott's seven emergency items:

- Strengthening Border Security
- Property Tax Relief
- · School Choice
- · School Safety
- · Addressing the Fentanyl Crisis
- Ending COVID-19 mandates
- Ending revolving door bail policies

These and other essential issues will begin to be open to public debate as committees have bills referred to them and hearing notices are posted. To follow House Committees, go to house.texas.gov/committees. There, you will find links to each committee, public postings on which bills will be heard, and links to watch the committee hearings and House Floor proceed-

It was impractical, so he sold it to Dan Davis as the buggy didn't hold up to the roads, and Dr. Rice went back to riding his horse. The following year he purchased his first automobile. This motor buggy had no top over the back seat, the seat had no springs in it, and it folded up when not in use. Ruby described how many people in Sanger had memories of getting a ride in this unique motor buggy.

Davis and Emmett Kirkland were the first to make radios in Sanger. Emmett finished first because Dan had to rewind the coil on his device. Bessie Kirkland (sister of Emmett) helped Dan wind the coil by hand. D.H. Minick was the next man in Sanger to make his radio.

Dan Davis was a unique man, and Sanger was fortunate to have this fine citizen who helped the community advance in its growing years.

of New Mexico State University.

"As a search and interview committee consisting of educators who collectively have years in public education, we created a characteristic profile to assist in narrowing down the applicants," Dr. Hunter said. "We, like our community, felt characteristics such as integrity, humility, leadership, discipline, and aca-

demic excellence within the athletic program were just as important as their head coaching records. Throughout the process, Coach Rogers kept rising to the top of the list."

Rocky Smart had been the program's head coach since his February 2019 hiring, and Galbreath became solely the athletic director in 2016 after serving in both posts concurrently dating back to 2007. Smart is the head football coach at Valley

Rogers' hiring also

marks a departure from Sanger's previous one-athletic director model under Galbreath, who retired in January. The school will now split the duties between two positions with Rogers in the boys athletic director role, while girls athletic coordinator Tracy Sykes will serve as girls athletic director.

Although Rogers was approved unanimously by the school board in a 7-0 vote, not everyone at the board meeting agreed with the hire.

Sandra Miller, Jessica Albritton and Callie Baird McPherson each voiced a variety of concerns during the public comment portion of the meeting. Much of the topic centered on Sanger not hiring Marcus Schulz — the current athletic director and head football coach at Humble High who has strong ties to the Sanger community.

Schulz, who spent seven seasons leading Splendora before taking over at Humble in 2021, has tallied a 36-56 record over the last nine years combined.

Two other members of the community spoke up in favor of Rogers during the public comment period — Sanger athletic trainer Martin Caddell and David York, president of Sanger's youth sports

Board member Lisa Cody acknowledged the community's split opinions during the questioning period of the meeting before Rogers' approval.

"I am torn by this decision, torn by what's happened here," Cody said. "This is a huge decision. Outside the superintendent, this is probably the most important decision in a district.

'We have to come together as a community, we have to think of our kids. This [search] committee was a good committee. I had questions on this committee, I doubted some of the people on this committee — I do not doubt them anymore."

Hunter acknowledged the weight Rogers' hire holds in the community and is confident he can shape the program for the future.

"This is a position that impacts more than just athletics. It impacts our entire community," Hunter said. "Everybody I spoke with personally about coach Rogers, whether it was about his professional or personal life, it was nothing but glowing remarks. The more references I checked, the more excited I became about getting him here."

Rogers is ready to hit the ground running and begin preparing his program for the upcoming

"The main thing is getting to know the kids, getting to spend time with the kids to sort of figure this out," Rogers said. "I have to learn fast. I feel like I'm behind already, but I've done it before. I haven't done it a lot, haven't taken over a lot of schools in 30 years, but I have a plan. I have a system that I try to follow with what I need to get done by a certain time. A majority of that we've already got checked off."


Rogers started his duties with the district on March 1.

Rogers and his family sat in the packed board room for over an hour while he listened to comments from the public. He wasn't fazed by it at all or took it personal. He said after the meeting, he appreciated the passion in the people and he's ready to start winning them over. "The funny thing is when I was hired at Snyder, there was some opposition. They were saying I was too young and inexperienced. I told my wife we have come full circle. Now, I am too experienced." Rogers says he has plenty of passion and energy to take Sanger to the next level, on the field, in the classroom and
