

Eyewitness recounts shooting

At 11:45 a.m. on Thursday, February 5, a shooting took place at the Valero Pit Stop in Bolivar. Bryce Peters, a recent Sanger High School graduate, was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. The victim, who was shot, is currently in the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. Peters remains in Denton County Jail and was denied bail by a judge this week.

A witness, who works at the Pit Stop, provided an account of the incident to the Sanger News. She observed Peters approaching the outside entrance of the convenience store when a middle-aged man, seated (inside) at a table near

the front windows, got up, walked to the entrance doors, then punched Peters in the face hard enough that Peters' head struck the window really hard. Once Peters regained his bearings, he fired five shots at the man from outside the store, striking the victim three times. All five shots were fired from outside the store at the victim, which was inside Pit Stop. The three bullets that struck the victim passed through him, hitting parts of the store. The victim managed to crawl back to the kitchen area, where employees assisted him.

The witness, who was behind the counter with two other employees, took cover on the floor until authorities arrived, sur-

store owners were in the back office at the time, and around six customers were present. The employees activated the silent alarm, and the witness estimated that the police arrived quickly on the scene within 6 to 7 minutes. Peters remained outside until authorities arrived, sur-

rendering willingly with his hands raised. Peters claimed self defense to authorities. But, one of the main reasons a judge has denied bail, because he continued to shoot inside the store, while innocent customers and employees were in the area. Fortunately, no one else was injured in the chaos. Clearly, Peter's wasn't trying to shoot them, but the stray bullets could have injured or killed innocent bystanders.

Following the incident, the witness expressed that everyone was shaken up, and she now feels more cautious about who enters the store. This local favorite establish-

Sanger ISD Board calls Bond Election to address growth

During Monday night's meeting, the Sanger ISD Board of Trustees unanimously voted to call a bond election to address the district's enrollment growth, which is expected to more than double by the 2035 school year, reaching more than 6,400 students. The Board's approval of the 2026 bond package is based on recommendations from the 37-member Long Range Facilities Planning Committee.

The committee reviewed demographics, growth and enrollment patterns, tax impact scenarios, district finances, educational programs, and the district's current and long-term needs to ultimately develop a recommendation to present to the Board of Trustees. This proposal is based on their recommendation. If approved by voters, the bond will impact campuses across the district. The projects include new construction and additions to prevent overcrowding and reliance on portable buildings, safety and security, technology updates, and additional buses to meet Sanger ISD's growing student population.

"This bond proposal is a direct response to the growth in our community," said Sanger ISD Superintendent Dr. Tommy Hunter. "We must plan now to ensure all our current and future students continue to have access to safe schools and quality learning spaces". The Sanger ISD bond proposal will appear on the ballot for voters' approval this May. Election Day is Saturday, May 2nd, and early voting begins on Monday, April 20th. More details of the bond will be announced by SISD in the coming weeks.


Chick is very passionate about this campaign. He got involved in politics after Charlie Kirk was assassinated. aire investors compete with families for homes, prices rise and first-time buyers get squeezed out. It also increases your property taxes. Our generation's youth, without a stake in our country, won't invest in its future. We need to focus on giving our nation's youth a shot at participating in the American Dream.

Ban Omnibus Bills - Processes that serve to confuse and discourage accountability in our representatives must end.

Omnibus bills, large packages that bundle thousands of spending items into a single measure, undermine accountability. By allowing unrelated provisions to ride along, they enable measures that would not pass on their own. Their complexity obscures the trade-offs for voters and gives representatives cover to support provisions they would otherwise oppose.

Texas Leads the Way - Washington doesn't run Texas, Texans do.

Texans have always been independent and paved our own way. Local control and fiscal responsibility are core Texas values. I'll press Washington for flexibility, block one-size-fits-all mandates, and invest where Texans see results: right here at home.

Division in America

City and School Board Election Update:

As of Wednesday, February 11th morning, the seats for city council Place 2 and Place 4 remain empty for the May 2, 2026 local election. City Councilman Gary Bilyeu has filed to run for Mayor. Three election packets have been picked up for the city council places. They have until Friday, February 13 to file.

Open places on the council are Place 2 - Gary Bilyeu (This place will be vacated since he is running for Mayor) and Place 4 - Allen Chick. Bilyeu has been on the council since 2010 and Chick's first term started in 2014.

Mayor Thomas Muir announced in ear-

ly January he will not seek another term. He's been Mayor since May of 2010.

Sanger ISD has three places up on the ballot. They are held by: Place 7 - Bruce Elsey, Place 6 - Mitch Hammonds and Place 1 - Jarrod Roberts.

As of February 13th, Roberts and Drew Hall, have turned in their packets for Place 1 and Hammonds has filed for Place 6. Elsey filed for re-election in Place 7 earlier this week.

The last day to file is Friday, February 13 at the close of business. Applications are available at City Hall and Sanger ISD Administration buildings.

New McDonald's planned near SHS

A new project titled "MCD Indian Lane" has been registered with the state, signaling a brand-new McDonald's is coming to the intersection of East Chapman Drive (FM 455) and Indian Lane.

The \$1.5 million project involves the ground-up construction of a 4,061-square-foot restaurant on the Southwest Corner of the intersection. This places the new fast food spot directly across the street from Sanger High School, and Sanger Middle School, making it a prime destination for students, staff, and families attending games at the nearby athletic complex. This location is distinct from the existing McDonald's on the I-35

frontage road (Stemmons St), suggesting a strategic move to serve the residential growth and school traffic on the eastern side of town.

Construction is scheduled to begin this summer on July 1, 2026, with a target completion date of December 31, 2026.

Alex Dee led all scorers with 15 points, attacking the basket and getting to the free-throw line.


Baylor Beard chipped in 11 points, including multiple baskets that kept Sanger in control during key stretches.
