# New SHS head football coach Rocky Smart is ready for the season

After zero wins last year, Sanger High School football program underwent changes in the coaching staff this offseason. Rocky Smart was hired in the Spring and he's added nine new coaches to the staff.

Smart grew up watch-

Smart is no stranger to winning. He boasts an 89-41 record with 11 playoff wins. Since 2004, Sanger is 3-8 in playoff games. Smart is excited for the future of the program moving forward. "It's a great opportunity to totally put a mark on a place," Smart said. "Just looking at the kids we have, we can turn a corner this year and set the foundation for years to come." Smart said they had 75 kids out for 9th-12th grades at the first day of practice on Monday. "The first day went great. We are learning a lot as fast as we can," he said. The Indians, along with the rest of the state practice in shorts and helmets, per UIL rules. "August 7-8, we are allowed to wear shoulder pads, and Friday the 9th we are allowed to do full pads." This weeks schedule from Monday through Thursday, the Indians meet from 4:00-4:30 PM, practice 4:30-730PM, and then weights. On Friday due to teacher in-service and other things, the Indians will practice 6:30-8:30AM. On Saturday at 7:30AM they will take team pictures, etc. "Afterwards, we will scrimmage ourselves a little as soon as we can start at 8:30 or 9:00AM. It will last an hour approximately," said Smart.

On Monday, it will be the 4:00-7:30PM format, again and on Tuesday, they will go to the school routine although they don't start school until Wednesday. "We will practice and lift from 4:00-6:45PM. Once school starts our practices will be around 2 hours and ten minutes on Monday and Tuesdays. Wednesdays we will practice for 1 hour and 36 minutes." ### Sanger ISD starts school next week... **New CTE principal** adopted two children from Haiti and they will be attending SHS

Four years in the making, Brad and Cari Cockrell finalized the adoption in the Spring of this year, with their two newest children, Thaina and Phawensky, after adopting them from Haiti. They will be students at Sanger High School with the first day starting next week.

The senior pastor at Southmont, Cockrell went on a mission trip to Haiti in 2014 with two of his three sons. There, he met Thaina, who was 12 at the time, and Phawensky, who was 9. Cockrell had been on mission trips to Haiti before and, when coming back, always told his wife, Cari, that they should adopt some Haitian children, in what he calls "a nice thought." 'We never, I don't think, seriously considered it," Brad said. "And it was not until I met them that I just felt a real conviction that God was saying, 'Yes. You need to do this, and these are the two that you need to adopt." Once they started the adoption process, one of the learning curves they faced was gathering the paperwork, which took "probably 10 or 11 months," Cari Cockrell said.

ing Ed 'Too Tall' Jones and Randy White dominate the NFL. Smart hopes to bring the Manster-style toughness to the Sanger football program.

"Our kids will be extremely physically and mentally tough," Smart said. "We've worked really hard this spring. We want to develop leaders and guys who play with class and character, but hopefully be fierce and violent competitors."

Smart has coached football for 20 years at almost every position on the field. His last job was as offensive coordinator at North Forney High where his Falcons averaged 27 points per game, more points than Sanger scored in a single game last year.

Smart coaches an high-octane throwing game, a style he fell in love with while playing offensive line at Hardin-Simmons University. Growing up in Forney, Texas, the closest thing they had to a pass was a toss to the tailback.

"We are going to score a lot of points in Sanger, Texas," Smart said. "Even if you have an inferior team, if you can throw the forward pass you always

have a chance."

Smart has been impressed with the work ethic the Sanger players have shown him, and while he is excited for his wide receivers to have great years, Smart claims the strength of the team will be up front.

"Football still comes down to blocking and tackling," Smart said. "We are going to play fast and throw it short as many times as possible to guys who can score and in the same breath we are going to have a physical running game."

Smart understands how important football is in Sanger, and recognized the importance of his job to the community.

"I think football is something that brings people together," Smart said.



joyed reading and playing video games. His favorite past time was driving and clearing his mind all while emptying his gas tank.



Nathan was preceded in death by his grandpa, Dale Shepherd and grandmother, Roberta Miller.





### Videoboard sponsorship and fund drive benefits Career & Technical Education program

If you have driven by the high school athletic facilities recently, you may have noticed new additions to the football, baseball, and softball fields. Each field received a new scoreboard made possible by the generous contribution of \$250,000 by DATCU. The contribution was part of a 10-year partnership with the Sanger ISD and Sanger Education Foundation (SEF) intended to benefit the Career & Technical Education (CTE) program.

If you are wondering how athletic scoreboards benefit the CTE program, the answer is simple. The football scoreboard is much more than a scoreboard. It is a state of art videoboard with capabilities such as live game feeds, high resolution game time graphics, and of course the ability to promote local businesses. Local businesses can purchase sponsorships. Some of the sponsorships allow for videos, which are produced by the students of the CTE program. The revenue generated goes back to the CTE program in the form of scholarships and/or to purchase additional equipment instructional grants.

Sixty students have elected to participate with this project in the Fall-far exceeding expectations. In order to meet the needs of so many students, additional funding is required-specifically to purchase additional cameras. The SEF is leading the funding effort in two ways: 1) marketing providing sponsorship packages to local businesses and 2) organizing a \$10,000 fund drive to purchase cameras and accessories.

Now that summer is winding down, it will soon be "back-to-school" time. When children are young, your logistics for the new academic year may involve little more than a trip to buy school supplies. evaluate your financial need and determine how much financial support your child requires. And since a lot of financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, it's a good idea to submit your forms as soon as possible once the application period opens.

Scholarships – Colleges and universities offer their own scholarships, but you're not limited to them. In fact, you might be surprised at the number and variety of college scholarships available to your child or grandchild – but to find them, you may need to do some digging. Find out what's offered from foundations, religious, ethnic or community organizations, local businesses and civic groups. Also, ask the high school guidance office for information. Your own employer might even offer small scholarships. You can find more information on scholarships on the U.S. Department of Education's website.

College-specific investments – You might also want to consider an investment designed to help you save for college. You have several options available, each with different contribution limits, rules and tax treatments, so you'll want to consult with a financial

professional to choose an investment that's appropriate for your situation.

Community colleges - Not every bachelor's degree needs to begin and end at an expensive four-year college or university. Many students now fulfill some of their "general" education requirements at affordable community colleges before transferring to a four-year school - often saving tens of thousands of dollars in the process.

Paying for college is challenging. After all, for the 2018-19 academic year, the average annual cost (tuition, fees, and room and board) was \$21,370 for instate students at public fouryear colleges or universities; for four-year private schools, the corresponding expense was \$48,510, according to the College Board. And college costs will likely continue to rise over the next several years. But, as we've seen, by being proactive and having a plan in place, you can go a long way toward coping with these expenses and helping your loved ones enjoy the benefits of higher education.

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



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tioned if the reality was ever going to come about."

And the reality did come about. The Cockrells finalized the adoption last October and on what they call their "Gotcha Day," Thaina and Phawensky, now 17 and 14, came home with them on March 6.

When asked what the "Gotcha Day" was like, Phawensky said it was cold, and Thaina said it was amazing, while Brad Cockrell described it as "incredibly exciting."

"It was just four years of all of this coming together finally, and so it was a big exciting day," Cockrell said.

Only Brad Cockrell went to Haiti to get the kids, so a lot of their family and friends met them at the airport when they arrived in Texas.

"I was surprised," Phawensky said. "I didn't think there would be so [many] people."

Now, living in the United States, Brad Cockrell said food is one of the biggest transitions for Thaina and Phawensky.

"So, food here tastes a lot different than Haiti and is just made a lot different than Haiti, so they've tried to make adjustments on what they will eat," he said. "But we have discovered Chipotle, and that is now their new favorite. That's the closest thing to Haiti we have found to this point, so they are very much Chipotle fans."
